OF THE
BRITISH COLUMBIA CONFERENCE
OF
THE METHODIST CHURCH

HELD IN THE CITY OF NEW WESTMINSTER, B.C., MAY 9TH TO 15TH, 1888.

The Conference began its SECOND SESSION on Wednesday, May 9th, 1888, at 9 o'clock a.m., Rev. ERENEZER ROBSON, President of the Conference, in the chair.

After singing the 117th hymn the Secretary, Rev. JOSEPH HALL, read the 35th chapter of Isaiah, and the Rev. DENNIS JENNINGS and WILLIAM MCKAY, Esq., led the Conference in prayer.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

Believing, as we do, that the law of the Christian Sabbath is of universal and perpetual obligation, the proper observance of which secures physical, mental and moral good to society; and recognizing the widespread desecration of the day throughout this Province, in such ways as the running of passenger and freight trains, excursions by trains, steamboats and stages, the opening of saloons, cigar and fruit stands, and confectionery stores, base ball playing, gunning and fishing, and the publication of newspapers; and deploring the fact that our legislators have hitherto failed to place on our statute books any effective legislation by which such open and continuous profanation of the Sabbath may be prevented, we hereby submit for the adoption of the Conference the following resolutions :—

1. That a petition setting forth our views as a Church, in common with other Churches, in reference to the nature and observance of the day, and praying for direct legislation on the matter, be sent from Conference to the Local Legislature.

2. That a Committee be appointed for the drafting of a petition to be circulated among our people, in order that they, too, may join with us in the endeavor to secure, if possible, such legislation.

3. That a Sabbath be set apart by this Conference, on which all our Ministers shall preach sermons with special reference to the subject.

4. That the President of our Conference be requested to issue a pastoral letter directed to the pastors and congregations of our Church, scattered throughout the bounds of our Conference, in which the doctrinal views we hold in reference to the day shall be clearly and definitely set forth, and a special appeal made to all our people to unite their prayers and efforts to overthrow and destroy this great evil of Sabbath desecration.

5. That special attention be given to the educating of our children on this important subject.

6. That, where it is at all possible, sound, religious literature bearing on the matter be circulated, in order to counteract, as far as we are able, the floods of pernicious literary matter which are flowing in upon us from abroad, and to which we believe a large amount of scepticism that prevails in reference to the day is attributable.

7. That the accompanying resolution, signed by the President and Secretary of the Conference, be at once forwarded to the C. P. R. authorities, in reference to the projected movement to replace a Sunday local train between Vancouver and New Westminster:—

Whereas, some six months ago, at the request of the religious public of the city of Vancouver, the C. P. R. authorities very kindly cancelled the Sunday local trains running between New Westminster and Vancouver, and discontinued handling freight in connection with their trans-Pacific line of steamships; and, whereas, this Conference learns with very great regret that pressure is being brought to bear in order to secure the replacing of these trains; and, whereas, between these two points ordinary train connections still exist whereby those who feel obliged to travel on the Lord's Day have the opportunity of doing so; therefore,

Resolved,—That this Conference places on record its unqualified disapproval of such a retrograde movement, and earnestly hopes that the wise judgment which guided the C. P. R. authorities in their former action may lead them to reject any such proposals.

1. We find that, in every department of our Church work, there has been a marked increase, for which we desire to express our gratitude to the Great Head of the Church.

2. At the close of our first year as a Conference, we desire to place on record the fact that the expectations expressed last year by the Committee on the State of the Work have been realized, and that impetus has been given to Methodism throughout the entire Province. We recommend no new methods, but rather a diligent and faithful working of our old methods, believing that, in the doctrines and usages of the Methodist Church, sanctified by the Spirit of God, we have all the agencies required for the accomplishment of the great work committed to our charge.

3. With reference to the spiritual interests of our work, we believe there has never been a time in the history of our Church in this Province when there prevailed a greater spirit of zeal and harmony in the Church, or when there was manifested a more widespread and earnest inquiry among the people regarding practical religion.

4. We are also glad to notice an increase of earnestness on the part of our people in the work of the Sabbath-school, and that the past year has been characterized by a large number of conversions among the children.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON MISSIONS.

I. DOMESTIC MISSIONS.

While deeply grateful to God for the measure of success that has attended our Domestic Mission Work in the Province in the past, your Committee cannot but recommend that, if possible, greater caution be exercised in opening and establishing new Missions, where there is not a sufficient number of adherents of our Church, or of a mixed population, to warrant the expectation that such fields will, in reasonable time, become independent Circuits.

II. INDIAN MISSIONS.

1. *The Crosby Girls' Home.*—We rejoice to learn that, under the care of Miss Knight as matron, assisted by Miss Hart, recently of Halifax, N.S., the success of the institution has been satisfactory, as the number of inmates has increased. Best of all, several have been converted to God during the year.

2. *The Coquileetza Home and School.*—It affords your Committee great pleasure to record our appreciation of the work of the Woman's Missionary Society in establishing this Home and School at Chilliwack, as recommended by the Conference last year.

This institution, under the efficient management of Rev. C. M. Tate and wife, has become a centre of religious and civilizing influence, and we do not doubt that it will be helpful to our work among the Indians on the Fraser and southern coast of British Columbia.

Your Committee recommend the Conference to bring before the Woman's Missionary Society and the friends of Methodist Missions, for their consideration and practical sympathy, the fact that suitable buildings are greatly needed, in order to provide for the steadily increasing number of applicants for admission to this Home and School.

3. *The Methodist Training and Industrial Institute.*—As the Conference has decided to establish this institution at Port Simpson, and also subscribed liberally towards its equipment, it only remains for us to say that in this a long felt and pressing want will be met; and to recommend:—

1. That the Naas River Orphanage for Boys be merged in this institution, which shall hereafter be known as "The Methodist Training and Industrial Institute."

2. That the Revs. Thos. Crosby, A. E. Green, and D. Jennings, be appointed as the Board of Management.

3. That this Conference pledges itself to do all in its power towards raising funds for carrying on this work, and recommend it to the confidence and support of our people throughout the Dominion.

4. CAPE MUDGE.—We recommend that an official letter be sent by the Secretary of this Conference to the Agents of the Church Missionary Society at Albert Bay, informing them that the Methodist Church has at present no intention of establishing a Mission at present at Cape Mudge.

III. CHINESE MISSIONS.

We gratefully record our conviction that our work among the Chinese is no longer an experiment. The Victoria Mission, by improving the moral tone, suppressing the vice and rescuing the slaves of China town, has been a decided success.

The Rescue Home, under the experienced and efficient control of Miss Leak, is proving a great blessing to the inmates, and is in a state that seems to assure permanency of existence and usefulness.

The Mission School at New Westminster is established, and is successful; a very hopeful feature is the large proportion of pupils in connection with the school who attend the Sunday-school and Class-meeting.

Your Committee recommend:—

1. That a Missionary be appointed to superintend the Chinese work in this Province.
 2. That in all our schools a small fee be charged to meet expenses.
 3. That Mission Schools be established in Vancouver and Nanaimo.

REPORT OF THE SABBATH-SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee beg leave to report as follows :—

While we believe that too great importance cannot be attached to Sabbath-school work, we admire the efficient regulations provided in our Book of Discipline for the prosecution of such work, and most earnestly recommend the members of our Church, both clerical and lay, to pay special attention thereto.

Upon examining the schedules, we are gratified to note some encouraging features in connection with the past year's work :—

1. The large proportion of officers and teachers reported as members of our Church.

2. The number of conversions which have taken place among the scholars.

3. The increase in the numbers of those who have signed the total abstinence pledge.

On the other hand, we feel it our duty to note a few facts which are of a discouraging nature.

In the first place, but a small number of schools exists in proportion to the number of our preaching appointments, a fact which leads us to urge upon all our ministers and preachers the advisability of doing all in their power to organize schools wherever it is at all practicable.

Furthermore, we regret the apparently small amount of interest taken by our schools in the Catechism, and here your Committee would observe that while we believe Methodist theology is the grandest in the world, no better compendium of which exists than that found in our Catechisms ; and while in these days creeds and beliefs are denounced by many so-called reformers, and while hundreds we fear of even our Methodist young people are not able to give a proper definition of any of the holy doctrines of our Church, we feel it is high time to emphasize in the strongest manner possible the importance of this great matter.

Your Committee have learned that there are to be found many places where schools might be instituted if teachers could be secured, and would, therefore, recommend that a few persons should be selected to go to these places in bands of four or five, and seek out the neglected children who are growing up without any religious knowledge.

In conclusion, we, as a Committee, would most respectfully recommend to all interested in Sunday-schools the importance of temperance instruction in all our schools, also the duty of doing all we can in order to enlist the sympathy of our children in our Missionary work, as well as extending the patronage we feel is due by us to the excellent Book Room and Publishing House of our Church in Toronto.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

Your Committee, in reviewing the condition of temperance reform in this Province, rejoice that there has been decided improvement in temperance sentiment, and that the various temperance bodies have increased greatly in numbers and influence during the year. They are also gratified to find that not only has the sentiment upon this subject widened, but in many instances it has deepened and strengthened, displaying increasing solidity and power.

But an impartial investigation of the case cannot fail to disclose many aspects of an unsatisfactory nature. Foremost among them stands the law regulating the liquor traffic, which in many of its salient points contravenes the sacred and inviolable rights of communities under our free institutions, and in some cases trampling upon them, which, considered as a whole, is a formidable barrier to reform; and which, as an educational force, is calculated to exercise upon the rising generation and the community generally a baleful and depraving influence.

Among other condemnable features of the present law that might be mentioned, your Committee beg to call your attention to the following:—

1. The arbitrary and unwarrantable granting or renewal of a license upon payment of the legal fee, in the face of a community expressly opposed to the evil traffic.

2. The granting of licenses adjacent to Indian reserves, or in places where the principal trade is derived from Indians.

3. The technicalities of the present law which, in almost every case, have been turned by the judiciary to the account of liquor-sellers, and decided in favor of the most mischievous and crime-producing agency in society.

4. The widespread profanation of the Lord's Day by an almost unrestricted sale of intoxicating liquors.

Remembering with indignation the contemptuous manner in which petitions, for the past four years, for the further restriction of the liquor traffic, embodying the expressed wishes of a very large representation of the people of this Province, have been treated by members of the Legislature, your Committee would recommend, for the removal of the many evils resulting from the liquor traffic, in addition to those enumerated above:—

1. That every assistance possible be given towards the holding of conventions and electoral unions for the ventilation of temperance views, the choice of temperance candidates and the arrangement for temperance campaigns.

2. That our Conference and Church accords its hearty support as heretofore to all organizations and institutions that have for their object the strengthening of temperance sentiment, the widening of temperance influence throughout our land, the reclamation of victims of intemperance, and the restriction or suppression by legislation of the traffic in intoxicating drinks.

3. That we, as a Conference, lend no countenance to the specious and iniquitous principle of high license, but discourage a dependence upon it as an antidote for the liquor evil, since, in the light of evidence and experience, it in no way removes the evils of the drink traffic.

4. That we recognize no principle of legislation that does not facilitate prohibition.

5. That a Committee be appointed by this Conference to interview and urge upon the Provincial Government that the text-books lately issued by the Educational Department of Ontario be used in all the Public Schools of this Province.

6. That we advocate the extension of the electoral franchise to women.

7. That our Sunday-schools observe one Sunday in each quarter in which temperance lessons shall be taught.

8. That the Sunday next preceding Christmas in each year be set apart for sermons bearing on the question in lines suggested above, and presenting emphatically to our people the urgency of prohibition.

SUPERANNUATION FUND.

Treasurer's Report for the year ending July 31st, 1887.

In presenting this Report for the consideration of the Board, the Treasurer has pleasure in stating:—

1. That there has been an increase in the Permanent Fund amounting to \$4,244.23.

2. The estimates for the year, which were made with great care, were sufficient to meet the expenditure, and the debt has been considerably reduced. It was the desire of the Treasurer to make these estimates as close as possible, in order to keep the assessments to Circuits down to the lowest possible amounts.

3. The annual income from all sources has fully met the expectations of the Treasurer. Notwithstanding the low rates of interest, there has been an increase realized from this source of \$1,679.29. A part of this increase, however, should have been paid in and accounted for in last

year's Report. The Book Room has paid \$6,000 to the Fund, an increase of \$2,000. The several Annual Conferences have paid the amounts in full apportioned to them, with very trifling exceptions, which are very easily explained.

4. The claimants have been paid in full, and the debt, with which we commenced the year, has been reduced \$1,667.25, leaving only a balance of \$1,044.95.

5. On the whole, the working of the new law has been an encouraging success during this, the first year of its existence, and augurs well for the future. I do not claim for it absolute perfection, but it cannot be changed till the next General Conference. As we cannot "*mend*" it till then, let us, as ministers and laymen, "*keep it,*" and, with the improvements that may be made at the next General Conference, it will be a lasting blessing to the Church in all times to come.

SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS.

1. On the policy of the Dominion and Provincial Governments toward the Indians and Missionaries of the north-west coast:—

Moved by Rev. J. E. Starr, seconded by Rev. Dennis Jennings,

That whereas a Commission was lately appointed by the Dominion and Provincial Governments to make inquiry into the state and condition of the Indians of the north-west coast of British Columbia;

And whereas the report of the said Commission just published, together with other sessional papers and Blue Books, contain unjust reflections and insinuations regarding the Missionaries of the Methodist Church in charge of the Missions among the Indians of the north-west coast of British Columbia;

And whereas the question has become one of national importance; therefore—

Resolved,—1. That this Conference strongly disapproves of the policy pursued by the Governments mentioned toward the Indians of the north-west coast of British Columbia.

2. That it condemns the partiality of government officials in seeking to prefer one Church to another, and the attempt made by them to cast all the odium of their iniquitous policy upon the Missionaries of the Methodist Church.

3. That this Conference, for the purpose of bringing the matter under the serious consideration of the whole Methodist Church, appoint a Committee consisting of the President and Secretary of the Conference, Rev. J. E. Starr, Bros. Alexander Peers, Thomas Cunningham and Dr. Kent, to prepare a memorial regarding the matter, and forward the same to the Secretaries of the different Conferences in Canada.

4. And that the Conference recommends to the General Board of Missions the advisability of immediately sending a Commission to Port Simpson, Naas and the Skeena rivers, to thoroughly investigate and lay the matter before the proper government authorities and the public, so that our missionaries may be exonerated and the aspersions cast upon our Church removed. Carried, *nem. dis.*

REPRESENTATIVE TO THE GENERAL BOARD OF MISSIONS.

Moved by Bro. J. W. Wadman, M.A., seconded by Bro R. B. Hemlaw :—

Inasmuch as there appears to exist obscurity in the Discipline regarding the right of this Conference to send a representative to the General Board of Missions ; and, whereas, during the sessions of this Conference there have arisen questions of vital interest to this Conference and to the whole Methodist Church ;

Resolved,—That this Conference proceed to the election of a representative to the General Board of Missions, the right of such representative to be present at the next meeting of the General Missionary Board to be determined by the ruling of the General Superintendents. Carried.

RE YATES' ACCOUNT.

Resolved,—That the President and Secretary of the Conference be authorized to settle the Yates' account out of the Contingent Fund ; if necessary, borrowing the amount needed, and making it a charge upon the Contingent Fund. Carried.

SERMONS ON SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

In accordance with the recommendation of the Committee on Sabbath Observance, the President named the first Sabbath in July as the day on which sermons on the duty of Sabbath Observance shall be preached in all our churches.

SYMPATHY WITH REV. W. POLLARD.

Resolved,—That whereas our beloved brother, Rev. W. Pollard, of Victoria, is unable, through bodily affliction, to be present with us during the sessions of this Conference, we immediately convey to him our heartfelt sympathy with him in his affliction, placing on record the high esteem in which he is held by us as a Conference, and praying the Great Head of the Church to abundantly sustain and bless him, pouring upon him in his declining years the fulness of the blessing of the Gospel of Peace, enabling him to live daily a life resigned to the unerring will of God

ORDINATION OF REV. W. W. BAER.

The recommendation of the Stationing Committee that Conference authorize Bro. Baer's ordination for special purposes, in case he be sent to a distant field, was read and adopted.

NEXT CONFERENCE SERVICES.

Resolved,—That Revs. J. Hall, J. E. Starr and W. J. Dowler, B.A., be a Committee to arrange a programme for next Annual Conference services.

J. H. White; and beg to offer them our sincere thanks and obligations, assuring them that we shall carry away with us very pleasant memories of our sojourn in the royal city.

THE ANNUAL ADDRESS OF THE
BRITISH COLUMBIA CONFERENCE OF THE METHODIST CHURCH
TO THE SOCIETIES WITHIN ITS BOUNDS.

BELOVED BRETHREN,—Once more in our Annual Conference we have been reviewing the labors and summoning up the results of another year's service in the vineyard of our Lord.

It is an occasion for gratitude that while death has entered the ranks of the Ministry in other Conferences, by the mercy of God not one has during the year fallen from the ranks of the British Columbia Conference.

We also rejoice that Almighty God has so crowned the ministrations of His servants during the year, that we are able to report a net increase of over 500 to the membership of the Church.

While it is our privilege to report a gratifying increase in the finances of the Church throughout the Conference, yet we are compelled to chronicle the fact that many of our honored brethren on domestic fields do not receive anything like an adequate support.

Our Sustentation Fund, which has been on trial for the past year and from which we had hoped to obtain relief, in this respect has not fully met our expectations, so that the brethren upon dependent fields are still short of sufficient means to save them from discomfort both to themselves and to their families; and we would, therefore, respectfully urge upon you the necessity of giving the above Fund your liberal support.

We are glad to learn that the Sabbath-schools throughout the Conference are doing so well, and would earnestly remind you that the training of our young people in the Sabbath-school is one of the most important departments of our Church work. No better literature can be procured for our people and Sunday-schools than at our own Book Room in the city of Toronto. And we would urge upon you the necessity of reading such publications as the *Christian Guardian*, *Methodist Magazine* and our Sabbath-school papers, in order that you may have an intelligent acquaintance with Church life and work, and that loyalty to the Church may be conserved.

Our Indian work has received earnest consideration and we would heartily commend its interests to your prayerful sympathy and liberality. We would also urge upon you, as representatives of a living Christianity in this land, to be alive to the interests of the great temperance movement. "Eternal vigilance is the price of liberty!" Give your help to everything that has a tendency to lessen the traffic in intoxicating drink, and by all just means in your power endeavor to drive the curse from our land.

And now in conclusion, brethren, suffer us to remind you of the importance of the means of grace for the maintenance and development of the Divine life in the soul. Ours is a rich heritage of social means. Be loyal to them. Be loyal to God-ordered duties.

May the Great Head of the Church crown you with His benediction.
