STANDING RULES

For the Constitution and Government of the

DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY OF NOVA-SCOTIA.

I. His Excellency THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR OF NOVA-SCOTIA for the time being, and THE SOCIETIES FOR THE PROPAGATION OF THE GOSPEL, and FOR PROMOTING CHRISTIAN KNOWLEDGE, shall be respectfully requested to be the Patrons of this Society.

II. The Bishop of the Diocese shall be the President of the Society, with a control over all their proceedings. His approval shall be necessary for the completion of all important acts of the Society, and especially for the revocation or alteration of any of the standing rules, and for making any addition to them.

III. There shall be two or more Vice Presidents, of whom the Archdeacon of Nova-Scotia shall be the first; a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary when necessary, and a Treasurer.

IV. There shall be a standing Committee, consisting of the Officers, all the Clergy, and as many Laymen as it shall be thought convenient to choose at the Annual Meeting of the Society. The Lay Members shall continue in the Committee for a year, or until other Lay Members be chosen in their place; and any or all of them may be re-elected. Seven of the Committee shall be a quorum, provided four of them be Laymen.

V. The Society shall be open to all Members of the Church, all of whom shall be invited to unite with it. Ten pounds paid at any one time shall qualify a person to be a Member during his life, and the payment in advance of any sum, *however small*, shall qualify a person to be a Member for a year.

VI. The Members of the Church in every part of the Province shall be invited to co-operate with the Diocesan Society, by joining Committees of it which shall be formed, under the direction of their respective Clergymen, either in each mission or parish, or in more than one mission or parish united, as shall be deemed most convenient, and in strict accordance with the design and rules of the Diocesan Society; and it is recommended to the Committees to forward their funds, as they may be collected, to the General Committee, who will faithfully apply them to the general objects of the Society; but when the Local Committees desire it, they shall receive books at cost and charges to the amount of one fourth of their remittances.

VII. There shall be one General Meeting of the whole Society, including any Members of the Local Committees who can conveniently attend, on such day and at such place as the President may name, of which due notice will be given, with an invitation to every Committee to send at least one Clergyman and two Laymen to represent such Committee, and with a recommendation that each Committee shall meet at some convenient time immediately before the General Meeting of the Society, that any necessary suggestions may be offered to the representatives of the Committees for their guidance at the General Meeting. And a Special General Meeting may be called at any time and in any place, when the President, or, in his absence, two or more Vice-Presidents, shall consider it desirable to appoint such Special General Meeting.

VIII. The objects to which the attention of the Society shall be directed shall be, generally, those which have engaged the two great Church Societies in England for the Propagation of the Gospel, and for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and none other.

IX. The following objects shall more particularly engage the attention of the Society, as soon as their means may enable them to afford such attention:

1. Supplies of Books and Tracts from the stores of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and none other, except in cases where other Books or Tracts, in strict conformity with the principles of the Established Church, and particularly adapted to local circumstances, shall first be carefully examined and approved by a Committee of revision, to be appointed by the General Committee; the approval of which General Committee shall be necessary in the next place; after which the books must likewise receive the written approbation of the Bishop.
2. Missionary visits to neglected and destitute places, under the direction of the Bishop.
3. Upholding by all possible and proper means the Collegiate Establishments at Windsor.

4. Assistance to deserving young men, desirous of being qualified for the Ministry of the Church, but requiring aid in pursuing their studies at the Collegiate Establishments at Windsor.
5. Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Established Church.
6. Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and Daily Schools.
7. Assistance to the erection or enlargement of Churches and Chapels belonging to the Established Religion, in peculiar or extreme cases.

To these objects, generally, the general contributions will be applied; while contributors who desire it, may have their individual contributions scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects. And as some Members of the Church, who are not unmindful of the great spiritual wants in their own neighbourhood, still feel constrained, in pious gratitude for the blessings they enjoy, to allot something, however small, from the means with which a gracious Providence has blessed them, towards the spread of the glorious Gospel among the nations which still sit in darkness:—

X. This Society will gladly receive and forward to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, whatever sums may be given for the conversion and instruction of the Heathen, to which object such sums will be strictly confined by the East India Committee of that Society.

XI. Books and Tracts will generally be on sale at cost and charges; and whenever in particular cases a deviation from this rule is desired, it must be considered by the Standing Committee, and only permitted when recommended by them and approved by the President, or, in his absence, by two or more of the Vice Presidents.

XII. All Meetings of the Society and of the Committees shall be opened and closed with the prayers used by the two Societies in England, adapted to our situation under the direction of the Bishop.

EIGHTH REPORT

Of the GENERAL COMMITTEE of the

DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY OF NOVA-SCOTIA.

THE Annual Meeting of the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY OF NOVA-SCOTIA took place in the Masonic Hall, at Halifax, on Thursday the 5th of March, A. D. 1846, at 7½ o'clock in the evening.

The Right Revd. the PRESIDENT took the chair at 7½ o'clock, and
opened the proceedings by inviting those present to sing two verses of the
Hundredth Psalm.

The Venerable Archdeacon WILLIS read Prayers.

His Lordship the President then briefly stated the object of the Meet-
ing, and called upon the Assistant Secretary to read the following

REPORT.

"It is a good thing to give thanks unto the Lord, and to sing praise unto
thy name, O most Highest!" And the Committee of the DIOCESAN
CHURCH SOCIETY OF NOVA-SCOTIA feel that they have cause for thanks-
giving unto the Lord, for the privilege of being again assembled with their
brethren in the celebration of their anniversary,—for the evidences of
increasing interest in the welfare of the Society which they are enabled to
detail,—and for the daily opening prospects of increased usefulness in the
promotion of the cause of Christ and His Church.

It is a subject of thankfulness to our gracious Lord that the General
Meeting of this Society attracts so large a number of the friends of the
Church in the city, to greet the presence of our brethren, the Ministers
and members of the Church from different portions of the Province, and
to hear from their lips the account of the way in which the Lord prospers
them in their various districts, and makes the Church we love an instru-
ment of good to the souls of men.

It is a subject of thankfulness that there now remains not a single mis-
sion in this Province in which there does not exist a branch of this
Society, and that those Committees, which have been but lately formed,

because of the apprehension that the people are not prepared to contribute to an object of so general a nature, have shamed those fears by outstripping some of older date in the amount of their contributions. And yet in most, if not in all cases, the Clergy who preside over the various Local Committees through the Province, accompany the remittances which they have forwarded during the present season with an assurance of the increasing interest with which the Society is every year regarded in the districts in which they minister. The Revd. Edwin Gilpin of Annapolis assures the Committee that the interest in the welfare and purposes of the Society has increased among his people, and "they trust that the measures which may be adopted at the General Meeting may serve to confirm their confidence." The Revd. James Robertson of Bridgetown writes—"the General Committee will be glad to learn that an increasing interest in the success and usefulness of the Diocesan Church Society is daily manifesting itself in my mission; an interest which it is to be hoped will long continue to be felt." The Revd. Dr. Shreve, referring to the Annual Meeting of the Local Committee in his Parish during the present year, says, "on this occasion the house was well filled by between 200 and 300 persons; the old members cheerfully paid in their subscriptions and several new subscribers enrolled their names: this will shew that the interest in the welfare of the Society is not, with us, diminishing."

It is also a subject of devout thanksgiving to Almighty God, that, as the Venerable Societies in England, which have so long been the channels of Gospel blessings to the Province, are constrained in some measure to hold their hand, a door seems opening to this Society for increased usefulness and the hope of being able in some measure to occupy the field which otherwise must go to waste. This Committee are persuaded that the Members of the Society throughout the Province will hail, with devout acknowledgments to Almighty God, the resolutions lately adopted by the Committee.—One of these has for its object the supplying of a portion of the salary of a Schoolmaster for at least one School in each Mission, to be conducted upon religious principles in connexion with the Church of which we are members, and under the immediate direction of the settled Missionary. The importance can hardly be over-rated of connecting Christian instruction with the more general subjects of education, and the duty incumbent upon members of our scriptural communion, to aim at imbuing the minds of our youth with the principles of the Gospel, and of the Church as a channel of the Gospel, cannot be too earnestly impressed. Another resolution lately adopted by the General Committee, and for which the sympathy and support of this Society and of the Church are earnestly desired, is that of undertaking to provide the salaries and travelling expenses of two Visiting Missionaries—one for the Eastern and the other for the Western District of the Province, so soon as the Bishop of the Diocese can select proper persons for the discharge of this arduous work. Never, until this is effected, can the members of the Church, who

enjoy the privilege of a settled ministry, be considered as discharging any portion of their obligations to their more destitute brethren in the remote settlements of the Province; and none, it may be hoped, who know and appreciate the blessing of the constant ministration of the Word and Sacraments, will hesitate to give as the Lord hath blessed them, in order to supply the means of keeping up the important engagement to which the Society is now pledged.

INCOME.

The Committee desires to acknowledge with thankfulness the sums which have been received from various quarters in support of the objects of the Society.

In HALIFAX the sum of £134 15s. 1d. has been received on account of Annual Subscriptions. The Committee cannot doubt, that, in the view of the extended obligations of the Society, this amount will be materially increased by the contributions of this evening, and by the collections which will be made in St. Paul's and St. George's Churches on Sunday next. They would also fain hope, that the amount of Annual Subscriptions in the city will be speedily and largely augmented.

From AMHERST was received in April last the sum of £6 11s. 3d., the contribution of that Committee for the last year, which circumstances had delayed till after the Annual Meeting of that year; and £8 4s. 5d. have just been paid in, as the amount of the present year's subscriptions.

From ANNAPOLIS has been remitted by the hands of A. Whitman, Esq., M. P. P., the sum of £19 17s. 6d.

From AYLESFORD the Rev. R. Avery, who has been in the temporary charge of that Parish, has forwarded the sum of £11 2s. 6d., which, with the sum of £1, annually contributed by Mr. W. Tupper, in aid of Missions to the Heathen, makes up the sum of £12 2s. 6d.

From BRIDGETOWN the sum of £8 14s. 7d. has been forwarded by the Rev. Jas. Robertson, through the hands of S. S. Thorne, Esq. M. P. P., an amount, which, though apparently smaller than usual, is in reality larger, as Committees have now been formed in Lawrencetown and Wilmot in the same Mission, whose united contributions make up the sum of £19 5s. 8d., a considerable increase upon former years.

From CHESTER the Rev. Dr. Shreve has forwarded the sum of £15.

From CLEMENTS, by the Rev. W. M. Godfrey, the sum of £13 has been remitted.

From CORNWALLIS and HORTON the Rev. J. Storrs has sent in the sum of £15 1s. of which £1 sterling is to be remitted in aid of Missions to the Heathen; the same sum to the Society for Promoting Christianity among the Jews, and the balance of £12 11s. to be applied to the general purposes of this Society.

From DIGBY the Rev. W. Bullock has forwarded the sum of £24; a large increase upon the remittance of last year.

From GUYSBOROUGH has been forwarded by the Rev. C. J. Shreve through the hands of J. J. Marshall, Esq. M. P. P., the sum of £12 16s. 3d.

From GRANVILLE the Rev. J. M. Campbell has remitted the sum of £15, an amount whose increase over former years is a gratifying evidence that Churchmen are gradually awakening to a sense of their responsibility to do more than they have hitherto done.

From LIVERPOOL, the Rev. J. T. T. Moody has forwarded the handsome sum of £30: a good evidence of increased interest on the part of his people in the welfare of the Society.

From LUNENBURG, the Rev. J. C. Cochran has paid in the increased amount of £26 10s.;—and communicated the addition of forty new names to the list of his Local Committee.

From MAHONE BAY the sum of £8 0s. 7d. was received in March last, forming part of the contributions of last year; the Rev. P. Filleul has now forwarded the sum of £10, as part of the contributions of the present season.

From NEW DUBLIN, the Rev. E. E. B. Nicholls, who has been for a few weeks in charge of that parish, in consequence of the illness of the Rev. J. W. Weeks, has handed in the sum, including Mr. Weeks' subscription, of £12.

From NEWPORT the Rev. R. J. Uniacke has forwarded the sum of £10 17s.

From PARRSBOROUGH the Rev. W. H. Cooper, who has succeeded the Rev. R. Arnold in the temporary charge of that Mission, has forwarded the sum of £6 12s.

From PICTOU, where a Committee was formed last year, a first contribution has been handed in of £10 2s. 1d.

From PUGWASH, the Rev. G. Townshend has forwarded a first contribution of £2 6s. 3d.

From RAWDON the Rev. T. Maynard has remitted the sum of £6 7s. 3d., and from DOUGLAS in the same Mission the sum of £6 12s. 3d., and accompanies the remittances with the gratifying expression of his earnest prayer that the mite thus cast into the Lord's Treasury may be owned and blessed by Him.

From SACKVILLE, the Rev. A. Gray has handed in the sum of £11 3s. 9d., manifesting a small but steady increase in the contributions of that Committee.

From SHELBURNE, the Rev. T. H. White has forwarded the largely increased amount of £20. This amount has also been augmented by the donation of £10 from the Rev. Dr. Rowland, who accompanies the donation with an expression of gratitude to God, that, on the day of the date of his gift, fifty years had elapsed since his entrance upon the ministry of the Church.

From **ST. MARGARET'S BAY**, the Rev. J. Stannage has sent in the sum of £5 6s. 3d.

From **SYDNEY, C. B.**, the Treasurer, J. Bourinot, Esq., forwarded during the summer the annual contribution of £24.

From **TRURO**, a new Committee formed under the care of the Rev. T. C. Leaver, the present missionary at that place, has been sent in a first contribution of £12 13s. 1d., of which 10s. is to aid in the education of young men for the ministry, and 13s. to be remitted for the Heathen.

From **WEYMOUTH**, where a new Committee has also been formed by the Rev. W. H. Snyder, the sum of £11 has been sent in.

From **WINDSOR**, when the collections were not quite completed, the Rev. A. Gilpin announces that a sum of about £20 will be forwarded in a few days.

From **YARMOUTH** there was remitted during the past summer by the Rev. R. Avery, the sum of £16 1s. 6d.; and the Rev. H. L. Owen at present in charge of that Mission, has sent the sum of £38 10., which he requests may be acknowledged in the Report as follows:

In addition to these sums H. G. Farish, Esq. forwarded in November last Ten Pounds, which donation constitutes him a Life Member of the Society. The total amount therefore, received from Yarmouth since the last General Meeting, is £64 11s. 6d.

The aggregate of subscriptions and contributions makes up the income of the Society, for the year now closed, to the sum of £601 15s. 11d.

EXPENDITURE.

During the year which has now elapsed, the General Committee have made the following appropriations.

LAY READERS.—As the Clergy of the Province have not been assembled in visitation during the year, the question of the continuance of this Branch of the Society's operations remains as it was at the last Report. No additions have been made to the number; and those which have for some time past been receiving gratuities from this Society, are aware that they will only continue to do so until the question shall have been disposed of by the opinions of the assembled Clergy.

The connexion of Mr. M. Sellers with the Society ceased in June last, as he then engaged in the service of the Colonial Church Society for a similar purpose.

Books.—The Local Committees have generally availed themselves of the privilege of receiving back the amount of one fourth of their remittances in Books, and there has been paid over to the Book Fund on this account during the past year the sum of £36 3s. 2d.

Grants have also been made for the purchase of Books from the Depository of the Society, in the following cases, viz:

There have been issued from the Depository of the Society during the past year, 60 Bibles, 175 New Testaments, 958 Prayer Books, 5,570 Tracts and 845 other Publications.

The Depository continues at present in charge of the family of the late Mr. James Maxwell, in whose sudden decease the Society was called upon to lament the loss of a highly estimable and valuable man, who had been from the origin of the Society the active and intelligent Depository.

MISSIONARY VISITS.—The Committee have renewed during the past year a grant of £10, to be placed in the hands of the Venerable Archdeacon Willis, for the purpose of defraying the expenses incurred in Missionary visits, chiefly in the Island of Cape Breton.

They have also, upon the strong representation by the Rev. W. Bullock of the important services rendered by the Rev. E. E. B. Nichols in visiting the destitute settlements in the Counties of Yarmouth and Digby, voted the sum of £25 to defray the actual expenses thus incurred by Mr. Nichols;—and as Mr. Nichols has at present no settled cure of souls, the Committee agreed that if he would extend his visits, under the direction of the Bishop, to other portions of the Western District of the Province, they would defray his expenses for the year to the extent of £50. They have already received a report made by him of a visit to Barrington and its neighbourhood, when he found in several settlements great destitution of the Word of Life, and a great readiness to receive his ministrations.

This may be regarded as the first Missionary work engaged in on the responsibility of the Society, and the Committee trust, that, at their next Annual Meeting, they may be permitted to detail the useful labours of two of their own Missionaries, who shall have been traversing the more destitute portions of the Province, scattering the good seed of the Kingdom of Christ.

SCHOOLS.—The Society have been hitherto held back from any appropriation, except that of occasional grants of Books, in aid of Sunday or other Schools, by the fear that in undertaking to provide the salaries of Schoolmasters, they should be engaging in more than their funds would warrant. It has, however, appeared to the Committee, and they cannot doubt that they will be sustained in the belief, that it was their duty to make an effort to occupy in some measure the field of usefulness here opened before them, in full faith that the Lord would dispose the hearts of those, to whom He has given the means, to contribute more bountifully to the funds of the Society for the support of objects of such unquestionable usefulness.

In this belief they have made a commencement, by acceding to the repeated remonstrance and request of the Rev. Dr. Shreve, and granting a salary of £20 to a Schoolmaster in the Mission of Chester, upon certain conditions.

The Committee deem it of importance to state these conditions distinctly, and to impress it upon all who may apply for similar aid that these conditions must be rigidly complied with:

First.—That the Church Catechism be taught in the School, and other religious instruction given in accordance with the principles of the Church and under the direction of the Missionary.

Secondly.—That the School House be erected on ground, the title of which, with the buildings and appurtenances, is duly secured to the Bishop of the Diocese or the Church Corporation of the Parish.

Thirdly.—That a sum equal to twice the amount at least of that granted by the Committee, be raised on the spot towards the salary of the Schoolmaster, by way of subscriptions, tuition money, or otherwise.

These conditions will, they hope, commend themselves as containing merely necessary precautions in order to ensure the connexion of the schools that may be assisted, with the Church of which we are Members; and the Committee will rejoice in being permitted, so far as their funds will authorize them, to contribute to the establishment of at least one School, to be conducted on such principles, in every Mission in the Province.

The Committee think it right to state, that the sum granted in this particular instance must not be considered as a precedent for the amount of similar grants in future cases. They trust, however, to be enabled to grant, in all cases where the above conditions, shall have been complied with, such aid as may materially contribute to the support and comfort of a desirable order of Schoolmasters in connexion with the Church.

STUDENTS AT WINDSOR.—During the past year, a grant has been made by way of loan without interest to a gentleman, who was pursuing his studies at King's College, and who has since received Holy Orders in the adjoining diocese of Fredericton. They have also appropriated the

sum of £30, which they doubt not will be repeated in future years, to a young man now about to enter College, who has struggled through unusual difficulties in order to qualify himself for matriculation at the University.

The Committee are encouraged in this branch of their expenditure by the knowledge that another gentleman, whom they trust it will not be indelicate to name, the Rev. W. H. Cooper, to whom this Society was enabled to extend its aid, has entered upon a career of usefulness as a Minister of the Gospel, in which they trust he may be made use of by the Great Head of the Church as an instrument in winning souls to Him.

The Committee cannot, however, allow the present opportunity to pass by without an expression of their deep concern for the embarrassed position and prospects of the University of King's College. Some years have elapsed since the British Government withdrew the aid, in expectation of whose continuance the University was founded; and at the same time the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts bountifully came forward to supply the deficiency by a temporary grant of £500 per annum, to be continued as long as the state of their finances would warrant such an appropriation. It can hardly, however, be wondered at, however lamented, that when the demands upon that Society's funds for strictly Missionary purposes, so much exceed their means of defraying them, they should have commenced to curtail their operations by withdrawing their help from Institutions of this kind; and the Committee have heard with concern, that they have signified to the Lord Bishop their resolution, that the grant of £500 per annum shall cease with the present year.

It cannot, however, but be hoped, that not only the Alumni of King's College, but the Members of the Church generally in the Province, will feel the importance of this Institution to the interests of education among us, and will be ready to do what in them lies to sustain its useful operations, and even to enlarge and extend its means of doing good. As a means of raising and qualifying future candidates for the Ministry of the Church in this diocese, its importance cannot be over-rated.

CHURCHES.—The applications for aid in the erection of new Churches have been more numerous during the year just closed, than in any preceding one. The Committee have gladly complied with the requests urged upon them, and have granted to

Making together an amount appropriated for aid in the erection of Churches and Chapels, of £295.			

The Committee feel it to be a duty to state with reference to this item of appropriation, that so long as this appeared to be their chief opening for usefulness, they were ready to attend to every call for aid from the Society's funds; but as they have now engaged in other most important portions of the work proposed to the Society, the support of Schools and travelling Missionaries, they will be compelled to consider future applications for aid in the erection of Churches, with a more strict regard to the terms in which that object of the Society is set forth.

The Committee also feel it necessary to call the attention of those who may have any future applications to make for aid in this department, to the necessity of supplying information with regard to the title of the ground on which the proposed building is to be erected. The aid of the Society cannot of course be given in any case where there exists any risk of the alienation of the building from the purposes for which it is designed.

The various appropriations thus referred to, amount in the aggregate to the large sum of £531 3s. 2d., independently of the vote just referred to in aid of a Schoolmaster's salary at Chester, and of the yet larger but more important appropriation for the support of visiting Missionaries during the coming year. The balance of less than £100, which appears in the Treasurer's Account on the 31st Decr., 1845, is more than appropriated on defraying the grants thus made.

It is not probable that the appropriations for the present year will be required to be as large upon some of these particulars during the coming year. The probable grants for these purposes will be about £300; to which when we add the probable grants for Schools, which may be put for the present year at £60, and in future years will be largely increased, and the appropriation for the support of travelling Missionaries of £400, the income of the Society for the present year requires to be augmented by the sum of at least £200.

The Committee have not agreed to these last appropriations without being fully sensible that the present income of the Society is insufficient to meet the expenditure which would be necessary in order to sustain such important operations; yet they have felt it a duty to make the attempt to discharge some portion at least of the obligations of a Missionary Society, and they throw themselves upon the grace and goodness of the Lord their God, in the faith that He will dispose the hearts of His servants to aid more liberally in this blessed work. They would urge upon the various Local Committees in the Province the duty to go on increasing

the amount of their contributions; but they would yet rather call upon the Members of the Church in the city to come forward and at least double their contributions to the treasury of the Society. They have been held back from more urgent appeals to the liberality of their fellow Churchmen in the city, so long as the income of the Society was more than sufficient to meet its annual appropriations—but now that they have engaged in a responsibility, to meet which a large increase of funds is necessary, they can confidently, and earnestly, and believingly appeal to all whom God in his Providence has blessed with the means to give, in much larger measure for the great design of sending the glad tidings of salvation to the sequestered cottages and secluded settlements of the Province, which yet have been but rarely visited by a Missionary from our Zion.

In the hope that there may be those, who, in a sense of the privilege of contributing to such an important work, may be disposed not only to increase their subscriptions but also to endow the Society with Lands, which though perhaps of no great present value, may be a source of future income to the Society. The Committee have it in contemplation to apply to the Legislature of the Province for an Act of Incorporation; they trust that a matter of such obvious justice, conferring simply upon this Society the means of managing its own affairs in a more satisfactory way, and by no possible implication interfering at all with the privileges of others, will be readily consented to by the Provincial Parliament,—and that this Society in its corporate capacity may be speedily invested with the means of carrying on its future operations for the Glory of God and the good of souls, in the form of a permanent endowment in addition to the annual contributions upon which it now depends.

The Committee have been led to think of applying for this privilege, by hearing of the advantages experienced in the management of their internal affairs by the Church Societies of Quebec and Toronto, which are incorporated by an Act of the Canadian Legislature.

The operations of those Societies, and of those of Fredericton and Newfoundland are deeply interesting to ourselves—of more recent formation than our own Society, they have outstripped us in zeal, in funds, in usefulness; yet, as we trust, that we are coming up more nearly to our responsibilities, we may hope that they with us may engage in a Christian rivalry to do good, and that we may each in the diocese in which it has been formed, go on to advance the Redeemer's Kingdom and spread the knowledge of His saving name. The Venerable Societies in England to which the members of the Church in this Province are largely indebted, are now constrained to limit their expenditures in this portion of the Colonial Empire.—How should we rejoice in the privilege of carrying on works which they have so benevolently begun, and of supplying their reluctant lack of service in places which they are unable now to aid; let it be our hope and prayer, that our Society, small as have been its beginnings, “may yet,” in the words of a Reverend Correspondent, “live to

emulate her great ancestor, which once had her day of small things, and now stretches her parental arms over the four corners of the earth."

May the Spirit of the living God be abundantly outpoured upon the Ministers and Members of our beloved Church; may He cause our present meeting together to promote His Glory and our mutual edification; and grant His grace to all assembled here, that they may go hence with minds and hearts more earnestly resolved to "work the works of Him who hath sent us, while it is day, since the night cometh when no man can work."

The Report having been read,

J. J. MARSHALL, Esq. M. P. P. and a Delegate from the Guysborough Local Committee moved the first Resolution, as follows:—

I. *Resolved*.—That the Report now read, be adopted, printed and circulated, under the direction of the General Committee.

Which being seconded by the Rev. CHARLES ELLIOTT, was agreed to.

The Rev. W. COGSWELL, Secretary of the Society then moved:—

II. *Resolved*.—That this Meeting rejoices in the advancing prosperity of this Institution: and desires, especially, to express gratitude to God, for the increased interest in the work of the Society manifested by the Local Committees, which have been some time formed, and for the readiness with which those of more recent formation have joined in the work.

Which was seconded by S. P. FAIRBANKS, Esq., Delegate from the Liverpool Local Committee, and passed.

The Hon. The CHIEF JUSTICE then moved, and the Rev. Dr. SHREVE seconded the following:—

III. *Resolved*.—That this Meeting desire to express their sense of the deep importance of early training, on the principles of true Religion, and rejoice that the Society have engaged in the endeavour, as their means may enable them, to supply at least, one School, conducted on the principles of the Established Church, to each mission in the Province.

Which was adopted.

The Rev. JAMES C. COCHRAN then moved as follows:—

IV. *Resolved*.—That this Meeting, thankful for the religious privileges they enjoy, rejoice over every effort to spread the knowledge of salvation among those less favoured than themselves; and desire to praise God that the Society has been encouraged to undertake the support of two travelling Missionaries who may convey to the most retired settlements and secluded cottages of the Province the glad tidings of the Saviour's love, through the regularly appointed Ministry of his Church.

Which being seconded by Dr. HENRY, P. M. O., was agreed to.

The Fifth Resolution was moved by the Rev. WILLIAM BULLOCK, and seconded by the Rev. R. F. UNIACKE and adopted, as follows:—

increasing exertions must be made to augment the funds of the Society; and would pray God to dispose the hearts of all to whom He giveth liberally to contribute, as He has blessed them, to the permanent endowment and support of a cause, which, they doubt not, is the cause of Christ and His Church.

The Rev. ALFRED GILPIN then moved the Sixth Resolution:—

VI. *Resolved*,—That this Meeting desires to express its continued sense of the obligation under which the members of the Church in this Province have been laid by the operations of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, and its deep regret at the necessity which lies upon those Societies to check their bounteous hand. It trusts however that the difficulties which have surrounded those Societies will but urge on our Sister Societies in Quebec, Toronto, New Brunswick, Newfoundland, and all the Colonies of the empire, to the more earnest endeavour to be, with the Society in this Province, worthy daughters of so Christian Parents, and thus encourage still further exertions among all the Members of the Church in the Parent Kingdom.

Which being seconded by A. M. UNIACKE, Esq. M. P. P. was agreed to.

L. M. WILKINS, Esq. M. P. P., and a Delegate from the Windsor Local Committee then moved the following:—

VII. *Resolved*,—That the thanks of this Society are due to the Right Revd. the President, the Vice Presidents, and other Officers, for their attention to the business of the Society during the past year: and that the same Officers and Committee (with the addition of S. P. Fairbanks, John W. Ritchie, and T. B. Akins, Esqrs.) be requested to continue their duties during the coming year.

Which was seconded by JOHN HECKMAN, Esq. M. P. P. and passed.

A collection was then made amounting to £38 12s. 2d.; and, the Doxology having been sung, his Lordship the President dismissed the Meeting with the Episcopal Benediction.

☞ Sermons were preached on behalf of the Society on Sunday the 8th March, in St. Paul's Church by the Rev. Dr. Shreve, and in St. George's by the Rev. W. Bullock. Collections were made after the Sermons. That in St. Paul's amounted to £42 12s. 2d., and that in St. George's to £21 1s.

APPENDIX.

As considerable inconvenience has been experienced by the General Committee from the want of attention to the following particulars, the notice of the Presidents and Officers of Local Committees is particularly requested to them, viz:—

The General Committee meets in Halifax on the third Thursday in each month from November to May inclusive; and all applications for aid should be forwarded to the Secretary at least a week before either of those dates.

Every application for aid should contain the following information, in defect of which the application must be postponed for fuller particulars:

For aid in the erection of a Church—

1. The precise situation, specially with reference to the nearest place of worship, and to the amount of population within five miles of the Church.
2. The title of the ground, on which the building is to be erected.
3. The size of the building; the numbers it can accommodate; and probable amount of the congregation that will usually attend it.
4. The supposed cost of the building; the progress it has made towards completion; and the amount of contributions on the spot in money or labour.

For aid to Day and Sunday Schools:

1. The title to the ground on which the School House is erected.
2. The situation of the School as regards the nearest adjoining School.
3. The number of scholars in usual attendance, and the general circumstances of their parents.
4. Is the Church Catechism taught? and the School generally conducted with a due regard to the principles of the Established Church?
5. The nature of the aid required: whether books, assistance towards Master's Salary, &c.?

The Annual General Meeting of the Society will for the future be held within the first ten days of Lent, or as near thereto as the General Committee shall decide upon: and it is desirable that Local Committees should hold their anniversary meetings, and make their annual collections some time in the month of January, in order that their proceedings and remittances may be acknowledged in the Annual Report presented at the General Meeting.

APPENDIX II.

For the information of Local Committees applying to the Depository of this Society for Books and Tracts, it is thought desirable to publish the following extract from the minutes of the General Committee, under date of May 7, 1841.

"The Chairman of the Sub-Committee, to whom the concerns of the Depository were entrusted, reported several resolutions which had been agreed to by the Sub-Committee, and are as follows:—

"I. *Resolved*,—That whereas the Diocesan Church Society can receive no books from the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge except to the amount of the sum remitted with the order, no books can be supplied from the Depository of the Diocesan Church Society, unless the orders be accompanied with a remittance to the full amount.

"II. That all outstanding debts due the Depository be immediately called for, and, until they be satisfactorily arranged, no further supply of books shall be issued to those who are in arrears.

"III. That be requested to forward their accounts without delay to the several persons indebted to the Depository, together with a copy of these resolutions.

"Whereupon it was *resolved*—

"That whereas the importation of books to the Depository must, by the present arrangement of the Book Fund, depend entirely upon the returns made for books supplied from the Depository, the Committee feel bound to approve of and adopt the resolutions of the Sub-Committee."

EXTRACTS FROM CORRESPONDENCE.

From Rev. W. Bullock, dated Digby, Oct. 1st, 1845.

"It affords me great pleasure to inform the General Committee that the four Churches in my mission, to which aid was derived from the Church Society, have been consecrated, and although from their distant position they cannot yet receive all the attention we could wish to give them, I look forward to the day, when possessing the ministrations of life and crowded with worshippers they shall speak aloud the usefulness and the blessing of our Society. The promotion of missionary services will do much to commend the Society to general support, and I feel both glad and grateful for the readiness with which the voluntary duties of Mr. Nichols have been acknowledged and his expences paid. . . . He now proceeds to Barrington at the command of the Bishop, where he will remain three weeks, or longer if necessary. His Lordship made great and successful exertions during his visit to reanimate the Local Committees, and I trust the whole body of the Clergy will see the absolute necessity of doing something more than giving to them a cold and inactive support. We ought to raise our annual income from £300 to £3000 a year. I am persuaded it can be done; and we should then supercede the necessity of dependence upon the great Parent Society, and supply her lack of service."

From Rev. T. C. Leaver, dated Truro, 18th Decr., 1845.

"I beg to inform you that a Branch of the Diocesan Church Society was formed in this Parish, at a meeting held for that purpose on the 9th inst. I am happy to be enabled to add, that the duty of aiding the Church Society in the sacred purposes in which it is engaged was promptly recognized by the Parishioners generally, and much willingness was manifested to contribute according to their ability, towards the furtherance of those objects.

At the present period when the great Societies in England are obliged to limit their expenditure in the Colonies, which for so many years have enjoyed their bounty, and when a door seems to be opening, in the order of Divine Providence, in Eastern Countries, for the admission of the heathen into the Church, it would seem to be doubly incumbent upon us to pray for the outpouring of the Divine Spirit upon the members of the Church, that they may be more deeply sensible of the duty and privilege of upholding the Church in its integrity in this Province."

From Rev. J. Robertson, dated Bridgetown, Jany. 7th, 1846.

"The General Committee will be glad to learn that an increasing interest in the success and usefulness of the Diocesan Church Society is daily manifesting itself in my mission, an interest which it is to be hoped will long continue to be felt.

In proof of this I may mention that a worthy and zealous member of the Church, resident at Digby, has made a grant of land for the purpose of promoting the objects of the Society in the Parish of Wilmot. A deed making it over to the Rector and Corporation of Trinity Church is now in my possession and shall be regularly recorded at the earliest convenience. The land is stated in the deed to be intended for the future site of a Church and Parsonage."

From Rev. T. Maynard, dated Rawdon, Feby. 13th, 1846.

"The Committee at Douglas has been re-established, we had a most excellent meeting there, and the spirit evinced on the occasion was very gratifying. At Rawdon also I think there is a disposition to contribute to the funds of the Society all in their power, but the people speaking generally are very poor. May God in His mercy grant that our contributions however small, may be given with the prayerful desire that they shall advance the interests of the Redeemer's Kingdom upon earth, and be made the means of carrying the knowledge of salvation to some of those who are sitting in darkness and in the shadow of death. Oh! if we all felt more deeply the vast importance of the work in which we are engaged, and with even our pence gave also our heartfelt faithful prayers that God would be pleased to pour out His Spirit upon us, what might not, yea! what would not the merest mite effect."

From Rev. T. H. White, dated Shelburne, 7th February, 1846.

"The claims of our Diocesan Society were laid before the congregations of the 'Church of the Resurrection' and the Parish Church on the morning and evening of the 25th ult., and collections made, the results of which is the sum of twenty pounds, nearly double you perceive of our last years remittance. This has been a heartfelt gratification to myself, for it shows that a sense of the duty and privilege of aiding in such a holy cause as that which the Society has in view, the cause of 'Christ and His Church,' is on the increase among us, and God of His mercy grant that a true Christian zeal on this subject may pervade every heart, until each and every individual may offer unto the Lord of his substance as God hath blessed him; 'he that hath much give plenteously, and he that hath little do his diligence gladly to give of that little.' I could mention two or three very touching and interesting circumstances connected with the gifts that have been cast into the Lord's treasury in this mission, but the fear of wounding pious feeling compels me to forbear. Among the names

forwarded are those of coloured persons some of whom give their dollars. Such facts should put to the blush many who with far greater means give less, less not only in proportion to their means, but less in amount."

From Rev. W. Bullock, dated Digby, February 10, 1846.

"The enclosed, is the remittance of my Parish to the Diocesan Church Society and I am gratified to find it considerably larger than that of any preceding year, and although still far less than I desire it to be, it will be one proof to you that the interest in your excellent work has not diminished in this quarter. We all feel that it should increase with the exigency of the Church, and that we already owe to your Committee a debt of gratitude, which can only be adequately acknowledged by the conversion of souls and the piety of future generations.

The Committee will be glad to learn that two other Churches aided by their grants have been consecrated in the past summer—that at Brier Island and South Range (now called 'Uniacke.'). These, with those at Marshal Town and Prince William have had our occasional services, and are attended by increasing congregations. We have now finished the exterior of another large and excellent Chapel at Rossway on Digby Neck—about eight miles from the town, and I hope in the course of a few days to open it, and to give it henceforth a share of our ministrations. I take this opportunity of thanking the Committee for the assistance rendered to this destitute part of my mission, and for the generous manner in which during the past four years, it has met the large demands I have made upon its funds. May God bestow upon the Society the only recompence looked for, in this liberality—an addition to the Church daily of such as shall be saved.

We have arrived at a crisis, and the Church Society *must* be supported—and she *will* be supported, or the fault will be with ourselves,—her destiny, under God, is in the hands of the Clergy, and if we feel our obligation and discharge it faithfully, she may yet live to emulate her renowned ancestor, who once had her day of small things and now stretches her parental arms over the four corners of the earth."

From Rev. Dr. Shreve, dated Chester, February 10, 1846.

"The Annual Meeting of our Committee was held on the evening of Friday, the 16th of January, and I am happy to say we were enabled to meet in our new School House, on Church ground. The building, a very neat and spacious one, 40 by 26 feet, with a partition in the centre and folding doors, is really an ornament to our little town, and a credit to those who have given their time, money and labour, to carry into effect the ardent wish of Churchmen here. On this occasion the house was well filled by between two or three hundred persons,—the old members cheerfully paid in their subscriptions and several new subscribers enrolled

their names—this will show that the interest in the welfare of the Society is not with us diminishing. . . . I cannot but again call the attention of the General Committee to the subject of *Church Schools*;—since, as it ever *has* been so it *still* is my firm conviction, that education to be really beneficial, must be *founded* upon religion. I was most happy to perceive, from a notice published in the Times newspaper, of the Quarterly Meeting of the Diocesan Church Society, held some time in Novr. last, ‘that the necessity seemed to be deeply felt by many members of the Committee, that an exertion should be made on the part of the Society to provide a Schoolmaster for every mission of the Province in connexion with the Church, and under the direction of the settled missionary.’ I was delighted to see this notice, because the experience of about a quarter of a century in the sacred office of the ministry has produced upon my mind a deliberate and growing conviction that the benefits arising to Society, even in a social, or civil point of view, from education *without* religion,—is of a very doubtful character; and that it is in vain to spend money to build Churches, and to establish ministers, *unless*, at the same time, *Church Schools* be added, to ‘train up children in the way they should go.’ All very well know that in almost every Parish there are parents who from casual circumstances, have withdrawn from the *communion* of the Church, though they assent in general to its doctrines;—there are *also* parents who perhaps attend alternately their parish Church, and some other place of worship more conveniently situated;—and there are *others*, *altogether indifferent* about religion. Now, what is to become of the children of such parents, when viewed as immortal beings, in connexion with the Church,—if they hear nothing of God and religion—nothing of the distinctive principles of the Church either at home or at School? It is on this account, that I have for some years past contributed, even *beyond* my *power*, to the building of School Houses,—*because*, I was well aware that *without* a *School*, every effort to reclaim the people, and to keep them in the bosom of the Church would be unavailing. I am happy to say we now have five School Houses in this Parish (beside the one in the town) the property of the Church, by deed to the Bishop in trust. In all these we *now* have the Catechism taught, the majority of the people being members of the Church,—*although*, under the present law of the Province, the clergyman has no controul over the teacher. In *one* School however in *each* Parish at least, the clergyman should have the superintendence,—that is, if we wish the education of the children of our communion to be maintained and extended upon sound religious principles. Now this cannot be effected if the Committee are from year to year, ‘held back by the fear that the funds at their disposal are inadequate to such an effort.’

I would therefore beg leave, in order to bring the matter at once to the notice of the Committee at the next General Meeting, now to make application for a salary for a teacher in our new School House, more especially as the members of our Church are at present unable to do much; owing

to the great exertions made, not long since, in the erection of the new Church, and still more recently in the erection of the School House."

From Rev. J. C. Cochran, dated Lunenburg, 20th February, 1846.

"I have nothing of very special interest to communicate to the General Committee from this quarter, unless an assurance of the continued anxiety of myself and people for the welfare of the Church Society, be so considered. If this assurance does not appear to be borne out by any increase in the amount of our contributions, I trust that will be attributed to the peculiar depression of the year, which has rendered some unable to continue their former support to the Society, although still as warm as ever in the cause. Changes, too, from other causes have taken place during the departed year, in our list of members: some have passed for ever from the present scene; others have changed the place of their earthly habitation, but we hope will still swell the lists from other Parishes. Yet after all this, we are thankful for an increase of forty members, sixty new ones having been added lately. It will be remembered also, that our number has sustained what may be called a comfortable diminution, by the establishment of the flourishing Committee at Mahone Bay, which is still within the Parish limits.

It is my constant endeavour to impress upon the minds of my people the duty of becoming Members of the Church Society; and I hope the day is not distant when every member of the Church throughout the land shall be enrolled upon the Register of that Institution. It seems very evident that for the support and extension of the Church within this Province, we must henceforth look more to our own Society, than to England; and it therefore surely behoves us all to redouble our exertions for the enlargement of its means of usefulness. Such efforts will no doubt be greatly stimulated by an energetic management of the Society's affairs, and by the *annual appropriation of every shilling of its resources* to the excellent objects set forth in its constitution. And of these, few will be more likely to open the hearts and hands of our people than the sending forth Missionaries to the destitute places of our land.

Notwithstanding all that the Clergy now residing in this country, can do, aided by lay readers and Schoolmasters, there must still remain many dark spots which they cannot reach, and which call for additional labourers. It is one of the most painful reflections that can visit a Missionary's mind, that so many souls are scattered over his extensive field of labour, and are continually passing from time to eternity, for whom, even if he does his best, (which, alas! who does?) that best is comparatively little. Numbers must still spend many a solitary Sabbath, uncheered and unblest by the Word and Sacraments of Christ and His Church. And under such circumstances the Lord's servant will often find himself putting up the prayer enjoined by his Master—that 'He would send forth labourers into His harvest.'"
