ECLIPSES.

There will be six eclipses this year, four of the sun and two of the moon, viz :

1. Of the Sun, Feb. 22d. conj. at 11h. 51m. evening, invisible at Quebec.

2. Of the Moon, March 9th total, but invisible at Quebec, conj. at 8h. 46m. morning, digits eclipsed 20° . Duration 3h 54m.

3. Of the Sun, March 24th, invisible, conj. at 9h. 59m. morning.

4. Of the Sun, Aug. 18th, invisible, conj. 7h. 8m. morning.

5. Of the moon, sept. 2, visible. The Moon will rise as the Sun sets, totally eclipsed—at 6h. 44min. her eastern limb will begin to appear. End of the eclipse 7h. 41½min. Duration 3h. 36min. Digits eclipsed, 21° . 40½m:

6°. Of the Sun, 16th September, invisible, conj. 11h, 43m. evening.

MOON'S RISING AND SETTING.

At four days old it sets at, and shines till, about 10 at night. 5 - about - 11 6 - about - 12 7 at near 1 in the morn- ing.		15, at full, it rises about 6 in the evening. 16 - at $\frac{1}{4}$ after - 7 17 - at $\frac{1}{2}$ after - 8 18 - about - - 10 19 - about - - 11 20 - about - - 12
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Of the Changes of the Moon.

Many persons, understanding that the mean time between one new Moon and another is 29 days, 12 hours, 44 minutes and a fraction, imagine that, to find the full or quarters of the Moon, they have only to add a half or fourth part of that time; and when they do not find the changes marked in the Calendar to correspond with this method, they impute it to mistake in the calculation of those changes. It is therefore, necessary to put them in mind, that the great inequality of the Moon's motions renders the above rule extremely inaccurate, so that nineteen times in twenty, it must fail in giving the true conjunction or change.

The Mails from Quebec to the several Post Offices on the route to Montreal, are made up and forwarded every day, at 8 P. M. in summer, and 4 P. M. in winter, Sundays and Fridays excepted.

The Mails from Quebec to the several Post Offices in Upper-Canada, the Ottawa River, Fort Chambly, St. John, Isle aux Noix and Phillipsburg, are made up and forwarded every Tuesday and Saturday, at the same hour as the Montreal Mail.

The Mails from Quebec to the several Post Offices in the Eastern Townships, are made up and forwarded every Monday, at the same hour as the Montreal mail.

The Mails from Quebec to the several Post Offices in Nova-Scotia and New-Brunswick, are made up and forwarded every Tuesday, at 11 A. M.

Mails for the Baie Chaleur and Gaspé are sent only two or three times in the course of the winter, by special expresses, there being no established line of Post upon that Route.

During the Winter—Mails for every part of the United States are made up at Montreal on Mondays, Thursdays and Saturdays—and during the season of Steam-boat Navigation, every day—Sundays excepted.

Letters for Europe may be forwarded by this route, if the Provincial and United States postage are paid upon mailing

Letters for Europe intended to go by the way of Quebec (which can be done during the summer months by merchant's ships) must be post paid to Quebec.)—If they are to be sent *via* Halifax, the postage must be paid to Halifax—Care must be taken to pay the inland postage upon all Letters for Europe, otherwise they cannot be forwarded.

Stanstead and Montreal in Lower-Canada, and Prescott, Kingston, and Niagara in Upper-Canada, are in direct and official communication with the Post Office Department in the United States, and Letters to the United States can be sent thro' either of these Offices upon payment of the Provincial Postage ; or to Europe upon payment of the Provincial and American Postage, at the time of mailing.

Rule 1. Let the value of the Spanish Dollar be expressed in Shillings, or Pence, in each of the Currencies, writing them in form of a Fraction, and making the $\left\{ \begin{array}{l} \text{required} \\ \text{given} \end{array} \right\}$ Currency the

Numerator }
Denominator } of the Fraction.

Reduce this Fraction to its *least terms*, and it will serve as a constant Multiplier, by which any sum of the *given* Currency being Multiplied, it will be converted into the Currency required.

N. B. When the Fraction is not an improper one the *Multiplier* will become a Divisor.

EXAMP. To form a rule for changing Sterling at 4s/6. pr. Dollar into New-York at 8s. pr. Dollar.

Here *Sterling* is *given*, and *York* *required*: The Dollar in $\left\{ \begin{array}{l} \text{York is } 8s. \text{ or } 96 \text{ Pence Numerator,} \\ \text{Sterling } 4s/6. \text{ or } 54 \text{ Pence Denominator.} \end{array} \right.$

Therefore $\frac{96}{54}$ is the Multiplier sought, which reduced to its least terms becomes $\frac{16}{9}$ or $1\frac{7}{9}$, therefore if Sterling be multiplied by 16 and divided by 9 the result will be York, thus. $\frac{16}{9}$ is the same as 2 into $\frac{8}{9}$, but $\frac{8}{9}$ is the same as 1 less $\frac{1}{9}$, therefore 2 into $\frac{8}{9}$ is equal to 2 into 1 less $\frac{1}{9}$, which is that Rule, expressed shorter thus, $\frac{16}{9} = 2 \times \frac{8}{9} = 2 \times 1 \frac{1}{9}$.

(1) This further duty is only charged with its amount, if and shall exceed the amount of the previous duties, in which case the excess is payable, 16 Geo, 4, cap. 114, sec. 11, but this is not likely to occur except with every high priced articles, it may therefore be considered as merely nominal.

(2) This further duty will in every case exceed the previous duty, the excess will therefore be charged; the amount payable cannot however shewu by Table, as it will vary in every case according to the value of the article.

(3) Molasses if imported in a vessel not belonging to the U. Kingdom or to Quebec, the duty will be 7d stg, instead of 4d.

(4) This duty is drawn back if the half be shipped for the use of the fisheries in the lower parts of the Province.

(6) Upon such of these goods as are liable to the Provincial

duty of 2½ per cent, that duty is payable under the Provincial law, but its amount is deducted from the payment made under the 6 Geo. 4, cap. 114.

(7) A tonnage duty of 4s sterling, per tun from the ships, and 10 per cent upon the amount of duties on the goods imported is chargeable by order in Council, under certain conditions, which present only apply to the ships of the United States.
