THE TWENTY-SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE MANAGERS OF

The Protestant Orphans' Home

AND FEMALE AID SOCIETY.

In presenting their twenty-sixth annual report the Lady Managers of the Protestant Orphans' Home and Female Aid Society return thanks to God for the many gracious benefits the institution has received during the year. Though nothing of unusual interest has occurred in the Home since the last annual meeting, prosperity has still attended the efforts which have been put forth on its behalf. At present the number of Orphans in the Home is 104. The average number for the year has been 97. There have been admitted 59—boys, 43; girls, 16. Twenty boys and seven girls have been removed by parents. Six boys and two girls have been apprenticed. One boy has been adopted, one ran away, and one was sent to the Asylum at Orillia. Two of the inmates have died, George Culvert in April, and Mrs. Forde in February. The Managers would direct attention to this last incident, as it shows that not only children receive protection from the Home, but also adults are sometimes taken in and cared for.

Many of the boys and girls that have left are succeeding well, and very satisfactory reports of their conduct have been received from time to time during the year. In the early part of the year the Home underwent a thorough renovation, and now presents an exceedingly creditable appearance. A great sanitary improve-

ment has been effected this year by connecting the drain from the Home with the main drain on Sullivan Street.

The Committee have much pleasure in testifying to the care and attention given by the Matron, Miss Wheelright, to her department, also to the good management of Miss Hubbard in the schoolroom, where the improvement of the pupils has been most satisfactory, and their work done in a highly creditable manner.

Through the kindness of the captain of the steamer *Bouquet*, the children have enjoyed two trips to the Island.

The Managers would again thank Dr. Ogden for his kindness to the inmates of the Home, and Mr. Huson Murray, their solicitor, for the kind services rendered by him on several occasions. During the year the Orangemen of Ontario have contributed liberally to the funds of the institution, for which the Managers do most gratefully thank them, especially so for the noble response they made to a letter addressed to them by Mr. Andrew Fleming, soliciting their aid at a time when the finances of the Home were completely exhausted. Their liberality on that occasion was most commendable, and enabled the Managers to tide over what for a time seemed an almost insurmountable difficulty. The funds of the Home have been further increased by a legacy of two hundred dollars received from the executors of the late Miss Margaret Duncan, of Weston. Thanks are also due to those who kindly assisted at the concert given in aid of the Home. The Managers cordially thank the kind Victuallers, Bakers, Grocers, Confectioners, and other friends who have remembered them during the year.

In conclusion, the Managers hope that the blessings granted by the Giver of all Good in the past, may be continued in the future, and that the prosperity of the Home will become still more prosperous.
