crucifix. Last year 20,000 copies had been circulated in Italy, chiefl, by colporteurs and Bible readers. In Portugal also the work was progressing. Syria was once more occupied, and Jerusalem had become the headquarters of the Society. During the war between France and Germany 417,000 copies had been circulated among the French soldiers and 964,900 among the German soldiers one half of which were bought at full-cost price. And the Society had since resolved that a copy of the Scriptures should be given to every family who had lost a relative in the late war. The Basle (Switzerland) Bible Society had given copies of the Scriptures to each man in Bourbaki's army, while lying there. The receipts of the Parent Society last year were £182,000. He then spoke of the liberality of the Guelth Society in distributing copies of the Scriptures last year to the Voiunteers before going to the camp, and gave some interesting facts in relation to the salutary effect this and other means had on the men. After giving some particulars with reference to the American Bible Society, the speaker closed with an earnest appeal to go onward and redouble their efforts until the Bible was liverally spread from pole to pole.
