



CONSTITUTION

OF THE

Church Society of the Diocese of Coronto;

INCORPORATED BY THE STATUTE OF CANADA, 7 VICTORIA, CAP. 68, FOR PROMOTING THE FOLLOWING OBJECTS:

- FIRST. -- For the encouragement and support of Missionaries and Clergymen of the United Church of England and Ireland within the Diocese of Toronto, and for creating a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen, and towards making provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity, and for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy of the said Church in the said Diocese.
- SECONDLY.—For the encouragement of Education, and for the support of Day-schools and Sunday-schools in the said Diocese, in conformity with the principles of the said Church.
- THERDLY.—For granting assistance, where it may be necessary, to those who may be preparing for the Ministry of the Gospel in the said Church, within the said Diocese.
- FOURTHLY.—For circulating in the said Diocese the Holy Scriptures, the Book of Common Prayer of the said Church, and such other books and tracts as shall be approved by the Central Board or Managing Committee of the said Association.
- FIFTHLY.—For obtaining and granting aid towards the erection, endowment, and maintenance of Churches, according to the establishment of the said Church, in the said Diocese; the erection and maintenance of Parsonage houses; the setting apart of Burial-grounds and Church-yards; the endowment and support of Parsonages and Rectories, according to the same establishment, and the management of all matters relating to such endowment.

I.

That before the Society shall enter upon any business at any of its meetings, the following prayers shall be said:—

"Prevent us, O Lord, in all our doings, with thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help; that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

"O God, from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all works of piety and charity do proceed, we beseech Thee to visit with Thy favour our Sovereign Queen Victoria, and so rule her heart, that she may in all things seek Thy honour and glory. Prosper with Thy blessing the designs of this Society. Comfort with Thy grace those benefactors who contribute to its support. Bless the ministry of Thy servants, the Clergy; the endeavours of all who are engaged in spreading the knowledge of true religion in this Province, and the labours of those Missionaries who are promoting the same in foreign parts. And may Thy Holy Spirit direct all our consultations to the advancement of Thy glory, and the good of Thy Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

"O MERCIFUL GOD, who hast made all men, and hatest nothing that Thou hast made, nor wouldest the death of a sinner but rather that he should be converted and live, have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, infidels, and heretics, and also upon all those heathen nations upon which the light of Thy glorious Gospel hath not yet shone; especially the Indians of this continent. Bless the means used for their civilization and conversion, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy Word: and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. Amen.

"OUR FATHER, which art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil; for thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory for ever and ever. Amen."

AND WHEN BUSINESS IS ENDED.

"Almighty Gop, Father of all mercies, we thine unworthy servants do give Thee most humble and hearty thanks for all Thy goodness, and loving kindness, to us and to all men: more particularly for the providential support by which this Society has been enabled to spread abroad the knowledge of Thy sacred truth. But above all for Thine inestimable love in the redemption of the world by Thy blessed Son; for the means of grace and for the hope of glory, which Thou hast given us, in the same our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ; to whom with Thee and the Holy Ghost be all honour and glory, world without end. Amen.

"The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Ghost, be with us all evermore. Amen."

II.

That all those who are now, or who shall hereafter become members of the Association, and who shall subscribe Ten Shillings annually to the Funds of the Society, or contribute as much as Five Pounds in one sum, shall be Associated Members of the Society, and shall be eligible to be Members of the Corporation.

III.

That every Incorporated Member subscribe not less than One Pound Five Shillings annually to the Funds of the Society, or contribute not less than Twelve Pounds Ten Shillings in one sum, or land to the value of twenty-five Pounds; and that the Standing Committee be empowered, with the sanotion of the President, to recommend persons whether Associated Members or not, to be elected into the Corporation as Life Members, who shall have contributed through any of the Parochial Associations in connection with the Society, in money, the sum of Twenty Pounds, or in land to the value of Thirty Pounds, for any of the following special purposes, viz.:—to be invested or held in trust for the Widows and Orphans Fund; to

be invested or held in trust for the endowment of a Church or a Church-school; and that it shall be the duty of the Secretary at the meeting in the month of November in each and every year, to make a return of those who have not paid up the 25s. for the year ending the 30th day of April previous, and that such names shall be erased from the list of Incorporated Members.

IV.

That the Corporation shall consist of the Bishop of Toronto for the time being, of the members appointed by the charter, and of so many of the other Associated Members of the Society as shall be elected by shallot Members of the Corporation, at the meetings to be from time to time holden on the days and at the place appointed by the By-laws of the Corporation, for its stated meetings. Provided always, that the whole number of members of the said Corporation, in addition to those who are made Members by the Statute, shall at no time exceed three hundred, and that the whole number of members of the Corporation shall never be less than one hundred.

V

That the Standing Committee of the Society, to be appointed as provided in one of the following By-laws, be empowered, with the sanction of the President, to recommend persons, whether Associated Members or not, to be elected into the Corporation, without reference to the limitation of numbers.

VI.

That the Lord Bishop of Toronto for the time being shall be President of the Society, and the Venerable the Archdeacons within the Diocese, shall be Vice-Presidents.

VII

That the Society shall hold a General Meeting on the second Wednesday in June in each year, when they shall choose one or more Vice-President or Vice-Presidents in addition to the Archdeacons; one or more Treasurer or Treasurers; one auditor; one Secretary, and such other officers, ministers and servants as shall be thought convenient to serve in the said offices for the year ensuing. Provided always, that no person not a member of the Society shall be eligible to any office.

VIII.

That the paid officers to be appointed by the foregoing rule, shall be a Secretary, either a Clergyman or Layman, at the discretion of the Society, and with such salary as the Society may from time to time appoint; and that he shall furnish security to the satisfaction of the Solicitor to the amount of £1000, himself in £500, and two sureties in £250 each. Also, the Auditor.

IX.

That the Standing Committee shall propose to the Board at the General Meeting in November, a list of seven Members of the Society, to form the Tract and Book Committee for the year ensuing; that at that meeting any member be at liberty to propose another list of seven members of the Society, instead of that proposed by the Standing Committee, and that the election of the Tract and Book Committee take place at the General Meeting in January.

X.

That if it shall happen that any of the persons at any time chosen into any of the said offices shall die, or on any account be removed from such office at any time during the period for which he was elected or appointed to serve, in such case the President, or any one of the Vice-Presidents, shall convene a meeting, to be held at the usual place of meeting of the Society, at such time as shall be specified in the notice of such meeting; and that such members of the Corporation as shall be present at the meeting, or a majority of them, shall and may choose an officer or offi-

cers in the room or place of such person or persons so dead or removed, as to them shall seem meet. Provided, that it shall not be necessary for any such meeting to be called for supplying a vacancy in the office of Vice-President; but the President may do so in his discretion.

XI.

That the Society shall and may, on the second Wednesday in the months of February, May, August and November, for ever hereafter, and oftener, if occasion require, meet at the place heretofore used for the transaction of the business of the said Society, or such other place as may be hereafter appointed for that purpose; and that the President or Standing Committee have power to call a special meeting of the said Society at any time. In Lent the meetings to be holden on Thursday instead of Wednesday. That the general meetings of the Society be held at eleven o'clock, A. M.

XII.

That no act done in any meeting of the said Society shall be valid and effectual unless the President, or some one of the Vice-Presidents, shall be present at such meeting.

XIII.

And with regard to all meetings of the Society, and to the making, altering, or repealing any By-laws, Rules or regulations at such meetings, it is to be specially noticed, that by the act of the Legislature incorporating the Society (7 Vic., ch. 68) it is enacted that no act done in such assembly or meeting of the Corporation shall be valid or effectual, unless six persons of the Corporation, at the least, shall be present, and the major part of them consenting thereto.

And further, that no Constitution, By-law, Rule or Regulation of the Society, nor any abrogation, repeal, change or alteration of the same, shall be passed, except notice of such intention shall have been given at the previous quarterly meeting and then it shall not be of any force or effect until it shall have been sanctioned and confirmed by the Bishop of, or administering, the Diocese for the

time being, by writing under his hand.

XIV.

That there shall be a Standing Committee (five of whom shall be a quorum) to

prepare the business for the Quarterly Meetings of the Society.

That the President, Archdeacons, Rural Deans, and Scoretary be exofficio members of the Standing Committee; and that the committee shall further consist of ten members, to be elected by the Society at its annual meeting from its incorporated members; and also of a clerical and lay member from each of the several distinct associations in connexion with the Parent Society, to be elected annually by each of such district associations.

That the Standing Committee shall meet at eleven o'clock on the days immediately preceding the quarterly or special meetings of the society, and at such other

times as the said committee may deem expedient.

XV.

That minutes of all the proceedings of the Society be taken, and that at each meeting of the Society the minutes of the preceding meeting be read by the Secretary, and signed by the Chairman.

XVI.

That the accounts of the Society be closed on the 30th day of April in each year, and that the same be audited within one month from that date.

XVII.

That the Secretary conduct the correspondence of the Society, take minutes of the proceedings of the General Meetings and Committees, and prepare the Annual Report of the Society in connexion with the Standing Committee.

XVIII.

In connexion and correspondence with the Society, District Associations shall be established, comprising one or more Districts, (as shall be approved by the President,) the same to be composed of the Clergy resident within the bounds of the district, and all other members who shall contribute in aid of the Society's Funcs; the Archdeacon, or Senior Clergyman resident within its bounds, shall ex officio be chairman of such District Branch Association, with whom shall be associated, as composing a Committee of Management, all Clergymen in the District and two Laymen from each congregation which observes the constitution, rules and regulations of the Society, and from none others; the lay members to be elected at the annual meeting of the Parochial Association.

A general meeting of the Branch District Associations shall be held in each year at any time and place which may be agreed upon at a previous Quarterly Meeting of the Committee of Management; and Quarterly Meetings of the Committee of Management—not less than five to form a quorum—shall be held for the transaction of the ordinary business of each Branch Association.

In order to more fully carry out the objects of the Society, a general Public Meeting shall be held annually in each parish, at which the objects and claims of the Society shall be set forth, and persons shall be invited to become members by contributing to its funds, such conrributors to form a Parochial Association of the Church Society. The members of the Association shall elect annually four among their own number as a committee, which, through its Chairman, (the Clergyman,) shall be in correspondence with the District Branch Associations, and may be denominated the Parochial Committee of the Church Society. The Committee shall meet so often, and at such periods as they shall themselves decide to be most convenient, inviting the co-operation of all the parishoners in their deliberations and designs. They shall collect subscriptions and donations from the members of the Church, in such manner as they shall deem most effective, and endeavour by every moans in their power to augment the resources of the Society. All moneys raised to be transmitted to the treasurer of the District Association, who shall on or before the 30th of April in each year, transmit the same to the treasurer of the Society at Toronto, without any deduction.

The District Associations, through their respective Secretaries, shall communicate to the Secretary of the Parent Society at Toronto a minute statement of all receipts and expenditures within the sphere of their operations, embodied in the form of a report, once in each year, so soon as convenient after the General Annual Meeting of such District Branch Associations.

XIX.

That four sermons be preached annually, and collections made in every church, chapel, or station in which an established Sunday service is performed, provided that in case of stations where Sunday service cannot be performed more than once in a month, it shall be discretionary with the Clergyman serving such stations to omit the said collection, if he shall think proper.

That the collections be made for the objects specified on the days following, or not later than two Sundays subsequently:

- 1. For Missions, on the first Sunday in January
- 2. For Widows and Orphans' Fund, on the first Sunday in October.
- 3. For Missions, on first Sunday in July.
- 4. For Students in Theology, on the first Sunday in April.

That, as it is expedient that the funds annually raised in aid of Theological Students should be appropriated to the maintenance of exhibitions for the same in Trinity College, it be provided that the several District Associations of the Church Society, may, through their central boards, nominate one or more persons as holders of such exhibitions.

Provided, that any district, thus nominating, shall undertake to remit annually to the Church Society a sum which shall cover the amount of the exhibition or exhibitions to which a nomination is made.

That any district, entering into such engagements, shall be entitled to appropriate

to the maintenance of the exhibition or exhibitions the proceeds of the annual collection made within the District for the Divinity Students' Fund.

That any surplus, remaining to any district, after providing for its exhibition or exhibitions, shall be paid over to the Church Society, to be put to the credit of that district towards a provision for an additional exhibition.

The Committee further recommend that persons thus nominated to exhibitions shall enjoy them subject, with only one exception, to no other conditions than those which are prescribed for every candidate for admission into Trinity College.

These conditions are :

That he shall produce testimonials of good conduct.
 That he shall pass the Matriculation Examination.
 That he shall have entered on his sixteenth year.

The exception mentioned above respects this third condition of age. It will probably be thought desirable that every Divinity Exhibitoner shall have entered on his 19th year, in order that his course of study may not be completed too long before the time at which he can receive Holy Orders.

That the minimum value of the exhibitions shall be £30 per annum.

That the exhibition shall be tenable for three years.

That no application for a grant, loan, or other assistance, be entertained from any Rectory, Incumbency, or Mission, in which there shall not have been established a "Parochial Committee" of this Society under the provisions of the article of the Constitution thereof, reporting to and in communication with the Parent Society, and in which all the requirements of said Constitution shall not have been complied with, unless upon the omission of such requirement a special written dispensation shall have been obtained within three months of the date thereof; and further, that accompanying such application there be a distinct accurate description of the object towards which aid is sought, together with a detailed account of the sum of money collected in the locality or elsewhere towards the same object, and how applied: provided, nevertheless, that it shall be at all times competent for the President to recommend to the Standing Committee any oase which in his Lordship's opinion may require special consideration: and should the Standing Committee report favourably thereon, that the Society may in such case grant the assistance so sought, or any portion thereof; and further, that no application be entertained from the Widow or Orphan or the guardian of the Orphan of any deceased Clergyman of this Diocese who shall not have conformed to the provisions and requirements of a certain By-law, entitled a "By-law for the due administration and improving the Widows and Orphans' Fund of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto," and also of any amendments to the said By-Law, which may be enacted from time to time according to the provisions of the Constitution of the said Society, unless upon the omission of any of the said requiremen s a special written dispensation had been granted by his Lordship the President, and forwarded to the Secretary for registration within three months after the date thereof. Provided, nevertheless, that it shall be at all times competent for the President to recommend to the Standing Committee any case which in his Lordship's opinion may require special consideration, and should the Standing Committee report favourably thereon, that then the Society may grant such proportion of any annuity as the said Society may seem fit; and that it be the duty of the Secretary after each Annual Meeting of the Society, to notify to each Clergyman whether he have or have not complied with the requirements which would entitle his Widow and Orphans to a Pension.

XXI

That every Lay Delagate of the Synod of the Diocese shall be an incorporated member of the Church Society on the payment of the annual sum of five shillings, so long as he shall continue to be such delegate, and make such payment, notwithstanding any thing contained in clauses 2, 3, 4 and 5 of the constitution of said Society.

That any By-law that shall be passed by the Society relating to the Commutation or Ciergy Trust Fund, the Mission Fund, the or Widows and Orphans' Fund, or in any way affecting the charges on or management of those funds, or either of them, shall be laid before the Synod of the Diocese at the first meeting of the Synod next after such By-law shall have been passed, and if at such meeting of the Synod any resolution shall be agreed to disapproving of such By-law, either in the whole or in part, and setting forth the reasons for such disapproval, the operation of such By-law shall be suspended as soon as such resolutions and reasons are received by the Secretary of the Society, until the next quarterly meeting of the Society; and unless at such next quarterly meeting such by-law be sustained by the vote of two-thirds of the members present at such meeting, such By-law, or the part thereof so disapproved of, shall cease and be of no effect. Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall prevent the members at such last mentioned meeting altering or amending the said By-law in accordance with the resolutions or reasons that shall be transmitted by the Synod.

That the Secretary of the Society shall transmit copies of any such By-laws as in the second section mentioned to the Secretaries of the Synod as soon as the same are passed, with the view to the same being laid before the Executive Committee of the Synod, that a synopsis thereof may be stated with the other business prepared

for the Synod.

XXI

That the Charter and these By-laws do together form the Constitution of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, and that nothing which is contained in the Constitution of the Society established on the 28th day of April, 1842, or in any By-law, Rule or regulation, amending or altering the same, shall apply to, or be in force in respect to, the Incorporated Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, except such provisions thereof as are above continued in force.

TWENTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Incorporated Church Society of the Diocese of Coronto,

PRESENTED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING AT TORONTO, HELD ON WEDNESDAY, JUNE 10th, 1863.

"That the Almighty has been pleased to make the propagation of the Gospel dependent on the exertions of His church is more a matter of fact than of theory. The responsibility therefore incurred by any branch of the Church of Christ when the necessary work is either declined, or prosecuted in a languid spirit, is undoubtedly great. A positive and unqualified injunction remains on record both as a warning and as a guide, "Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." Nor can there be a more striking manifestation of the vitality of a church than sincere and persistent efforts to carry out this high commission to its fulfilment. Under this conviction your committee submit the 21st Annual Report of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, in the hope that a statement of its past operations and present labours may awaken a warmer interest than has hitherto been manifestation in the statement of the conviction was a submit the convention of the conventions.

fested in its prosperity.

"The Society's first and principal aim is the support and encouragement of Missions. Yet, with an uncertain income at the best, manifestly disproportionate to the objects it designs to accomplish, its missionary efforts necessarily vary in accordance with the increase or diminution of its funds. Even at the present moment all available means are almost exclusively absorbed in the maintenance of missionaries who have been labouring for several years under the auspices of the Society, while those subsequently appointed, from the inability of the Society to afford them a permanent provision, are obliged mainly to depend on such voluntary contributions of the people among whom they minister as they are disposed to make. Your committee are induced to mention these facts in order if possible to stimulate churchmen to a fuller recognition of their duty, and a more active zeal in performing it. A fresh impulse of missionary enterprise is much needed. The demand presses with equal earnestness on the clergy and laity of our communion, for the wants of the church are many, and painfully urgent; as those can testify . who in advocating the claims of the Society have been led to visit the new settlements in the northern parts of the diocese. There is enough of spiritual destitution to employ our largest liberality—enough of moral and religious barrenness to claim the fullest culture which our offerings can be made the means of supplying. And although the depression of the times consequent upon the scarcity of the harvest of the last year and the effect of the unhappy civil war still raging in the neighbouring country have affected to some extent the receipts of the Society, yet the pecuniary embarrassment produced by these causes can be only temporary. Should our Heavenly Father this season "give and preserve to our use the kindly fruits of the earth," (at present so promising,) and bestow upon our neighbours and ourselves the blesings of peace, may we not reasonably anticipate such an abundant harvest of good works and such oneness of purpose and action as will afford a cheering proof that the Author of all our blessings is better remembered and more duly honoured.

Before proceeding to the financial statement of the Society's affairs, the committee deem it due to those so recently called to assume the duties of the late lamented Secretary, to state that owing to his sudden removal they have experienced some inconvenience in arriving at a knowledge of its affairs, which, had he been living, would no doubt have been easily explained.

The annual subscriptions of incorporated members have been passed to the credit of general purpose fund. The clergymens' payment of such having been required in order to entitle their widows and orphans to the benefit of the fund, it would seem that moneys paid for such intent should be disposed of accordingly.

On reference to the general purpose fund, it will be found that there is a large amount in the shape of lands sold and leased belonging to it. It is of considerable moment that means be taken to realize all arrears due on account of rent and sales, and to make such a disposition of the lands unsold as may serve to produce a profitable investment. It is quite possible that this being done, the parochial branch collections might eventually be exclusively appropriated to the mission fund, which only receives three-fourths. This will be rendered the more practicable on account of the considerable reduction in the expenses of management.

The books of the Society shew since its formation a considerable outlay on account of trusts and endowments, much of which has been treated as an expenditure on account of the Society's funds—this calls for investigation and adjustment.

MISSION BOARD.

Convinced that a missionary spirit is the best evidence of the church's vitality, your committee are gratified to perceive that the desire to make the Society more missionary in its character is greatly on the increase. They are convinced that if suitable missionaries can be procured and adequately maintained, every other aim of the Society will be speedily accomplished.

To promote this important object the Mission Board was organized. And your committee deem it not out of place again to state its objects and commend them to

the zealous support of the members of the church generally.

They are, 1st, to support travelling missionaries altogether, giving them a stipend of \$600 per annum, and \$100 for an outfit. 2nd, to aid in making up the income of resident clergymen to \$600 per annum, contingent on the provision of \$400 and a residence being properly guaranteed by the missions. We would here remark, these are missions in which it would be impossible to maintain missionaries independent of this aid. 3rd, to receive and pay to the clergymen of settled missions the annual sum which has been promised for their support.

It is however the first and second of these objects which entitle the mission board to the name it has assumed and points out its duties, which are none other than sending the word of life to the needy and perishing members of our communion throughout the diocese. It is indeed the only missionary agency of the church, without which there would be no effectual means of supplying the spiritual wants of the remoter settlements by the labours of travelling missionaries. Nor should we have any means of taking part in the civilization and conversion of that poor people who have such a strong claim on our bounty—the Indians of this continent.

The board cannot accomplish these objects without means at its command; and

it is with much concern the committee have to report that there are at present several missionaries labouring in the field whose stipends are not permanently secured because the board has not the funds.

Your committee would therefore earnestly recommend that active measures be taken by the clergy and other friends of the mission cause to promote this desirable object. They are of opinion much more might be done than now is by a general arrangement among the clergy to plead the cause of the society in each other's parishes. By reports and communications in the Church Chronicle, which is published with a view to inform our members as to what has from time to time been accomplished by the board, what it is engaged in, and what cases of spiritual destitution demand their co-operation. Nothing is so likely to elicit interest in the Society's operations as the names of localities and details of their wants, represented by persons cognizant of the facts and known to the church. While a clear knowledge of the trifling amount required to relieve the wants of a particular locality might lead to very important results of christian charity. None are so competent to give information on these subjects as the clergy, and it is to be regretted that so little interest in this matter is shewn by many of them. Your committee would, however, here take occasion to remind those missionaries who are connected with the board that it is their stipulated duty to furnish these reports. But of all the means calculated to promote the object in view, none in the opinion of your committee is so well adapted as a well organized system of missionary and parochial meetings. They would urge on the district committees the necessity of making judicious arrangements for holding these meetings at such periods of the year as may be deemed best. In every neighbourhood where a sufficient number of our members and friends may be got together, and in order to incite an interest on the part of the people, and ensure the claims of the Society being brought home effectually to the minds of all, they recommend that the system of depulations be in all cases adopted.

Detailed statements of the labours of these missionaries will be published in the reports from the several districts, as well as interesting details of the progress of our Indian missions, satisfactory accounts having been received from them. It is hoped that before your committee is again called on to report, another and most important Indian mission, at the Sault St. Marie, will have been established.

THEOLOGICAL STUDENTS' FUND.

An important alteration was made a year or two since relating to this fund. It has hitherto been the custom to pay over to the Church Society the amount raised by the annual sermon for this fund, and this amount has been appropriated to eight scholarships tenable for two years, four being vacant every year—one of \$120, two of \$100, and one of \$80, the maintainance of these scholarships required an income of \$800, and the collections under the sermon did not always realize that average. It has been thought by many that the interest felt in this department of the Society's labours would be greatly increased if the nomination of the holders of these scholarships were transferred from the college authorities to the district committees of the Church Society.

The corporation of Trinity College has most readily acquiesced in the change, and it is proposed to provide in the different districts exhibitions of \$120 per annum tenable for three years, the exhibitioner being appointed in such way as the district branch may deem best. It is not expected that these exhibitions should be endowed, but it is obvious that the benefit resulting from them will be greatly impaired if

poor ent. and they cannot be regarded as permanent. In the instance of any individual exhibitioner, the payment for the three years should undoubtedly be guarranteed to him upon his nomination. Your committee would also suggest, whether a partial endowment of such exhibitions would not be a most useful exercise of christian charity, a sum of money devoted to this special object, and bringing in even \$40, would almost ensure the raising of the other \$80, and in many instances the nucleus thus formed would swell by repeated accumulations into a sum representing the principal of the whole exhibition.

The plan thus recommended in 1860 has been carried out but very partially. One exhibition has been provided for in the Ningara District, one in the Gore and Wellington District, one in the Home District, and one by the congregation of St. George's Church, Toronto, in response to a causual appeal by the Bishop to the

ladies of that congregation.

Seven students now in the arts course have signified their intention of entering the divinity course in October next, and of these four are unprovided with exhibitions. The very inadequate remuneration which our clergy receive renders a small assistance of this kind during the time of preparation of very great value. It may relieve a student from the necessity of absolutely exhausting his own slender resources; or it may prevent the more serious evil of his incurring a debt which, though of very small amount, he may find it very difficult, if not impossible, to re-pay.

It should also be remarked that the collections for the Students' Fund made in those districts which have provided no exhibition, are required to make provision for divinity students who have received no nomination, and that in districts where one or more exhibitions are established, any balance which may remain from the receipts for the year should be forwarded to the Secretary of the Church Society for the

same purpose.

WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

Repeated endeavours have been made to amend the by-law by which this fund has been administered, so us to meet more equitably the circumstances of the claimants on it, and last year an alteration having this object in view was adopted; but, on consideration, it was found that the income of the fund would not admit of it, the necessary steps have been taken to rescind it and to amend the original by-law so as to meet the exigency.

Your committee regret to report that during the year two applications for pensions have been made. In one case, the requirements of the society not having been complied with, a diminished pension was granted, on the special recommendation of the Bishop; in the other, the full amount accorded by the amended by-law has been claimed and allowed.

PARENT SOCIETIES.

Under a deep sense of the benefits conferred on the church in Canada by the venerable Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, and for Promoting Christian Knowledge, your committee have gratefully to record further proofs of their love and interest in our welfare.

The Society for the Propagation of the Gospel has responded to the appeal of the Bishop, in behalf of the proposed Indian mission at Sault St. Marie, by an annual

grant of £80 stg., while the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, in addition to its valuable grants of service books, and contributions to churches in course of erection, recently made us a donation of Bibles and Testaments to the value of £50 stg., towards a depository for this diocese.

DIOCESAN SOCIETIES.

From the reports of the Church Societies and Synods of the neighbouring Dioceses of Nova Scotia, Quebec, Newfoundland, Montreal, Huron, and Ontario, we are gratified to receive assurances of their continued prosperity.

In common with every portion of the original Sec of Quebec, this society has not failed to convey to the sister society of that diocese, its deep condolence on the loss of its venerable founder, the late truly excellent Dr. Mountain, and have recorded its "sense of the great value of the services rendered to the church in Canada by that distinguished prelate, during his long and laborious career, as well as the character of deep and gentle piety by which, through life, he was distinguished."

The recent election by the unanimous choice of a presbyter of that diocese, as his successor, is a matter of sincere congratulation.

"It has been customary in presenting the annual report of the society, which is designed for general circulation, briefly to review the leading events bearing on the church's progress during the year. In doing so, it is cheering to perceive how rapidly "the field of the church's operations is becoming the whole world."

"Among the more important and interesting events in the history of the mother church during the past year may be mentioned the arrival of the Bishop of Honoluld in his diocese; shortly after which the king and queen of Hawaii give a striking proof of their interest in his mission, and of their value of the privileges of an apostolic church, by publicly presenting themselves as candidates for the rite of confirmation. The death of their youthful son which occurred shortly before the Bishop's arrival, frustrated the long cherished intention of his parents that he should receive baptism at the hands of the Bishop.

"The mournful loss of Bishop MacKenzie has been supplied by the consecration of Bishop Tozer to the mission on the Zambesi, in central Africa: and there is every prospect of the successful prosecution of the work there begun; while in south Africa another missionary bishopric has been established on the Orange River Free State, to which the Rev. J. Twells has been appointed.

"In Auckland the metopolitan diocese of Sidney has been divided by the erection of the see of Goulburn.

"While our church, however, has been thus extending her limits, or more fally occupying ground which she had already acquired, she has been subjected to the pain and disgrace of witnessing, in the instance of one of her colonial bishops, the promulgation of opinions ultimately subversive of all belief in revealed religion. So grievous a departure from the right way is deeply to be deplored, not only on account of the eminent position occupied by him who has gone astray, but also on account of the discredit which it reflects on our communion, in the eyes of other bodies of professed Christians; and, perhaps, most of all for the sake of those recent converts to the Christian name, who have been taught by their chief pastor, on the very threshold of the temple of God, to doubt or disallow the foundation on which the temple rests.

"We may, however, trust that this evil will be over-ruled for ultimate good; we

may be thankful that the crude speculations and rash conclusions of the Bishop of Natal have been received with so little sympathy; with so general disfavour and repugnance; we may hope that many will be stimulated thereby, to examine well the grounds of their belief, and above all, that men may learn from the instance of one, whom they must deeply pity, while they no less deeply condemn his opinions in what spirit it becomes us to investigate any record, which claims, with the cumulative evidence borne to the books of the Old Testament, to be a revelation from God to man; and how surely they must err, who enter on such an investigation in forgetfulness of the words and of the mind of Him who said: 'I thank thee, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that Thou hast hid these things from the wise and prudent and has revealed them unto babes; even so, Father, for so it seemed good in Thy sight.'

"It was a beautiful custom of the early church at their solemn assemblages to rehearse the names of those who having been eminent for their good deeds in life. had departed in the true faith. On this occasion it devolves on your committee, in imitation of this pious practice, to record the loss of an unusual number of valued members, both clerical and lay. Daring the year not less than five of those Included last year in the list of vice-presidents have been called away. The Venerable G. O. Stuart, Dean of Ontario, Justus Merwin, of Prescott, D. B. O. Ford, of Brockville, and Sir John Beverley Robinson. Bart., a name honoured and beloved whenever it was known. In his immented death the church has lost one of her most exemplary and consi-tent members. This society an able, steadfast, and unwavering friend, and the province at large one of its most honoured and distinguished sons. Of him, it has been well said: He was a sincere and earnest christian, not merely in the sense of a devout worshipper, but as one who felt through life it a duty to exert his best faculties for the support and extension of that 'pure and reformed faith,' held and taught by the church of which he was a member.

Your committee desire to place on record the deep and lasting obligations this society is under to him for his invaluable services and odlifying example. His views on its establishment are best expressed in his own words, which we commend to the

consideration of all the members of our communion.

"What I contemplate is the promoting the support of the Church of England in a spirit and by mensures which shall be wholly unexceptionable, giving no just cause of offence or joulousy to any, but with a constancy and fidelity which shall not abate in the sightest degree, from an apprehension of what persons who chose to act in an unchristian or unreasonable spirit may think or say or do."

To him chiefly are we indebted for the constitution of our society, and to the

day of his death he manifested the livelest interest in its prosperity.

Your committee have to add to the record of losses during the bygone year three of the clergy of this diocese.

The Rev. E. H. Dewar, M.A., Rector of Thornhill, a zealous and talented member of the Standing Committee.

The Rev. Thomas Smith Kennedy, for upwards of ten years the society's active energetic, and indefatigable secretary, whose carnest advecacy of the claims of the society throughout the original Diocese of Toronto will long be remembered, while his kindness of heart, and readiness to do good and oblige, will cause his memory to be cherished with affection and regret by all who knew him.

And lastly, we are called on to mourn the death of one of the oldest clergy of the diocese, and a zealous supporter of this society from its formation, the Rev. W. Leeming.

This excellent man came to Canada in 1819, as one of the missionaries of the

ve he ile to Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, and was stationed at Chippawa, but his ministrations extended over a wide sphere, embracing the towns and villages of Chippawa, Fort Eric, St. Catharines, Thorold, and Stamford, maintaining them till relieved by the appointment of missionaries, when his labours were confined to his late charge.

This humble and faithful servant of his divine master closed a long and useful life by a holy and happy death. Blessed with a vigorous constitution, he was enabled to attend to the last to the calls of his charge with diligence and regularity. On the Wednesday preceding his death, he met his class of candidates for confirmation, having walked that day to and from the church, a distance of several miles, for that purpose. One Sunday only was he absent from his public ministrations.

A neighbouring brother, also an early missionary of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, long his intimate friend, writes of him: "Implicitly acknowleging the truth of christianity in general, he was devotedly attached to the Church of which he was a member, regarding her articles as a form of sound doctrine, her ministry as the appointment of God, and her worship as the purest and most acceptable sacrifice which could be rendered unto Ilim.

"His faith, however, was not merely of a speculative kind, but a practical and efficient principle, influencing his heart, governing his conduct, regulating his intercourse with mankind, and abounding in the peaceable fruits of righteousness." At the advanced age of 77 years he died as he had lived, beloved by all who knew him, at peace with his fellow men, and in the divine favour. His last words, in surrendering his soul into the hands of a faithful Creator, and most merciful Saviour, were the third petition of the Lord's prayer, "Thy will be done on earth, as it is in heaven."

The first bequest in the will of our lamented brother was a thousand pounds to the Church Society of this Diocese.

In conclusion, your committee would remark that they believe the constitution of the Church Society one admirably calculated to subserve the end for which it was devised by its eminent, able, and lamented author, and only requires faithful and efficient services on the part of the office-bearers, and zealous co-operation on the part of the members, to render it what it is indirectly designed to be, the most efficient instrument, under God, for sustaining and extending His church in the dionese.

Let the work then in which we are engaged be performed in faith and hope, remembering that the church in Canada must look more to the free-will offerings of her children for temporal support, and let there be fostered amongst us an increasing spirit of charity, based on true christian principles, and therefore seasoned with self denial and humility, considering always that we are servants and disciples of Him who said "it is more blessed to give than to receive."

EXTRACTS FROM DISTRICT AND PAROCHIAL REPORTS.

GORE AND WELLINGTON BRANCH OF THE CHURCH SOCIETY.

REPORT OF THE MANAGING COMMITTEE.

The Managing Committee of the Gore and Wellington Branch of the Church Society, appears at the expiration of another year before the members of the association to make their customary report, and to furnish such information respecting its operations during the past twelve months, as may serve to show whether it is answering the purpose for which it was formed, and whether the funds collected and entrusted to its management have been profitably and judiciously laid out.

The holding of the annual meeting at Guelph this year was decided upon by the committee, to whom the entire arrangements were left, for two reasons, which seemed to them sufficient to justify the change. 1st. Because Guelph had, for several years, taken the lead as the largest contributor to the funds of the association, and, 2nd, because the public meeting appeared to be regarded with greater interest, and to be more numerously attended in Guelph than in Hamilton.

The committee trust that the present deviation from the usual practice may not be unproductive of beneficial results.

It may be well, before entering upon the details of our own more immediate locality, to take a glance at the position of the Parent Society, as exhibited in its last annual report, from which it will be seen that there is every reason for thankfulness and encouragement. It is true that the total receipts fell short by \$400 of those of the previous year, but it must be recollected that in the interval the severance of the Diocese of Ontario had taken place. This diocese comprises 47 parishes, 36 of whom used to contribute regularly to the funds of the parent society, their contributions amounting annually to about \$1370, besides their quarterly collections in churches. The deficiency, therefore, was exceedingly small, when this fact is kept in view. It is, moreover, highly satisfactory to observe that the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, after being shorn of the Diocese of Huron on the west, and the Diocese of Ontario on the east, exhibits an income larger than the whole undivided diocese furnished for years prior to the severance of the Diocese of Huron.

This income may be set down in round numbers at about \$20,000. With this we find 37 missionaries maintained in whole or in part, at au outlay of \$12,735. Nine widows and four orphans are receiving annually \$2,180, while the investments for that fund appear to have reached the amount of \$39,588. The quarterly collections, 831 in number, amounted to \$4,754; of this \$1,041 was collected for the divinity students, a sum sufficient to establish eight exhibitions in Trinity College, of the annual value of £30.

In reference to this subject your Committee are happy to state that, during the past year, they have acted upon the proposal that districts providing exhibitions in Trinity College should have the privilege of nominating exhibitioners. A special meeting was called for the purpose in May last, when, in the absence of any candi-

date resident in the district, the committee elected, from three applicants, all of whom were students in Arts of Trinity College, and came well recommended, Mr. Archibald George Lister Trew, a young gentleman of promising talents, unexceptionable character, and great industry and application. The committee entertain the hope that the collections which are to maintain the exhibition for a period of three years will be found to increase, and that the congregations to whom the appeal may be made, will bear in mind that they have adopted a student in divinity, as their own peculiar charge, and are bound to provide for his continuance at college till his studies for the misistry are completed.

The great value and importance of the Church Society consist in this, that it is the chief, and indeed we may say the only missionary agency of the church, that without it we should have no means of supplying the wants of the remoter settlements by the labours of travelling missionaries, and should have nothing to bestow upon the conversion and civilization of the Indians.

in ial diThere are no public endowments from which these objects could be sustained, and there is no other organized machinery for combined and systematic exertion. Under these circumstances it must be a matter of regret that any clergyman, or any congregation, should regard the claims of the Church Society with feelings of apathy or indifference, and much more that other societies, having feebler claims, should be fostered and commended with greater alacrity and zeal. Your committee are of opinion that parochial meetings efficiently carried out, tend more than any other means to increase the friends and supporters of the society.

A striking instance of the benefit resulting from parochial meetings, well and vigorously conducted, is to be seen in the Simcoe District, when in four years the annual collections have increased from \$400 to \$1,600.

The operations of the Gore and Wellington Branch continue to be absorbed, in a great measure, with supplying travelling missionaries to the more distant missions, or in aiding resident missionaries in new missions. Five missionaries have been maintained during the past year, who have laboured in the same missions as heretofore. Your committee will append to this report extracts from reports of their labours sent in by the missionaries. The only change which has occurred, is the removal of the Rev. Mr. Drinkwater, who has resigned his mission, and accepted the charge of St. Thomas' Church, Hamilton, to which he has been licensed by the Bishop.

The liability of the Gore and Wellington Branch to the Mission Board, through which the stipends of the missionaries are paid, is no less a sum than \$3,000. Of this, about \$1,200 are guaranteed by the people among whom they labour. These payments have, in a few instances, been fully and punctually made; in several, however, there has been some remissness, and in October last a deficiency of \$257 was reported by the mission board. The parties in arrears have been notified that unless they fulfil their obligations the missions will have to be discontinued, and the missionaries withdrawn, a result which they would greatly deplore. There are 32 parochial associations combined under the Gore and Wellington Branch, from all of which reports have been received, as the following list will shew:

Real deficiency..... Since the last annual meeting, the society has sustained several losses by death among its old and valued members. The church at large has had to deplore the death of one of her chief pastors, the excellent Bishop of Quebec, who has recently gone to his rest full of years and full of honours. For twenty-seven years that venerable and distinguished prelate discharged the duties of his high office with singular devotedness and zeal. His diocese extended, at one time, from the almost inaccessable coasts of Labrador, to the Red River settlements in the far north-west. The parish in which we are assembled witnessed his episcopal ministrations in the consecration of its first church edifice, and the confirmation of a goodly number of its youthful members. A tribute to his memory, then, will not be out of place. He was a man of meek and saintly character, and, as such, was universally honoured and beloved. He was a learned theologian, an elegant classical scholar, an able writer, an elequent preacher, and an accomplished gentleman. His death has left a chasm in the Canadian church which cannot be easily filled. Your committee feel assured that all will unite in the prayer that the minds and hearts of the clergy and laity upon whom devolves the responsible duty of electing his successor, may be so governed and guided by the Holy Spirit, that they may make choice of a fit person to assume the momentous charge, and that the mantle of the departed bishop may descend upon his shoulders.

Three Vice-Presidents of the Society have been summoned to their account during the last year. Among them stands the prominent and conspicuous name of Sir John Beverley Robinson, a name known and revered from one end of the province to the other. In his lamented death the church has been bereft of one of her most exem-

plary and consistent members, the Church Society of an able, steadfast, and unwavering friend, and the province at large of one of its most honoured and distinguished sons. He took an active part in the first formation of this society, and to the day of his death he manifested a deep interest in its prosperity.

The society has also had to lament the death of its active, energetic, and indefatigable secretary, the late Rev. T. S. Kennedy, whose forcible appeals on occasions like the present are still fresh in the memory of most of our congregations, and whose kindness of heart, and readiness to oblige, had endeared him to many, especially among his brethren of the clergy. These solemn events should be regarded by those who survive as calls to greater earnestness and zeal in doing whatever our hands findeth to do, seeing that there is no wisdom, nor knowledge, nor device in the grave, whither we are going. Amid these melancholy reflections, it is cheering and consolatory to turn our thoughts to the mother country, and contemplate the wonderful activity which pervades the great religious societies, and the gigantic efforts which she is making, now that she has walked up to a full sense of her responsibility as a keeper and witness of Holy Writ, and an honoured instrument in the hand of God for evangelizing the world. To whatever quarter of the globe we look, we see her spreading far and wide the glad tidings of salvation.

The occasional clouds that flit over her firmament cast but a temporary shadow. She issues forth from behind them in brighter effulgence than ever, "fair as the morn, clear as the sun, and terrible as an army of banners,"

The committee have much satisfaction in announcing to the friends of the Church Society that in making new arrangements for the duties of secretary, due regard has been had to wise economy, and that a considerable reduction has been made in the expenses of management. The separation of the Diocese of Ontario, and the division of the funds, lands, stocks, &c., have, of course, left less work for the secretary to do, and this has helped to create a saving in necessary expenses of fully £400 per annum.

Your committee would, therefore, confidently recommend the Church Society of the diocese to the active exertions, the liberal contributions, and the unceasing prayers of all true-hearted and faithful members of the church.

REPORT OF THE NEWCASTLE DISTRICT BRANCH OF THE CHURCH SOCIETY.

By the good providence of God we are permitted to celebrate another anniversary of our District Branch of the Church Society. Although nothing has transpired within our local organization during the past year requiring particular notice, events have occurred in the parent association which have resulted in some important modifications affecting the general management of the Society. The Almighty in his wisdom having been pleased to remove from the sphere of his earthly labours the late zealous and energetic Secretary, the Rev. T. S. Kennedy, it became necessary to proceed at once to the election of a successor; and the opportunity was then taken to carry out a very generally expressed desire on the part of the members of the Society to elect a layman to that office, and at the same time make such retrenchments in the working expenses of the institution as would bring them within a fair

proportion to its income. Accordingly, when a special meeting was convened by his lordship the President, on the 12th of February last, J. W. Brent, Esq., was chosen Secretary; and as our venerable Diocesan had made known his desire to have a clerical Secretary as well, with whom he might confer on matters with which a layman might be supposed not to be so conversant, the Rev. Saltern Givins, Rural Dean, and one of his Lordship's chaplains, was also appointed Honorary Secretary. There are now no other head officials in connection with the Society. On these two gentlemen devolve the responsibility of its management; and from their known ability and integrity of purpose every reasonable assurance is afforded that the duties pertaining to their respective offices will be faithfully and efficiently discharged. By these arrangements, together with some minor changes, a saving will accrue to the Society of nearly £400 per annum. It is believed that all expenses have now been reduced as far as they can be, with safety to the interests of the Society, and a due regard to the trustworthiness and efficiency of its officers. Henceforward no disproportion will be apparent between the income and expenditure, as the strictest economy consistent with the proper administration of its affairs wil. be persistently maintained.

Turning to our own District Association, the most interesting feature in its operations, the missionary work being done within its bounds, first claims our notice.

Notwithstanding many obstacles in the way, the Rev. John Wood, the travelling missionary for the county of Northumberland, is steadily carrying on to its fulfilment the promise, made in his report, read at the last meeting, of building four churches in his mission. Two are now completed, and have already been opened for the celebration of divine service; one, a very church-like and commodious building, in the village of Brighton, the other, an equally neat structure, in the township of Alnwick. A third, in the village of Castleton, is nearly finished, and will soon be opened; the fourth, in the township of Murray, is in course of erection. Great praise must be awarded to that gentleman for the energetic manner in which he is prosecuting his missionary efforts; and while they reflect credit on his own zeal, let us hope they are also properly appreciated by the people over whose spiritual welfare he has been appointed to watch. We, too, satisfied by such results, that the work in which we are engaged is prospering in our own neighbourhood, as well as in the more remote portions of the diocese, should be encouraged to help it forward with increasing earnestness.

The Rev. R. S. Birtch, the missionary in the county of Durham, resides at Perrytown, and continues to serve that place, together with three or four out stations in its vicinity.

At a meeting of the district committee, in the month of December last, it was deemed advisable to adopt the system of deputation, in order to ensure a proper advocacy of the claims of the Society at the various parochial meetings. Two deputations were consequently appointed, one for the eastern and the other for the western portion of the district. The former began its visitation on Monday, the 26th January, and during the week addressed meetings in Grafton, Colborne, Seymour, Norwood, Peterboro', Lakefield and Cavan. The latter, at the beginning of the following week, continued the work, and visited Millbrook, Omemee, Lindsay, Newcastle, Enniskillen, Cartwright, Bowmanville and Port Hope. In almost every place, when the weather proved propitious, the deputations were met by large and attentive audiences.

Up to the present time reports have been received from only a few of the parochial

committees. The delay, however, it is believed, will be found to have arisen from unforeseen difficulties having prevented the collection lists from being completed. In Some places, it is known, sickness prevailed of a character which rendered it unsafe to go from house to house to solicit subscriptions; in other places the scarcity of money occasioned by deficiency of the crops has impeded the progress of the collectors by making the ingathering of the offerings of the people a work involving more labour than usual. It is hoped, nevertheless, judging from the returns already made, that the aggregate amount, when transmitted, will be found almost if not quite equal to the contributions of former years. Should this surmise prove cerrect, your committee conceive there will be good reason to assume it as a ground of congratulation. For, considering the adverse circumstances under which the province is suffering, not only from a less bountiful harvest than usual, but also from the depression in several important branches of trade consequent on the unnatural and disastrous war now raging in a neighbouring country, a corresponding diminution in the funds of the Society might reasonably be expected. And even if this unfortunately should happen to be the case, the deficiency most likely will not be sufficient to cause any permanent embarrassment. Viewing it merely as a temporary discouragement, we may hope that this year, by the orderings of a kind providence, the earth may again bring forth her increase bountifully, and wars be made to cease, so that our garners being filled with all manner of store, and peace being restored beyond our borders, a larger thank offering will be required at our hands in acknowledgment of the manifold gifts of God.

Your committee have to regret the loss the Travelling Mission has sustained in the removal of the late missionary, the Rev. J. Stannage, in Feb. last, to the Diocese of Ontario. While he was our missionary for more than five years, the work prospered in his hands. He unflinchingly, and at the same time with great charity. preached "Christ and His Church," and desired not to know any thing among the people committed to his charge, save, "Jesus Christ and Him crucified," while engaged in the all important duty of winning souls to Christ, he felt compelled for the future benefit of the church, and of those to whom he was ministering "the bread of life," to endeavour to obtain a permanent endowment for the mission as well as to secure a Parsonage at the principal station, as a residence for the Missionary. In this last, as will be seen in his accompanying report, he has happily succeeded Your committee think it not out of place or irrevalent to the matter in hand, to institute a comparison between the relative increase of the members of the principal Christian bodies, as we have them in the census returns now in the hands of the Government. The townships of Humberstone, Crowland, Wainfleet and Pelham, comprise the sphere of the labours of our missionary for the past five years. The census was taken in 1861-62.

Rev and Dear Sir,

You will doubtless remember that I wrote to you from England last year, requesing the committee of the Niagara District Branch of the Church Society, to vote me another year's salary, as their missionary at Welland, with a view to retain the services of the Rev. D. MacLeod for another year as my substitute, or until I would locate myself in a more healthy mission. The committee were so kind as to vote me another year's salary accordingly, and Mr. MacLeod has continued his work as my assistant and substitute at Welland, Marshville and Fonthill, with much acceptance. You are aware that I returned from England in August last, whither I had gone for my health, but chiefly with a view to provide funds to secure the house for ever, and to recover some glebes. I was disappointed with respect to the glebes, but, I have to thank God and my kind friends for having procured a sufficient sum to enable me (though not without great loss) to make over the said house and lot to the Church Society, in trust for ever. I took care to explain to those who helped me in the mother country, how that my object was to re-imburse myself for what I

house house lebes, t sum lot to relped had laid out on said property or portion of it, so as to remove my family to a more healthy part of Canada, and in doing so, I felt quite sure that it would be a benefit to the mission as well as to myself. Since my return from England, I continued living at St. Catharines, and visiting the mission from time to time, and at the same time seeking another, as I found it absolutely necessary that I should comply with my medical adviser's wishes; I have therefore decided to accept the mission of North Augusta with Elizabethtown. 1 wrete to Lord Bishop of Toronto, to inform him ef my decision; and in consideration of my many hopes and disappointments, requested to be allowed to retain the proceeds of the Crown land glebes until May, or until the end of the current half-year. I also requested his Lordship to inform me whether I should make over the leases to Mr. MacLeod, as my successor. His Lordship acceded to my request. I would now beg leave to say that I am about to resign the leases of the Crown land glebes, into Mr. MacLeod's hands at the end of the present half year, if the Bishop permits me to do so. But the rents do not become due all at the same time. One is from March 21st; one from April 1st; one from May 1st; one from May 7th; one from May 19th; and one from July 1st; the whole comes to \$386 per annum, including the rent from the parsonage. Until this is done, I have to request the committee to let Mr. MacLeod continue his services at the present rate, upon my promise, that the society shall have the benefit of the glebes, from the day on which each half-year's rent becomes due, except the rent of the parsonage, which I should like Mr. MacLeod to enjoy from the 21st of this present month. So soon as the leases are endorsed, I will inform you. It would have given me great delight if the church at Marshville could have been completed before my leaving, but several unavoidable delays about the deed of the land occurred. Happily the bricks and stone are on the spot, and paid for; the foundations are dug by the free labour of the people; and I hope soon to send you another \$100 in addition to the \$400 you have already received from me for that object, so that I trust the sacred edifice will not be long unfinished. In taking leave of the mission of Merrittsville, now Welland, and parts adjacent, I cannot say that I did not regret, deeply and heartily, leaving the many kind friends, who often showed me kindness during my labours among them. Neither can I ever forget the great, and indulgent kindness, which I always received at the hands of the committee, but more especially from yourself, Rev. and dear Sir, and from your excellent chairman. To break such a connexion was not, believe me, an easy thing The work of the church of God, which is no other than that of the Glorious Gospel of Christ, was, I verily believe, rightly begun in that mission, and your committee sustained me well throughout my own share of the work. And that (in spite of the troubles which commercial depressions, and my own difficulties caused) two churches have been finished and well fitted, and a third nearly so, and a parsonage house provided, where there was not one single church or parochial building when I took charge of the mission in 1857, are I trust good preefs that I was not quite idle, though often sick, and that a good and merciful God has helped my poor endeavours. A great part of the funds came from some very dear missionary friends of mine at home. It should not be forgetten that Mr. MacLeod has kept up the good work very zealously, and that to him and Mr. Willett under God, is chiefly due, the erection of the pretty little church at Fonthill. I repeat it again, nothing but my health and that of my family, could induce me to leave a field of se much promise, and at such sacrifices. I pray God to continue His abundant blessing upon that mission. I pray that I may one day have the happiness of meeting all the people to whom I ministered the word of life, and especially the dear children whom I so often catechized, at table in the kingdom of God, never more to separate.

The parish of Dunville reports, that the sum which they had raised this year, including the clergyman's five dollars, is only \$62 00. Various causes might be assigned as accounting for our not collecting as much as was contributed last winter in this parish. One of them is, the people were solicited at the same time to give to the Lancashire relief fund. And another is that dissenters entice from

our people in several ways more than they are willing to give to the Missionary work in that branch of the church which they profess to believe is the most spiritual.

Chippawa reports, \$157 00.

Port Robinson in the parish of Thorold, \$43 75.

St. Catharines reports, \$221. 12.

Port Dalhousie—The Parish of Louth reports the sum of \$32 00, Drummon dville and Stamford, \$60 71.

Notwithstanding the many discouragements, your committee cannot but look upon the returns as on the whole satisfactory, at the same time they would ask to be permitted to express an earnest hope, that year by year we may more and more feel the weighty responsibility dwelling upon us. Your committee believe that a far more liberal response to the calls made upon us by our spiritually destitute brethren, than has heretofore been the case, is not only necessary if we would see "the wilderness blossom as the rose," but it is absolutely required of every haptized member of Christ's church who seeks his own salvation. Your committee met at Welland in January last and adopted a Mr. Bond, a student now studying at Toronto for holy orders, as their exhibitioner at Trinity College, promising him \$120, which they felt would be raised by the quarterly collections made in our various parishes in the month of April. Your committee, in conclusion, would call upon all the members of the church, within the bounds of this District Branch Association, earnestly to pray that God in His mercy, would direct and rule all their words and works, and enable them to spread the knowledge of a crucified and risen Saviour while seeking His glory and the salvation of His people.

HOME DISTRICT.

The income of a society whose resources are derived entirely from voluntary contributions, and not from fixed endowments or rentals, must necessarily be subject to fluctuation, according to the ability and willingness of those who contribute to its support. People's means may not always be the same—their disposition to give may not be the same at all times. Neither is the income of the Church Society derived in any great degree from persons in the enjoyment of fixed incomes, whose contributions might be always a certain annual sum; but it is supplied, for the most part, by an agricultural people whose means must vary from year to year according to the more or less abundant returns of the fruits of the earth. Even the tithe appointed as the ancient provision for the Church of God, and which conveys an idea of something settled and determined, was only a fixed proportion, not a fixed quantity.

Premising this, your committee, though they may regret, cannot feel any surprise that the collections of the Home District, taken as a whole, have fallen short, by a small sum, of those of the previous year; the total amount for this year being \$1787; that for the preceding year, \$1879; the decrease being \$90, omitting cents. It is well knewn that the harvest of last year was considerably below the average yield; and it is rather a matter for thankfulness, that the serious diminution thus caused in the resources of a people mainly dependent upon agriculture, has had so little effect upon their religious offering. It is somewhat remarkable, and your committee feel perfectly justified in noticing the fact, that the falling off has not been among those by whom the pressure of a diminished harvest might be expected to be chiefly felt; for in comparing the amounts collected in the city and in the rural parishes, it is found that in 1862 the collections in Toronto amounted to \$650, those in the rural parishes to \$1229. In 1863, the city contributes \$460, the country \$1829. The collections in Toronto, therefore, are \$190 less this year than in the year before, while those in the country are \$100 more. With reference, however, to Toronto, there is an improvement in the number of parishes contributing through their parochial associations to the District Fund. While St. James' and Thaity Church still stand aloof from the general system of the Society, collections have been sent in from St. George's, St. Paul's, and St. John's, as hitherto, and also from St. Stephen's and the Church of the Holy Trinity, whose names did not appear in last year's list. It is hoped that next year the funds of the society will be augmented by parochial associations in connection with the newly formed congregations of St. Anne's, Brockton, and of the Cemetery Chapel, now under the charge respectively of the Rev. J. Hilton, M. A., and the Rev. S. Boddy, M. A.

Of the returns from twenty-four rural parochial branches, sixteen show an increase in their collections, and eight a diminution: the former are marked by an

asterisk in the list appended.

Since the report of last year was drawn up, your committee have the painful duty of recording the death of three of the clergy of their district, recently their fellow-labourers in the cause of the society, namely, the Rev. T. S. Keunedy, the Rev. E. H. Dewar, and the Rev. R. G. Cox, the death of the last named, not at the time in any parochial charge, having been caused by a fearful accident while returning to Brampton by railway from the Synod. The vacancies thus caused have been filled up by the appointment of the Rev. H. Plowman, B.A., to the incumbency of St. John's, Toronto, and of the Rev. R. Shanklin to the rectory of Thornhill. The Rev. C. S. Haines, formerly of Southampton in the Diocese of Huron, has been appointed to Streetsville, and it is gratifying to be able to add that his parishioners have shewn both their appreciation of his services and their sense of their own duty, by providing a comfortable parsonage with five acres of land attached. The esteemed incumbent of Aurora, also, has been placed in occupation of a handsome and commodious parsonage, erected during the past year.

The parochial meetings held during the late winter, were on the whole very well attended; and your committee will conclude with the expression of their opinion, that it is to a well organized system of public meetings in all the churches and stations of the diocese, that the Society must look next to Divine Providence, for the continuance of a friendly interest and substantial support on the part of the members

of the Church.

REPORT OF THE COUNTY SIMCOE DISTRICT BRANCH, 1863.

Your committee rejoice in being enabled to repeat the cheering report of success which they made last year; and at the same time, they would give all the praise to Him who has graciously afforded that success, for viewing all matters connected with the state of our church in this county, we see happy evidences of prosperity and cause for gratitude.

Since our last annual meeting, two clergymen have been added to our staff, one in Mulmur, and another in Creemore, and the work in each of these missions is now steadily progressing. Our finances will also bear favourable comparison with the past year, when we take into consideration the fact that many have suffered serious loss from the shortness of the crops, which has caused the collections to be less from some localities, while others have increased their amounts, thus on the whole we have cause here for congratulation; your committee have, however, learned that another cause may be assigned for the falling off in the amount sent in, (in addition to the shortness of the crops,) and that is, the closing of several places of worship to the North of Barrie; those churches were under the charge of the Rev. W. M. Ross, as travelling missionary until last fall, when he resigned that charge to enter on another elsewhere, and the Bishop has not yet been enabled to send a clergyman to supply his place, but has promised to do so, as soon as he can obtain one.

Your committee cannot here refrain from an expression of regret at noticing the small amounts which are sent in from most of the missions at the four quarterly collections, it is not easy to say which of these collections is most needed; when, however, we are are aware of the great paucity of ministers, and are equally aware that the expense attending the preparation necessary for entering the ministry in our church, deters many from devoting themselves to that work, is it not earnestly to be desired that the members of our church would do a little more towards making the stipend fund what it was intended to be,

a help to any plous young man who is ready and willing to devote himself to the ministry, but is unable to raise the whole amount requisite for a collegiate course; many there are who from this cause leave our ranks. Your committee trust that this matter will occupy the attention of the clergy and lay delegates at the approaching Synod.

The missionary meetings took place in the month of January, occupying three weeks; twenty-two places were visited; every where the deputations were cordially welcomed by large and attentive audiences, and in many places, lay members of the various congregations came forward and in able and effective addresses pointed out to their lay brethren, that it is their duty and privilege to aid their ministers in promoting the interests of the church, and spreading abroad through her instrumentality the glad tidings of salvation. The Rev. F. L. Osler, from Dundas, accompanied one of the deputations to the stations of Christ Church, Essa, Cookstown, St. John's, West Essa, Mulmur, Orangeville and Bradford, at St. Luke's, Mulmur. The deputation had the pleasure also of meeting with his honour, Judge Gowan, who had been holding his court in that neighbourhood during the day, and who most kindly assisted them at the meeting in the evening, addressing the audience specially and clearly on the duties and privileges of the members of our church.

The deputations in going their rounds were highly gratified (and your committee participate in the feeling,) at the progress manifest in providing places of worship. On the 19th lot of the 8th con., Essa,* a neat and commodious church has been just erected and completely finished, capable of holding 250 persons, the building is admitted to be most creditable to the congregation, and equally so to the contractors and builders, Messrs. John and Robert Fletcher, members of the congregation. A church raised in 1853, (but left unfinished from that time,) on the 17th lot, 11th con., Essa, is to be purchased during the summer. The church of Cookstown is also to be enlarged, so as to hold double the number of persons, this step being rendered necessary by the rapidly increasing congregation of that place; arrangements have been already made with the tradesmen for the accomplishment of the work in both these churches.

At Nottawasaga also, active measures are being taken for the immediate erection of a church on the 2nd lot of the 1st concession, E. A. Walker, Esq., of Barrie, having kindly given two acres of land for a site for the church and burial ground, and we can add that two-thirds of the supposed cost have been already subscribed. In Barrie also, a committee appointed by the vestry, are actively engaged in obtaining subscriptions for the erection of a church there, capable of accommodating the increasing church population, as well as suited in appearance to the locality. His honour, Judge Gowan, having headed the list with a handsome donation, his laudable example has been followed by several leading members of the congregation, who hopefully look forward to the accomplishment of this object of their desire.

Your committee earnestly hope that throughout our country our congregations will evince a holy emulation and zeal, in enabling the Venerable President of the parent society to send forth ministers to every vacant mission, and to increase the number when he sees it necessary in such places as are now partially supplied. They beg to submit the treasurer's account for the year ending April 30th, 1863.

It gives me great pleasure to sit down to write to you, and to give you some information about this mission. God continues to bless my work; for this I render him hearty thanks.

The Indians of this place have attended church very regularly. They attend the English service as well as their own. For their benefit I read in their own language a chapter out of the Bible, which I afterwards explain in a few words, and a few prayers, whenever we have English service. I have often wondered how patiently and quietly they listened in church, although the greater part of the service was read in a language of which they know very little. Their conduct has pleased me greatly. They were in their sugar-bushes lately. Some of these are three miles from this place, and some seven or eight miles; yet the people come to church as usual; and they do not attend the Sunday services alone, they also attend service on such days as Christmas, New Years' Day, the Epithany, Ash Wednesday, &c.

I would in this letter thank the Church Society for their kind offer to support a schoolmaster and catechist for the Little Current. Mr. John Burkitt of Orilia, who was appointed for the work required, could not come up last fail, on account of his wife's serious illness. In his letter which he wrote to me lately, he mentions that he will be at the Little Current this month.

The Superintendent General of Indian affairs and the Deputy Superintendent General, came here last fall and held a council with the Indians who live on this Island. All that part of the Island west of Heywood Sound and Manitoulin Gulf, was ceded to the Government. The Indians are to be paid for the land which they have surrendered, and which will be sold to white settlers; each head of a family Many of the Roman Catholic Indians is also to get 100 acres of land and a deed. who came to the council attended our church when divine service was held in it, Just before they left for their respective villages, about fifteen of them came into my house, and asked me for some of our books, which I gave them; some asked for the Prayer-book, some for the Testament, and some for our Hymn book, I was very glad to see such a desire on the part of these Indians to see and read our books. May they derive benefit from reading them! May God bless them and lead them into the truth by means of the books they have received! Roman Catholic Indians have frequently asked me for the Indian and English spelling book, which was prepared by the Rev. James Chance, and which was printed by the Church Society.

Mrs. Jacob's renders me much assistance in my work. She plays the harmonium in church, and teaches the Sunday School, and in the morning daily school which I have established. Twenty-three dollars were collected in this place to pay for the harmonium; the balance of the money that was required to pay for it was collected for us by kind friends near Toronto. The instrument is very good. The singing in church has improved greatly since we have had it. We practised singing every Thursday evening during the winter. The number that was present on the last occasion of our singing was twenty-four.

I baptised a heathen Indian last November, and a heathen boy the following month—the man is about 45 years of age. Although he has lived here a great many years, it is only last summer, when he lost his youngest child, that he first expressed his wish to be baptised. He firmly refused before to embrace the chris-

tian religion. The affliction which was sent on him did him good. The boy that I speak of is the youngest son of a pipe maker who is still unbaptised. The father for a long time refused to give up his son to be baptised. It is evident that he is now entertaining favourable thoughts about the christian religion. He comes to church regularly, and he has told me that when he knows more about christianity he will embrace it fully. His wife and daughter, the latter of whom is grown up and has several children, were baptised on Easter-Day this year. His wife was at one time more prejudiced against the christian religion than he was. She did not appear to like my going to the house to read and pray. When I first came to this mission she never attended church. The other Sunday I observed her kneeling down and offering up a short prayer just after getting to her seat; how pleased was I to notice the change in her.

We had our Sunday school festival on the 26th of December. Mrs. Jacobs and I commenced to teach the Indian children last fall, as soon as the Indians had taken in all their crops. We taught for two hours every day except Saturday. We taught the children to read English and to write. I gave them sometimes a Bible lesson and a lesson on the maps. We discontinued teaching them when they left with their parents to go to the sugar-bush. We shall soon resume the work of teaching them. They made considerable progress in their lessons during the time that they attended school; some of them wrote beautifully. Five read the third book of lessons.

A missionary meeting was held in the church here in March. It was well attended by the Indians. I delivered the first speech. The other speakers were Chief Meshahkwonga, Peter Daniel, and Chief Charles Wahbekake, (White Hawk). The Indians did not give anything at the time for church purposes; they only made promises. They have since given \$18.18. The sum of \$18.53 was given by others here; the total sum that has been collected is \$36.71. Of this sum \$20 are now remitted; in this sum is included my annual subscription of \$5, for the Widows' and Orphans' fund; the balance will be spent in the mission. The Indians at Little Current have not been so liberal, they only promised to give \$7.75 at the missionary meeting that I held at their village.

A greater desire has been manifested by the heathen Indians at Shegwaindot Bay, to hear the gospel. They and the christian Indians who live among them attended the services which I held at their village this winter better than they have done hitherto. One Sunday that I was with them, the tent in which we met together (for there is no dwelling-house in the place) was quite full. A double row of them sat all round. About 42 were present. From the way the tent was made, we could not stand up, and we had some difficulty in kneeling from want of proper. room. Of course there were no chairs in the tent; Mrs. Jacobs, who was with me, and myself had to sit as the other Indians did. It was a cold day. We felt the cold behind us, but in front of us was a large fire which gave great heat. The tent, which was birch bark, was kept very clean; on the ground were placed reed mats and fir branches. I baptized four children on this occasion. Four adults have consented to embrace christianity, these I shall baptize soon, God willing. A Roman Catholic Indian, who has been living among them, told me that he would forsake Romanism, and join our church.

As some incorrect statements have been made with regard to the Indians in this mission, and as these statements have appeared in some of the papers, I shall here give a true statement of facts. There are now 153 Indians in the mission who are

members of our church. Some of these reside here, and some in more distant places. There have always been some Roman Catholics at Manitowaning. The church was not built by government, and it cost \$2440. Some Indians have left Weguamekong, the principal Roman Catholic village on this island, as well as Manitowaning, to reside elsewhere.

In accordance with the plans previously submitted to, and sanctioned by the society, I have made a missionary tour along the north shore of Lake Superior; but I did not accomplish all I hoped to have accomplished, owing to the great expense, which would have been immense, and which I did not think the society would be prepared to defray. We went along the shore as far as Peckateek, a distance of 250 miles at least, I was anxious to go from Peckateek to Nimbeywong, where there are more than a hundred families of heathen, and which is at least eight days journey from Peckateek, three along the coast and five in the interior, but the gentlemen in charge of the Hudson Bay Company's establishment at the Peck, informed me that in addition to my own men, (three in number) I should have to employ a guide and to hire a bark cance, and I was unwilling to incur this additional expense without the consent of the society. When I left Garden River, I was under the impression that Nimbeywong was only two or three days journey from Peckateek.

I have had many opportunities of preaching the blessed gospel to the heathen, and to many nominal christians who are left in the vast wilderness as sheep without a shepherd, and I leave the results of my labours in the hands of God.

Missionary work among the Indians is indeed a work of faith and labour of love, and one in which few compartively sympathise to any great degree. The missionary knows what a poor degraded people the Indians are, and the little interest manifested in their welfare by christians generally, hence his work is peculiarly a work of faith and labour of love.

The Hindoos are a numerous and a powerful people, and have caused the people of the nation to bear food by their deeds. By their energy, industry and commercial spirit, they minister to our country's prosperity and greatness, they attract a nation's attention, and excite a nation's interest in their welfare, and a missionary labouring among them, feels that he is labouring among a numerous and important people, and his labours are extensively appreciated. But who are the Indians in these parts, and who cares for them? They were once numerous and brave enough to be counted as our allies, but now they are too few, poor, and wretched to be worthy of our consideration as friends or enemies. They are not and never will be a great people, and will never minister anything to our

prosperity and greatness, (except by the surrender of their lands) and they are regarded, or rather disregarded accordingly. But we are all the children of the same father, one God hath created us, and redeemed us by the blood of his own dear Son, and although they are scattered up and down these northern regions, a few here and a few there, they have immortal souls to be saved, equally precious with our own, and in his sight, "who gave himself a ransom for all." And shall we begrudge any efforts made for their conversion?

Shall we whose souls are lighted
With wisdom from on high;
Shall we to men benighted
The lamp of God deny? God forbid.

In conclusion I would say that if you wish for a copy of my journal during my late tour, I shall feel much pleasure in sending it.
