

EARTHQUARE AT CALABRA.—The in-telligence received of an earthquake in this Province is of the most painful charac-ter. Calabria is subject to earthquakes: a most terrific visitation of this sort oc-curred in 1783, which swallowed up many towns and villages. In some por-tions of the Province there are traces of former valences, and the soil is one former volcances, and the soil is one mass of lava. Calabra is at the southern extremity of Italy, and forms what is cal-led the foot of the Italian boot.

CHINESE FUNERAL.—Quite a singular sight, in the way of a Chinese funeral, took place in the city yesterday morning.
