Perth, Feb. 2.—Upon the Hon. J.

Father Ryan, and presented him with an address of welcome and appreciation of his kindness in coming to their midst, as well as of the favors received by the band from the government authorities.

The distinction conferred upon Premier Flemming is indeed unique, in as much as it is the first time that an Indian tribe has presented an address was written in the Malicite language and was on parchment. The delegation which waited upon Premier Flemming was composed of the Chief of the tribe, Frank Lockwood, ex. Chief Jos. Ellis and John Sudis, one of the councillors of the tribe. The address was read first in the vernacular of the tribe and after wards in English.






