For the Guidance of the Members of the Medical Staff and Visitors, adopted at a General Meeting of the Board of Management, held 27th May, 1881

THE FOLLOWING CLASSES OF APPLICANTS ARE NOT ADMISSIBLE:

- 1. Any one who has not actual incurable disease, which prevents the person from earning a livelihood.
 - 2. No one merely infirm from old age or from debility.
 - 3. No one merely blind.
 - 4. No one whose disease is venereal in its origin.
 - 5. No one suffering from mere functional disease.
 - 6. No one suffering from epilepsy.
 - 7. No insane persons.

HOME RUSES.

Visiting days, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, from 2 till 5.

I. No person shall be admitted to the Home for Incurables until the Board is satisfied as to his or her character and respectability.

II. The inmates must at all times show proper respect to the Manager and Lady Superintendent, and a strict regard for the rules and regulations of the Institution. They are also urged to cultivate kind and cheerful dispositions, thereby making a happy Christian Home.

III. Those inmates who are able, will be required to keep their own rooms in order, and to assist in such other domestic duties as they are able to perform.

IV. All such inmates as are able to leave their rooms, are requested to take their meals at the general table, and for sanitary reasons none will be allowed to carry food or drinks to their rooms; good manners and cleanly habits are particularly requested at table.

V. All who are able, are expected to attend, morning prayers, prayer meeting and Sunday services at the hours appointed.

VI. Inmates shall not leave the premises without the consent of the Lady Superintendent. Any inmate wishing to be absent for more than one day must obtain the consent of the Board.

VII. Male inmates shall not be allowed in the rooms occupied by females, nor female patients in those occupied by males, unless in special cases.

VIII. Inmates desiring to make a request or complaint shall inform the Lady Superintendent, who will thereupon bring the request or complaint before the Weekly Board.

IX. The inmates shall not receive wines or spirits or other stimulants without the knowledge of the Lady Superintendent.

X. The inmates may be visited by their friends on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays in each week, between the hours of two and five o'clock. No visits at any other time except in special cases.

XI. Should an inmate become dissatisfied or unhappy, he or she is at liberty to leave the Home, taking with him or her only such articles as he or she brought to the Home.

XII. If any inmate shall not conform to the rules of the Home or behave rudely or improperly, such inmate may be discharged by the Weekly Committee at their first meeting after the insubordination has been duly investigated.

SIXTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Foronto Mome for Incurables.

YEAR ENDING MARCH 31st, 1890.

The Sixteenth Annual Report of The Toronto Home for Incurables again records the familiar story of comforts rendered within our walls, and of bountiful generous giving on the part of the public of our city and country.

With deepest reverence the Managers give thanks to Almighty God for his guiding care over this Institution, its inmates, and its work, throughout the past, and all other years of its existence.

Our Family is one whose members are of necessity constantly fluctuating. Ours has been established to be "A Home for sufferers from incurable disease, needing medical care and skilled nursing." Our Inmates come to spend their closing days within our "Home," where freed from anxiety for daily support, and nursed by skilful hands, they can turn their minds in grateful content to the days that are beyond.

Forty-one (41) patients, being 19 men and 22 women, were admitted during the year, almost all of these, had at one time or another been in Hospitals. There came to us direct, from Toronto General Hospital, 13; St. John's Hospital, 1; The Haven, 1; Convalescent Home, 2; Barnardo Home, 1; County Municipalities, 8; their own or friends houses, 15.

Thus it is that our "Home" takes charge of those, who when

remedies have ceased to avail, and health is gone, cannot take care of themselves.

At one time during the year, our numbers exceeded 100, but now at its close, we have 92 still with us.

During the year, 27 of our members entered into Rest, a mortality exceeding that of any previous year. The Wards provided for Consumptive and Cancer patients, are being increasingly used, and meet a long expressed need.

One consumptive lad was taken back to England by Dr. Barnardo, upon the boy's expressed wish, that he might be in the English Barnardo Home, by which he had been rescued and brought up.

The Library contains 800 volumes. An appeal was made in the last Report for contributions of books, which has been liberally responded to. The names of those who kindly sent volumes will be found in the Donation list. There is yet room on our shelves for many more books, particularly of a size which may easily be read in bed.

Donations are specially requested for the providing of additional Wheel Chairs, Bookrests, and Invalid Tables, all of which will add to the comfort of the Inmates, but which the Managers cannot at present venture to supply, in the face of our daily growing expenditure.

As our members increase, additional services have to be obtained, so that now we have employed under the head nurse, a staff of ten nurses, and also have a working staff of eight women and two male servants. These necessary services, we add with boldness, knowing that we shall be amply supported.

The walls of the rooms and corridors have been newly painted. Mr. Manning, our President, having greatly contributed to the expense.

We ask for framed pictures of a pleasant kind, such as Christmas lithographs, views of scenery, etc., which may be of interest to the Inmates, and give a Home-like influence to their rooms.

Mindful of the late terrible destruction by fire of Toronto University, the use of coal oil has been prohibited in the "Home," and additional safeguards of iron door, more hydrants, and fire-escapes, are to be provided, thus calling for additional subscriptions.

The Chief Officers of the Toronto Fire Brigade, have very thoughtfully, visited the building, and acquainted themselves with all its parts, so that they may be ready to give intelligent and speedy aid, should necessity arise.

Entertainments for the recreation of the Inmates have been given, and thanks are heartily expressed to Robert de Bruce Camp, Sons of Scotland; Madame Stuttaford and pupils; the Lyric Society; Miss Howarth and friends; The West End Mission Band; and to the choirs of St. Mark's, Tecumseth St.; of Cowan Avenue Methodist, and of Parkdale Presbyterian Churches.

The Men's Prayer Meeting has been regularly held by Mr. McNairn, who has conducted the meeting for three months every Tuesday evening.

The regular Sunday services and daily ministrations have been attended to by Rev. Chas. L. Ingles and Rev. Bernard Bryan, 'of Church of England; Rev. R. P. McKay, B.A. and Rev. T. Hancock, Presbyterian Church; Rev. Dr. Stone, Methodist Church; Rev. S. Arthur, Baptist Church; and Rev. C. Duff, of the Congregational Church. The thanks of the Board, and of the Inmates are gratefully offered to them for their kind services.

Thanks are due, and are given to those of the Medical Staff of Consulting and Visiting Physicians, who gave their services in attendance on the Inmates and in examination of Candidates for admission.

Continued praise must be given to Mrs. Craigie, our valued Superintendent, to whose discreet and efficient management the success and happiness of the "Home" is greatly due.

To Miss Grace Mowat and her staff of Nurses, and to the Resident Medical Officer Dr. Ainslie Ardagh, hearty thanks and congratulations are offered.

It was their lot to encounter this year the unusual epidemic of Influenza called "Grippe," which severely attacked the "Home" and added to the death rate. Although themselves prostrated, they stood to their work, and the grateful acknowledgements which are so tenderly and warmly expressed towards them by the Inmates under their care, is the strongest evidence of their devotion to duty.

The grants of the Ontario Government and of the City of

Toronto are gratefully acknowledged.

l to anticipate simple provisions of the statute of this Province in 1874, entitled "An Act respecting Benevolent, Provident, and other Societies."

The Institution having now assumed proportions so extensive, and as it is evident that its permanence and further development are assured, it has been suggested to the Board, that a special Act of incorporation be sought from the Legislature for the purpose of extending its corporate powers, regulating its affairs, and enabling it more effectually to deal with refractory patients and with defaulters.

The Board would therefore recommend that a special committee be appointed to consider the subject.

The Home for Incurables is a "Voluntary Charity," not a "Public Institution" of the State.

Seeing that it undertakes to provide each Incurable who may come within its walls with a "Home" for the rest of his or her life, it enters on behalf of its friends, into a sacred contract, which it trusts them faithfully to fulfil. It exists solely upon the free gifts of those who may feel free to aid it, and confidently presents the record of the past year's work, to those who are in health, trusting that by its perusal they may be led to come generously to its aid.

16th ANNUAL MEDICAL REPORT.

From March 1st, 1889 to March 1st, 1890.

On behalf of the Medical Staff of the Home for Incurables, I beg to present the following report:—

With regard to the amount of acute illness among the inmates of the Home during the past year, it is worthy of remark that during the prevalence of "La Grippe," a great many of the patients were more or less seriously affected. At one period, indeed, no fewer than thirty-five (35) residents of the Home were under treatment at the same time, and when it is understood that some of these were members of the nursing and domestic staffs, the tax upon the management and ingenuity of the matron, and on the energy and skill of the Head Nurse, will be appreciated. Statistically speaking, of the total number of deaths during the months of December, January and February, those figures are not intended to convey the idea that this unusually high rate of mortality was due to the ravages of "La Grippe," but they illustrate a fact that has frequently been observed before, viz., that this disease, though in most instances trivial in itself, so lowers the vitality of the system that its victims the more readily succumb to pre-existent, concurrent or sequent diseases.

It is gratifying to observe the extension of the usefulness of the Institution in the direction of those suffering from those most painful diseases, Cancer and Consumption.

The Wards set apart for these cases are, as is appropriate, among the most cheerful and best appointed in the Building, and I doubt not as the reputation of the Home extends they will soon be full to repletion.

examine them in their own houses, carefully appreciate the advantage it must be to those patients to pass from their oft-time comfortless and unhygienic homes, to commodious, well-lighted and well-ventilated wards of the Home, from a diet sufficient only for a meagre existence, to one nourishing and tempting as it should be to suit the capricious appetite of an invalid, and from a condition of frequently absolute neglect, as regards nursing attention, to the watchful care and trained skill of kind-hearted nurses.

May I venture to mention one matter which I consider is worthy the attention of the Board of Management? One of the many impositions which any charitable institution has to guard against, is that of having foisted upon its large-heartedness, individuals who are not suitable cases for the charity which may be in question. I do not hesitate to say that there are not many, but a few instances of this abuse of Charity in the Home for Incurables. It would be neither prudent or profitable in this report to enter into the causes of this state of affairs, what we have to deal with is the fact that without presuming to enter into an elaborated scheme for remedying the defect, I may perhaps be pardoned for suggesting a system of annual inspection by the consulting staff, of those cases which any member of the visiting staff may put upon record from time to time as being in his opinion unsuitable inmates of the Home.

In conclusion, I desire to bear cheerful testimony to the courteous attentiveness and skilled assistance of Dr. Ardagh, in carrying
out the medical treatment of the inmates, to the capable management and untiring industry of the matron, Mrs. Craigie, in securing those conditions of hygienic cleanliness of the building and
comfort of the patients, so conducive to their wellfare; to the
zeal and ability of the head nurse Miss Mowat, not only in the
care of the sick, but in the training of the nurses placed immediately under her charge, and to the kindly and sympathetic

Second Resolution: Moved by Rev. Geo. Sandwell, seconded by Mr. Geo. McMurrich,

"That we desire to acknowledge with devout gratitude to Almighty God, the measure of success with which the Home has been favored during the year past."

Third Resolution: Moved by Rev. Professor Clarke, seconded by Mr. Blaikie,

"That the Board of Management would return their sincere thanks to those kind friends who by their donations and subscriptions have sustained the work, during the past year; and would also express their gratitude to the Ontario Legislature, and the Toronto City Council for their interest in the Home, and their appreciation of its work, as shown by their helpful grants towards its maintenance."

Fourth Resolution: Moved by Rev. Dr. Parsons, seconded by Rev. Mr. Longley,

"That our cordial thanks are hereby tendered to the Medical Staff and to the Clergy of Parkdale for their faithful attendance during the year; to the Lady Managers who have so energetically borne the care and responsibility of watching over the interests of the Home; to Dr. Ainslie Ardagh for his skillful services as resident medical officer; to Mrs. Craigie and Miss Grace Mowat, and the staff of nurses and servants for the thoroughly satisfactory manner in which they have discharged in their respective spheres, the important duties devolving upon them."

"We would also express our sincere regret at the retirement of Miss Grace Mowat from the position of Head Nurse which she has filled with so much advantage to the Home and with so much credit to herself."

Fifth Resolution: Moved by Professor Goldwin Smith, seconded by Mr. W. Barclay McMurrich,

"That being deeply convinced that the design and purpose of the "Home" is eminently in accordance with the mind of Christ our Lord, we feel that in order to its still more extended and efficient usefulness, vigorous efforts should be made to reduce the mortgage debt, and to increase the regular income of this Institution."

Sixth Resolution: Moved by Mr. Mortimer Clark, seconded by Mr. Geo. Cox,

"That the Board of Management of the Home be hereby empowered and directed to apply to the Legislature, for such necessary modifications of its Charter, as shall enable it to secure the pecuniary trusts, which may be given into its care, and to carry on with better effect its benevolent operations."

The meeting was closed by the Rev. Professor Clarke pronouncing the Benediction.

CONSTITUTION

OF THE

HOME FOR INCURABLES,

Adopted and Amended March 28th, 1884.

I. This institution shall be known as "The Toronto Home for Incurables. II. Its object shall be to afford maintenance, nursing, and medical and sur-

gical aid to persons suffering from incurable disease, and to provide for them while inmates of the "Home," the ministrations of the Gospel.

III. Every subscriber of two dollars and upwards per annum shall be entitled to vote at the annual meeting, at which a Board of Managers shall be elected for the ensuing twelve months. Every individual who shall pay in advance, and at one time, the sum of fifty dollars, shall be entitled to the same privileges for life.

IV. All money now in the possession of the "Home," or which may hereafter be collected or acquired by it, shall be applied (unless otherwise directed by the donor) to the general objects, uses and requirements of the "Home."

V. The affairs of the "Home," shall be under the direction, control and management of the Board of Managers, of whom at least forty shall be ladies and twelve gentlemen, and who shall be elected at the annual general meeting of subscribers, qualified as set forth in Article III.

The medical staff attending the "Home" shall be ex-officio members of the Board of Managers.

In case of a vacancy arising, the Board may elect a member to fill the vacancy until the next annual general meeting.

The Board shall control and direct all the business of the institution, and their decision upon all points of management shall be final.

There shall be chosen annually, and by the vote of the Board, a President and Vice-President, and from among the Lady Managers, the following officers

viz.: First Lady Directress, Second Lady Directress, Third Lady Directress, Secretary, Assistant-Secretary and Treasurer.

For the more convenient working of the Institution, the Board may from time to time appoint committees of not less than three of their number such as an Executive Committee, and committees for visiting and superintending the "Home."

The Board may also enact By-laws for regulating the duties of the various officers and employees of the home.

The By-laws shall not be altered except at a regular meeting, after notice duly given, at least a month previously.

VI. The Board of Managers shall hold stated meetings at least once a month and may hold adjourned meetings when necessary. At such monthly meetings the Board shall have power to make additional By-laws regulating its own government and for the government of the officers and employees, as before provided, and when necessary, after due notice, to alter and amend the same.

Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President and one of the Lady Directresses, or on requisition of five or more members of the Board. When a special meeting is called, the time and place of meeting, and the business for which it is called, shall be stated in the notice calling the meeting, and no other business shall be taken up at such meeting.

VII. The annual general meeting of the subscribers, qualified as set forth in Article III, shall be held in the month of March.

It shall be the duty of the Board of Managers to make all necessary arrangements for said annual meeting; to lay before the subscribers a report of the proceedings of the previous twelve months, and to exhibit a full and accurate view of the funds, property and effects of the "Home."

VIII. In view of the large contributions given by the citizens of Toronto, and the grant made by the City Council in aid of the "Home" applications from the City of Toronto for admission to the "Home" shall have preference over others.

IX. The Board will receive incurable persons from any municipality in Ontario outside of Toronto, on condition that a bond be given by said municipality to pay such sum as the Board may determine from time to time for the maintenance of each patient so sent. Provided always that a certificate as to general character and circumstances shall have been received from such persons as the Board may approve: that a certificate be given by the gaol surgeon of the municipality, or by such other medical gentlemen as the Board may approve that the person seeking admission is incurable; provided also, that such certificate be endorsed by the medical officers of this Institution, and that the application be approved by the Board at a regular monthly meeting.

BY-LAWS.

Amended and Adopted March 28, 1884, and March 20, 1886.

I. DUTIES OF OFFICERS.—At meetings of the Board of Managers the Chairman (elected as such from amongst the gentlemen Managers) shall preside. In his absence the Managers present shall name a Chairman pro tem.

The Chairman shall be the judge of order, and his decisions thereon shall be acquiesced in without debate.

He shall direct the Secretary when special meetings are ordered, to insert in the notices the import of the special business upon which the Managers are to convene.

II. The Secretary shall keep fair and regular minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Managers in a book to be provided for that purpose.

She shall preserve all the records and papers of the Society which do not belong to the Treasurer.

She shall cause a notice of each stated meeting, and of each special meeting of the Board of Managers, to be sent to the address of each Manager, at least one day previous to the day fixed for the meeting.

The Assistant Secretary shall assist the Secretary in her duties when required, and act for her at meetings of the Board in her absence.

III. The Treasurer shall receive all moneys belonging to the Society, and shall give a receipt to the persons from whom she may receive money.

For the sake of regularity, and in order to establish the amount, all persons who may hand money to Treasurer are requested to ask for a receipt of the money so paid over.

When the Treasurer does not require the money in paying accounts which have passed the Board, she shall deposit the money or such part of it as may not be immediately required in the Savings Bank, to the credit of her official account as Treasurer.

She shall keep a fair and regular account of the receipts and expenditures, and her account book and bank book shall be open to the inspection of the Managers at each stated meeting.

the receipts and expenditures during the year, duly classified and audited, that a lucid, full explanation, or exposition of the working of the finances of the "Home," may be submitted at the general meeting.

The Treasurer's accounts shall be audited by a Committee of the gentlemen Managers named by the Chairman or by the Board.

IV. The Treasurer only shall pay accounts for articles and services supplied to the "Home" when duly certified, and in all cases of payment, shall require a receipt.

Accounts shall be certified to be correct as to prices, by the Managers who make the purchase of the articles and shall be initialed "correct" accordingly. They shall then be initialed by the Matron or the Superintendent, to show that the articles were received at the "Home."

The accounts shall then be laid before the Managers at the stated monthly meetings, and when payment is ordered, the order shall be entered on the minutes by the Secretary.

The Treasurer can then pay the accounts, and an entry upon the minutes will be a sufficient authority to the Treasurer to pay whatever accounts or disbursements the Board may have ordered.

V. The Managers may appoint from time to time Committees from amongst themselves to attend to any special duties.

As a rule such committees shall consist of not less than three, and not less than two shall be considered a quorum to act.

These Committees, for the sake of regularity and for future reference, shall as a rule report to the Board in writing.

VI. The stated meetings of the Board shall be held on the last Friday of every month, at such hour as the Board-may from time to time appoint.

VII. The Superintendent and Matron shall hold their offices at the pleasure of the Board.

They shall do all in their power to promote the comfort of the inmates of the "Home," and shall follow the instructions of the Board of lady Managers for the week, and of the medical staff when orders are given.

They shall keep a book for entering all such things as they may consider necessary for the use of the "Home," and submit it to the weekly visitors. When disbursements are ordered, a regular account of the same shall be kept for the information of the Managers and the Treasurer.

VIII. The Managers deeming the point of admission of inmates into the "Home," to be a very important matter, decided that the following formalities shall regularly be observed.

have resided in the city, their residence, age, disease, and circumstances, also whether he or she has been attended by any medical man, and whether any clergyman has visited.

2nd. Thereafter two of the Managers shall visit the residence named (two ladies if the applicant be a woman, two gentlemen it the applicant be a man). They shall look at the surroundings of the applicant, ascertain what can be practically known of the persons, circumstances, habits and general character,

in short, get all the available information about the case.

They shall see the clergyman and the doctor, if either have been in attendance, hear what each has to say about the applicant, and report to the Board

of Managers.

3rd. That two of the medical staff of the "Home" shall visit each applicant for admission, and report to the Board of Managers, the character of the disease and if incurable; and for any applicant outside of Toronto, the equivalent testimonials shall be required.

Each application for admission to rhe "Home" shall be presented at the regular meeting of the Board, and if entertained, after due investigation, shall be acted upon at the following regular meeting of the Board.

4th. If, after the name of an applicant has in due course been approved by the Board, a considerable time should elapse before the occurrence of a vacancy and there is reason to apprehend that such patient is at, or near the point of death, then the resident medical efficer shall be directed to visit the case and to report to the Board, as to the advisibility under the circumstances of removing the patient to the "Home."

5th. All the inmates of the "Home" must distinctly understand that an admission confers no right of permanent residence in the "Home," and at any time the managers have the power of dismissing an inmate for what they may deem a sufficient cause; of its sufficiency the Managers are to be the sole judges.

6th. Any inmate who shall leave the "Home" without consent of the Directors, thereby forfeits all claims for residence within it, and will not be read-

mitted.

IX. Any person received into this "Home" as a free patient, if possessed of money or property shall be required to convey the same to the Board for the use of the Institution, and if inheriting property while an inmate of the "Home" and desiring to leave, shall be required to pay the usual charge for board, during the period of residence in the "Home."

X. Any members absenting themselves from three consecutive monthly meetings, except in cases of illness or absence from the city, shall have their names struck off the list of the managing committee.
