

Each subscriber is particularly requested to see that their envelopes are properly sealed and their names and pew number on the outside before it is handed in.

MISSION COLLECTIONS.

Collections for the Mission Schemes of the Church are received by envelope on the last Sunday of each month, and are placed in the boxes, which will be found on entering the Church just inside the doors.

If not convenient to give on the last of the month, any other time will do,

Those wishing to subscribe by envelope, and who are not at present supplied can secure envelopes by applying to any of the members of the committee or to Mr. Warren, Church officer.

It is expected that as far as possible subscribers will give a definite sum every month, and if subscribers fall in arrears they will be notified of the same as often as the committee think it best.

Minutes of the Annual Business Meeting

Of the Congregation of Knox Church

Held in the S. S. Room Wednesday Evening, January 18th, 1893.

The meeting was called to order promptly at eight o'clock, and after fifteen minutes had been spent in devotional exercises the Chairman, Rev. Dr. Fraser, announced that the meeting was open for business, and called for the election of a Secretary. Mr. Wm. J. Cunningham was appointed.

Moved by Mr. W. H. McLaren, seconded by Mr. H. S. Wallace, that the minutes of last year's meeting, as printed in the year book, be taken as read.—Carried.

The first annual report to be considered was that of the Session, which was read by the clerk, Mr. James Ogilvie.

Moved by Mr. John Wright, seconded by Mr. R. A. Campbell, that this report be received.—Carried.

The Managers' Report was then submitted by the Chairman, Mr. John Wright, who moved its adoption, seconded by Mr. David Brown. The Report was accordingly adopted.

In the absence of the Treasurer, Mr. James Dixon, the Financial Statement was submitted by Mr. W. H. McLaren, who moved that it be taken as read, and that it be adopted. The motion was seconded by Mr. James Ogilvie and carried.

Mr. Wm. Givin called the attention of the meeting to the fact that this was no doubt the first time in the history of our church that such a satisfactory report had been submitted. The congregation was now practically out of debt, and this should be a source of great thanks-

The election of three managers to take the places of those retiring this year by rotation was then proceeded with. Messrs. James Kilgour and R. A. Campbell were re-elected, and Mr. Andrew Richardson was elected to take the place of Mr. David Brown, who declined re-election.

Moved by Mr. R. A. Campbell, seconded by Mr. J. A. Attwood, that Messrs Samuel Malcolmson, David Brown and D. A. McNab be elected Trustees.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Alex. McPherson, seconded by Mr. Wm. Gillespie, that Mesrss.H. S. Wallace and Robt. Irwin be appointed Auditors for the present year.—Carried.

On motion of Mr. W. J. McFadden, seconded by Mr. John Wright, the following gentlemen were appointed Ushers for 1893: Messrs. Theodore Malcolmson, D. M. Campbell, John Dearness, Thos. Moved by Mr. W. H. McLaren, seconded by Mr. James Ogilvie, that the heartfelt sympathy of this congregation, assembled at its annual business meeting, be hereby tendered to the families of our late lamented office-bearers, Messrs. David McLellan, M. Brennen and Wm. MacAulay, who so worthily filled the various trusts imposed upom them by this congregation. Their memories will live long in our hearts, and often remind us of their good works. This motion was carried unanimously, and the Secretary was instructed to forward copies of it to the persons interested.

The Report of the Ladies' Aid Association was read by Mr. W. H. McLaren, who moved that it be received and adopted. Mr. John Wright seconded the motion, which was carried.

The matter of engaging an assistant to Dr. Fraser then came up for discussion, and as a result the following motion was carried unanimously:

Moved by Mr. Given, seconded by Mr. John Wright, that the Session of this congregation be authorized to take steps to secure a suitable man to take charge of the work in connection with the Mission all the year round, and also to act as assistant to Dr. Fraser generally in the work of this congregation, salary not to exceed eight hundred dollars per annum. It was understood that the consent of the congregation be secured before a final choice is made.

The subject of better Sunday-School accomodation was next brought before the congregation by the Superintendent, Mr. W. H. McLaren. He read the recommendation as printed in the REVIEW for December and also made clear to the congregation the fact that the wish of the officers and teachers of the School was that the improvements be undertaken only when the uccessary funds

were collected. The Sunday-School was unwilling that any debt whatever be incurred. Messrs. Wm. Givin, J. T. Barnard, and R. McRae each testified to the necessity for speedy action in the way of improvements, and it was finally moved by Mr. John Scott, seconded by Mr. W. H. McLaren, that the Session, Managers, Sunday-School and congregation as separate bodies each appoint three of their members who shall jointly form a committee to undertake the work as soon as sufficient money is raised. —Carried unanimously. Messrs. J. A. McNicol, H. H. Laing and H. S. Wallace were elected to act on this committee on behalf of the congregation. The other bodies may appoint their representatives when convenient.

The Report of the Women's Foreign Missionary Society was adopted on motion of Mr. R. McRae, seconded by Mr. James Johnson.

Moved by Mr. J. A. McNichol, seconded by Mr. Wm. Givin, that the Report of the Hopeful Workers Mission Band as printed be adopted.—Carried.

The Secretary's Report and Treasurer's Statement of the Missionary Committee were received and adopted on motion of Mr. W. H. McLaren, seconded by Mr. W. Givin.

Moved by Mr. J. A. Moffat, seconded by Mr. J. G. Cheyne, that the Report of the Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor be adopted.—Carried.

The Report of the editorial committee of the KNOX CHURCH REVIEW was read by Mr. J. A. Moffat, who moved its adoption, seconded by Mr. A. Leitch.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. H. H. Laing, seconded by Mr. H. S. Wallace, that the thanks of the congregation be tendered to the members of the editorial committee for their labor during the year, and that the necessary appropriation for

FORTY-NINTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

Managing Committee of Knox Church,

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31ST DECEMBER, 1892.

It is with great pleasure that your Managing Board present this year's report, showing the entire property to be free of debt, notwithstanding a small falling off in the amount contributed by envelope. We would respectfully call your attention to two facts in connection with our system of collecting revenue from which we may suffer if attention be not given to them, viz., the failure of younger members of families to become contributors when they grow up, and the failure to realize from new contributors amounts equal to those contributed by many of our former members, who from time to time drop out. In this connection we are pleased to notice on the part of several of our regular contributors an increased amount since the first of the present year.

The number of subscribers by envelope is 464, giving the sum of \$104.89 per Sabbath—a decrease as compared with last year of twelve subscribers and \$2.75 per Sabbath. The arrears at the close of the year were \$215.90.

The Managers who retire this year by rotation are Messrs. Kilgour, Brown and Campbell.

Your Managing Board would recommend that the Chairman of the Managing Board be also Chairman of the Ushers.

As God has blessed the labors of pastor and people in the past, so may he do in the future, is the great wish of your Managing Board.

We might say, however, that we do not make the matter of an ever-increasing membership our highest aim, although we count it an index of strength and progress. We would rather "seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness." The salvation of the precious souls in our midst claims our first attention and best efforts.

An absentee committee has been formed to look particularly after scholars who are not regular attendants and the parents of such children will find it to their advantage to consult and co-operate with this committee.

Our collections keep up fairly well. We have raised for general expenses \$271.72, and for Missions \$22079, an average of \$9.47 per Sabbath as compared with \$9.60 of last year. If these amounts are added to our regular collections the average will be increased to \$11.46 per Sunday.

During the year we have added to our building or School Improvement fund the sum of \$371.07, so that, with the loan to the Managers, this fund totals \$871.07.

Three very interesting events transpired during the year, viz.: Flower Sunday service on June 19th; the teachers' excursion to Niagara Falls on August 30th; and the Harvest Home service on September 25th. If we add to these the Annual Anniversary for the children on February 19th,; the Annual Picnic on July 5th; and Mr. McLaren's entertainment to the teachers of both schools on November 22nd, we have a catalogue of pleasant gatherings that will help to make the year a memorable one.

Through another year God's sparing mercy has been extended to us, and in presenting this, our twenty-fourth annual report, we desire to return our sincere and hearty thanks for the many blessings that have been vouchsafed to us during the year.

We are pleased to be able to report an increase in the Mission collections for the past year, but are sorry to note that the increase is not due to an increased number of subscribers, but to the fact of subscribers increasing their individual contributions. This state of affairs leads us to conclude that missionary zeal, while deepening in some quarters, is not spreading among our people generally.

During the past year we have had on our roll one hundred and fifty-seven regular subscribers, being thirty-six less than the previous year, while the total amount contributed, \$858.89, exceeded that of the previous year by \$57.13.

The average individual giving of each contributor is forty-five cents, which we think is very satisfactory indeed.

The average individual giving of our entire church membership is less than eight cents per month. We leave it for the congregation to say whether this is a matter for congratulation or not.

As a result of the stirring appeal recently made to the congregation by Dr. Robertson on behalf of North west Missions, a sufficient number of subscriptions of ten dollars each for five years has been obtained to support a missionary in some needy locality, which will be made known to us when an appointment is made, and which will the reafter be known as our special field.

THE Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor take pleasure in presenting their Annual Report as follows:

During the past year, although not having been as successful in regard to increase in membership as we could have wished, yet we are thankful to have been able to add to our roll twelve Active and thirty-three Associate members. Four Active and two Associate Members have requested that their names be placed on the Honorary list, and six Associate Members have been transferred to the Active list. Many times have we been called upon to bid farewell to our Active workers, no fewer than twenty-two having left our ranks during the past year, some of these going to distant parts of the country, but while we regret to lose them, we hope and believe that our loss is another's gain, and that they will still continue faithfully working for their Master.

Our roll at present is seventy-nine Active, four Associate and seven Honorary Members.

The work of the Society is carried on by eight committees, viz.: Lookout, Prayer-meeting, Social, Missionary, Visiting, Flower, Temperance and Relief, each doing good work in their respective departments.

We have had fifty-two prayer-meetings, all of which have been very well attended. We cannot tell what the result of these meetings has been, but trust that each has been productive of some good to all who have been privileged to attend them.

The Lookout Committee have endeavored to call on all those joining the Church, as well as visiting absent members after each consecration meeting.

We have held three very successful socials, one of these on Oct. 4th being the anniversary of the organization of our Society, at which we were pleased to meet and welcome friends from other societies.

Members of the Missionary Committee try, as often as possible, to attend the mission prayer-meeting; besides this they are in charge of a small missionary library for the use of members of the Society. The *Christian Herald* is also distributed regularly to the Central Fire Hall and two barber shops, where they are much appreciated.

The Temperance Committee, although unable to report any definite work, has adopted the Union Pledge, which has been signed by fifty-one of the members, each one promising thereby to do all in their power to oppose the liquor traffic.

Too much praise cannot be given the Visiting and Flower Committees for their grand work in visiting and taking flowers to the sick; the former having made seven hundred and forty-six visits during the year, and the latter, after decorating the pulpit every Sunday, has made up and distributed five hundred and twenty-eight bouquets, these flowers speaking words of comfort to many suffering ones, as has been frequently shown by the many expressions of gratitude received from time to time from those who bave been remembered in this way. We would take this opportunity of thanking all the friends who have so kindly aided us, either by sending flowers, or contibuting to the funds of the Flower Committee.

The Relief Committee has only been added this year, but some good work has been done by its members: such as watching by the sick, and doing what they could to help those in need. They have also aided the S. S. Super-

intendent by providing substitutes to fill vacancies caused by absent teachers.

While we know we have let many opportunities pass where we might have spoken a kind or encouraging word, yet we believe that as a society we have worked harmoniously together toward the same end, and trust that with the coming year we may all be more zealous than ever before, remembering
