HAS ONLY 6000 FIGHTING MEN

Sir William Garstin Says the Country South of Khartoum is Worth Nothing.

London, March 22.—The Cairo correspondent of the Daily Telegraph writes in substance of an interview he has had with Sir William Edmund Garstin, Under Secretary of State for Public Works in Egypt, who has just returned from a Nile tour.

Sir William says that, according to the latest reports, the Khalifa, the Dervish leader in the Sudan, is in great straits for food and ammunition.

He has only 6000 fighting men, and a thousand rifles, while he is hampered by an enormous following of women and children.

Many of his followers are anxious to desert him, and two hundred and fifty of them actually did so during the trip.

The Cairo correspondent of the Times says: "Sir William Garstin considers the possession of the Sudan, south of Khartoum, to be practically worthless to any civilized power, as the territory affords no field for the employment of capital."

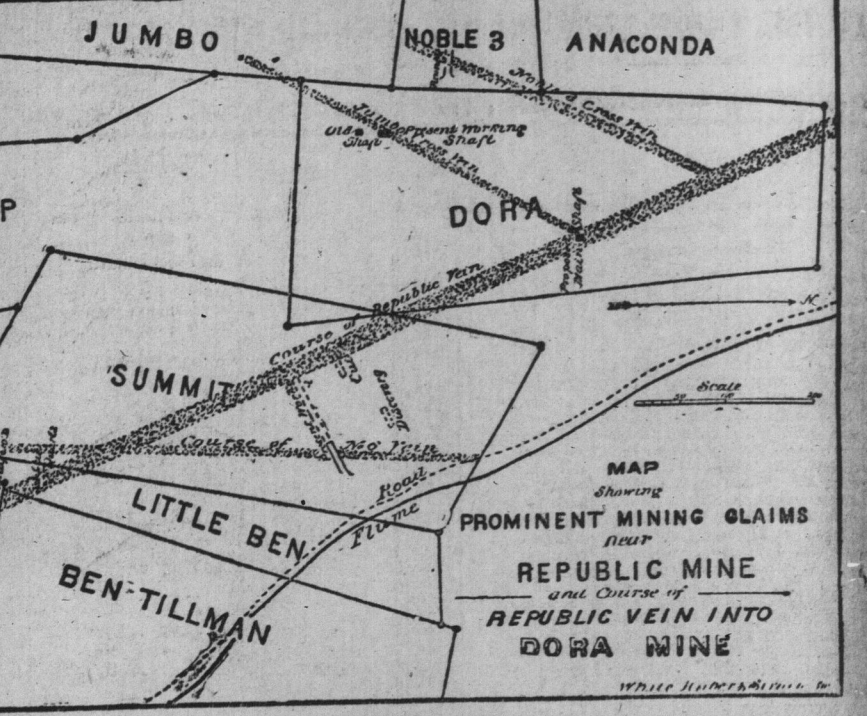

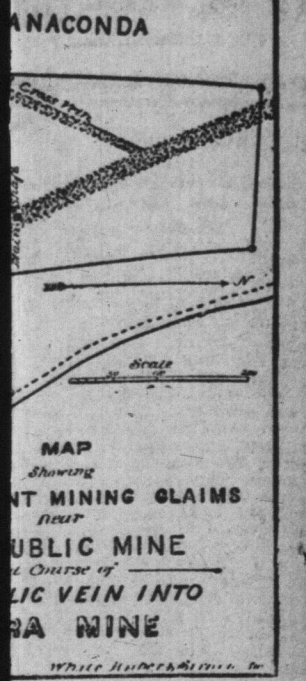

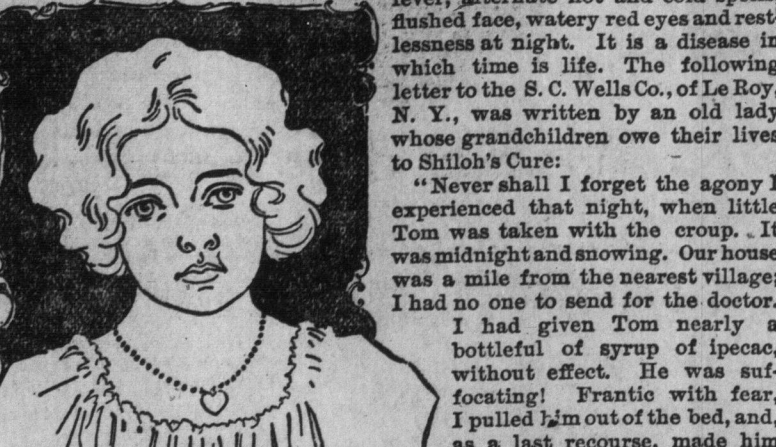

WHEAT RISES OVER A CENT

Decided Improvement in Chicago. Futures Yesterday.

Cables Were Higher and There Were Crop Damage Reports From the West - Buying Was General From All Quarters-Corn Prices Up-Notes and Gossip.

Wednesday Evening, March 22. Liverpool market futures today advanced 1/4 to 1/2 per cent above yesterday's final figures.

Paris wheat closed unchanged to 10 centimes for the day, with flour irregular.

Chicago wheat futures advanced over a cent to-day and closed near the top figure of the season.

The improved cables started the rise and these were followed by reports of damage to crops in the Southwest.

The buying was pretty general. This is the season when damage to crops is made the most of to advance prices, but until these fully materialize higher prices do not seem to be warranted by legitimate conditions.

The July option figured increasingly in to-day's trading.

Liverpool maize futures to-day advanced 1/4 to 1/2 per cent. Chicago corn advanced about 1/2 per cent to-day.

Exports at New York to-day: Flour 500 barrels and 20,000 sacks; wheat 135,610 bushels.

Receipts of wheat at Minneapolis and Duluth to-day 442 cars, as against 224 cars the corresponding day of last year.

Foreign Crop Notes.

The latest estimate of the Australian wheat crop is 53,000,000 bushels, against 33,000,000 bushels in 1898, and 27,000,000 bushels in 1897.

Harvesting of wheat is in progress in the upper and central provinces of Egypt, and extending its operations in the Indian Dependencies.

The statistical department of the Ministry of Agriculture of Argentina estimates the wheat crop of that country at 2,240,000 tons, or 88,500,000 bushels. The export of wheat surplus is placed at 1,350,000 tons, or 56,370,000 bushels. The largest previous crop was that of 1898, estimated at 2,000,000 tons. The exports for the calendar year 1898 amounted to 50,000,000 bushels.
