At the Springfield (N.S.) coal mines, a short time ago, a man named McDevia, while in the act of shovelling coal into a box, was struck by a fall of coal from the top of the mine, and had both his legs broken and one ear nearly severed from his head.

A YOUNG WOMAN named Lee, died suddenly at Fredericton, N. B., a few days ago, while inhaling chloroform, preparatory to having some teeth extracted. An inquest was held, and the physician who administered the chloroform, and the dentist were exonerated.

The schooner Four Sisters, owned by Mr. Joseph Gallant, merchant, Boston, loaded with 5,000 bushels of potatoes and bound for Restico to Halifax, was wrecked and completely broken up on the north side of the island on Thursday last, the 3rd inst. We understand there was no insurance on vessel or cargo.

A few nights ago a young lad employed on the farm of Mr. George Smith, Fort Pond, went out for a row in a goose boat owned by his master. On the following morning his body was found on the shore a short distance from where he started, and the boat was discovered on the opposite side of the river.

So great is the flow of immigration to Canada, that additional steamers have been added to the weekly service between the St. Lawrence and Europe. There are now six steamers on the route; three of the Allan line, two of the Dominion line, and one of the Beaver line, and they carry an aggregate of 4,500 passengers.

On Sunday morning the 29th ult, two brothers named Slaughterwhite started from Torrence Bay, near Halifax, in a boat to go back to the mainland. The boat was very rough at the time, and late in the afternoon of the same day the boat was picked up some distance from where they started, but nothing was seen or heard of the brothers, who were undoubtedly drowned.

Two fatal accidents, following each other in quick succession, have of late occurred in connection with the electric light in Halifax. On Sunday night, April 29th, Mr. Webber, roadman, was killed by means of the electric current, as we stated last week. On the Tuesday night following, his successor, John Croker, was killed under similar circumstances while attending the very same lamp. Before ascending the post to fix the lamp, Croker heated for some minutes; finally he ascended, and while adjusting the lamp, his arm came in contact with the electric current and he fell against the post, dead.
