THIRD SESSION 1897.

FIRST DAY.

COUNTY COUNCIL CHAMBERS,
NAPANEE, December, 7th, 1897.

Council met at 2 p.m. pursuant to adjournment.

Warden in the chair.

Members all present.

The Warden in his opening remarks presented the Council with an Oil Painting of Her Majesty the Queen.

A petition of the License Law Amendments was received and read, and on motion was laid on the table until to-morrow morning.

A petition from the County Clerk of Northumberland, in reference to Police Magistrate jurisdiction, was read and on motion was referred to the Education and Printing committee to report.

A communication from W. F. Hall, secretary of the Napanee School Board, applying for the usual amount of \$3000, was read and on motion referred to the Finance committee to report.

A communication from C. W. Glenn, secretary of the Newburgh School Board, applying for the usual amount of \$1650, was read and on motion was referred to the Finance committee to report.

A report of the arbitrators re Kearns, applying for a new school section, was read and on motion was laid on the table till to-morrow morning.

A communication from the County Clerk of the County of Wellington, in reference to admendments in the High School Act, 1896, was read, and on motion was referred to the Education and Printing committee to report.

A communication from Brown Bros. in reference to improved cash books, was read, and on motion laid on the table till to morrow morning.

Moved by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Riley, that Mr. Vankoughnet be refunded \$10, the amount of the fine imposed on him, when such amount comes into the Treasurer's hands, as he has since taken out license for a whole year. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Amey, seconded by Mr. Bryden, that John Cheetham be paid \$1.50 per day as messenger in attendance at this session of the Council. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Oliver, that this Council desire to express their disapproval of the present practice adopted by County officials of purchasing supplies without consulting any committee of this Council, which we

believe tends to extravagance and serious abuses ; therefore we deem it advisable that the Clerk notify such said officials that hereafter they are requested to communicate their requests for supplies to the chairman of the proper committee of this Council. Carried.

Moved by Mr. Carscallen, seconded by Mr. Bryden, that the Finance committee called together on the 7th August last by the Warden, to give the Treasurer authority to over-draw in the Dominion Bank, receive each one day's pay and mileage as follows :

Moved by Mr. Symington, seconded by Mr. Riley, that the usual grant of \$200 to the Napanee Model School be paid. Carried.

On motion the Warden left the chair, which was taken by Mr. Allison.

Moved by Mr. Carscallen, seconded by Mr. Amey, that the members of this Council have much pleasure in presenting to Bowen E. Aylsworth, Esq., Warden, our thanks for the able, courteous and impartial manner in which he has discharged the duties of presiding officer of this Council for the year 1897. Each member of the Council spoke to the motion, after which the motion was put, and carried unanimously by a standing vote.

Warden resumed the chair and returned thanks to the Council.

REPORT OF ARBITRATORS

RE A NEW PUBLIC SCHOOL SECTION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF SHEFFIELD.

To His Worship the Warden and Members of the County Council of the County of Lennox and Addington :

We, the undersigned arbitrators, appointed by the County Council of the County of Lennox and Addington, at its meeting in June, 1897, to hear and determine the appeal made and entered by Michael Kearns, John Kearns, Jr., Christopher Smith, Daniel Kearns, and John Kearns, Sr., five rate-payers of Public School section No. 7 in the Township of Sheffield, to the said County Council, against the refusal of the Council of the Township of Sheffield, on the 5th day of April, 1897, to grant the prayer of the petition of five rate-payers to establish a new Public School section in the said Township of Sheffield, to be composed of the following lands, viz.: the n hf of Lot No. 10, and lots Nos. 11, 12, 13, 14, and 15 in the 9th Concession, Lots 9 to 15 both inclusive in the 10th Concession, Lots 11 to 20 both inclusive in the 11th Concession, Lots 13 to 20 both inclusive and that part of Lot 21 south of Puzzle Lake in the 12th Concession, and Lots 14 to 20 both inclusive and that

part of Lot 21 south of Puzzle Lake in the 13th Concession, all in the Township of Sheffield; do hereby find and determine, after hearing the evidence and arguments adduced by the parties interested and concerned, that no sufficient or valid ground has been shown to justify or warrant the establishment of the new section asked for in the said petition, and we find that the action of the Council of the Township of Sheffield in refusing to grant the prayer of the said petition was right and proper.

We, the Grand Jurors of our Sovereign Lady the Queen,
beg leave to present as follows :

That it is a source of gratification to know that there is no criminal business to be brought before us at the present Sessions of the Court. This, we take to be a fair index of the general morality and absence of crime in our midst.

We have examined the gaol and find it in good condition, and that the inmates are as well cared for as the circumstances of their confinement will permit.

With respect to the idiot confined in the gaol, we think more strenuous efforts should be made to procure his removal to a more suitable place of confinement.

We have carefully considered Your Honor's remarks in reference to the establishment of a Poor House in our County, and we heartily endorse all that was said by Your Honor, and believe that some provisions other than the common gaol should be made for the deserving poor who are guilty of no offence other than inability to maintain and support themselves. We believe such an institution, would be in a large measure self-sustaining if properly managed, and that the expense of running

such an Institution would not exceed the amount now spent by the different Municipalities in caring for their poor, and that the poor would be maintained and cared for in such a manner as would reflect credit on all of us, who in a measure are responsible for their proper maintenance and support.

We congratulate Your Honor upon your good health and trust that you may long be spared to fill the important position which you have occupied so long with honor to yourself and satisfaction to the general public.

Gentlemen :—We, your committee on Roads and Bridges, report as follows :—

At the request of the Chairman of this committee we met in Napanee on Monday, June 6th, and proceeded to the site of Kingsford bridge, where we met a committee of Hastings County Council, who in company with your committee proceeded to examine said bridge and the abutments therefore. A careful and thorough examination of the timbers of the bridge and abutments convinced your committee that the timbers were so badly decayed and rotten as to render the bridge unsafe for public travel. Your committee were unable to decide whether the abutments could be repaired or would have to be rebuilt. After conferring with the committee from Hastings County it was decided that each committee report to their Council, advising their respective Councils to empower their Roads and Bridges committee acting in conjunction with the

committee from the other county to remove the bridge, and if in the opinion of the joint committee the abutments are found to be sufficiently sound to be worth repairing, that they the committee be authorized to repair the abutments and build a wooden bridge thereon, but if new abutments have to be built, that the committee be authorized to build stone or concrete abutments and place a steel bridge thereon.

We recommend that the members of the committee each receive one day's pay and mileage.

I found the buildings, cells and corridors, yards and water closets were well kept.

Food according to regulations, and supplies obtained partly by contract. Well water supplied. Drainage and ventilation not very good.

Four suits of clothing in good order. Books properly kept.

I found that the water closets are on pits in the ground, near the wells. They must be removed to some other place and dry earth closets substituted, (better still flush closets connected with the water system.)


