

New York, August 7.—A new world's record in globe trotting was established tonight with the arrival here of John Henry Mears, who, representing an evening newspaper in this city, circled the earth in the time of 35 days, 21 hours, 35 minutes. Mears left New York about an hour after midnight on July 2, and travelled by way of Paris, Harbin, Yokohama and Victoria, B. C.

The previous record, made by Andre Jaeger-Schmidt in 1911, was 33 days, 19 hours, 43 minutes.




