The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Paul Martin, announced today the following appointments: Mr. Bertram C. Butler as High Commissioner for Canada to Malaysia, with concurrent accreditation as Canadian Ambassador to Thailand. Mr. Butler, who is at present Minister (Commercial at Canada House, London, succeeds Mr. C. E. McGaughey. Mr. Butler will shortly be taking up his duties in Kuala Lumpur.

Mr. Charles E. McGaughey as High Commissioner for Canada to Ghana, with concurrent accreditations as Canadian Ambassador to Guinea, Ivory Coast and Togo. Mr. McGaughey, at precent High Commissioner to Malaysia, succeeds Mr. D. M. Cornett, who is returning for an assignment in the Department in Ottawa. Mr. McGaughey will shortly be taking up his duties in Accra.
