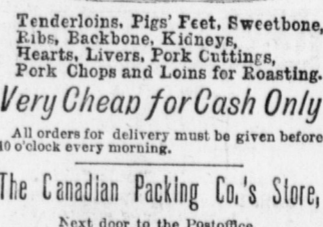

There is no longer any danger for Gladstone's Government in the committee stage of the Home Rule Bill. The perilous ninth cause has been carried, and the last hope of the "Unionists" for a possible vote adverse to the Ministry upon this highly contentious part of the measure has vanished in the face of a majority of 29 in its favor.

The initial expenditures arising from the operations of the new German military law will be covered by a loan of 48,000,000 marks. This loan has been approved by the budget committee.

America is to be inflicted shortly with a visit of the "cabbage apostle," Dieffenbach, a Munich painter, who lives and urges others to live exclusively on a sort of cabbage. He refuses to wear any clothing except a pair of bathing trousers.

The culmination of the craze for suicide in Berlin was reached Wednesday, when six people killed themselves.

American is second on the list of foreign countries represented at the German universities. There are 398 Russians and 350 Americans.

STRUCK AT A CROSSING.

One Person Killed and Two Fatally Injured. WALTHAM, MASS., July 16.—Henry J. White, town treasurer of Waltham, and his son are at the Waltham Hospital dangerously injured, while his wife lies dead and terribly mangled, in consequence of being struck by a train at the Hastings crossing at Kendall Green.

The railroad at this point makes a turn, and the occupants of the train were unable to hear the approach of the train. The horse, after being driven upon the track, suddenly balked and could not be started again before the engine had crashed into the vehicle.

OFF FOR GREENLAND.

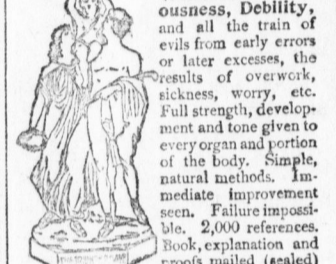
