

DYNAMITERS ON TRIAL.

UNNIGHAM ONE OF THE RAILWAY EXPLODERS.

Master's Testimony—Identification of Barton as One of the Conspirators of the Explosion.

UNNIGHAM, Feb. 16.—The examination of Unnigham and Barton was continued today. Notices were posted upon the court doors stating that no person carrying a bag would be permitted to enter the court and suspected persons would be searched.

The crown proceeded to produce testimony implicating the prisoners in the underground railway explosion at Governor's station.

Policeman Seward testified that he saw the train at Bishopsgate and saw Unnigham leaning from the window of the brake.

Witness looked into the rake and saw what appeared to be a man in a blue coat and a hat, who was carrying a bag.

Unnigham immediately arose from his seat and shouted, "You are a liar."

Myers said he recognized and alluded to the fact that there were three in the rake and attempted to enter.

Unnigham and Barton were two of the three men. Myers also positively identified him.

Policeman Crawford testified that he saw three men alight from the brake at lower street at the time of the explosion.
