YORK COUNTY COURT.

Mount and Brown on Trial for Burning the S. A. Barracks.

The Latter Convicted.

The York county court, Judge Steadman presiding, opened at 10.30 a.m. Tuesday.

His Honor stated that in the arson case, the burning of the Salvation Army barracks, which was the only criminal case before the court, he had not had time to look over the depositions and he dismissed the grand jury until Wednesday morning.

Only one civil case was entered for trial, that of Eben Miller vs. Patrick Kelly, an action to recover the amount of two promissory notes.

The Criminal Trial.

On the court opening Wednesday morning the Judge addressed the grand jury on the arson charge against Mount and Brown and in the afternoon a true bill was rendered against the prisoners.

Brown's trial commenced Thursday morning, J. H. Barry, clerk of the court, representing the crown, and Wesley VanWart, Q. C., the prisoner.

Capt. Byers, of the Salvation army, was the first witness. He was called to the witness stand in the barracks the night before the fire. Himself and four officers were there until twenty minutes to two, and the lights were all out when he left the hall.

He was engaged to scrub out the barracks but did not do so. He did not seem to try to get work. Suspicion was aroused to Brown, because he lingered when all the others had left the building.

Col. Calkins sworn, said he was at the meeting the night before the fire. He was positive the lights were out before the door was locked. He heard a noise in the rear of the building about the time the fire broke out.

Mr. VanWart then placed the prisoner, George Brown, on the stand as a witness in his own defence.

He denied having had a conversation with Roberts at the lockup. Roberts did not caution him. He had no ill-feelings against any member of the Fredericton Corps.

Mr. VanWart then addressed the jury in behalf of the prisoner. He said the evidence was entirely circumstantial and if there was a broken link in the chain the prisoner should have the doubt.

Mr. Barry for the crown, asked a conviction. He said circumstantial evidence was stronger than direct evidence. Besides circumstantial evidence there was positive proof against the prisoner.

After dinner His Honor Judge Steadman charged the jury, his charge being strongly against the prisoner. The jury retired at 2.50 p.m., and at 3.16 brought in a verdict of guilty.

On the application of Mr. Barry the prisoner was remanded until Tuesday morning next at ten o'clock.

The court stands adjourned till Tuesday when Mount was placed on the witness stand.
