FRANCE AND CHINA.

The statesmen who have been at the head of affairs in France during the past few years have manifested an unwonted eagerness and passion for foreign possessions.

But in all transactions between Annam and France no mention was ever made of China, which was completely ignored. In fact, in one of the treaties drawn up to govern the relations of the Annamese and French Governments, a clause was inserted by which China's suzerainty was unmistakably set aside.

No time was lost in summoning the Council of Mandarins together to consider what action should be taken to protect the Celestial interests. The Mandarins have come to the conclusion that China can only recognize the treaties between Annam and France, provided France intervenes in Tonquin affairs solely at the request of the Annamese sovereign.
