Restricts Navigation

London, Feb. 23.—The Admiralty announces that Irish Channel and the Channel, waters lying between England and Scotland and land, have been restricted navigation from July. The southern entrance to the Channel, known as George's Channel, is being closed. The restriction is being made to prevent navigation from the coast, and St. David's Head, the "open" coast, of the Channel. Certain areas of this Channel have been closed to navigation by the Admiralty orders, which also require all traffic wishing to pass through the North Channel to the southward of the Island between sunset and sunrise.
