JOHN WARD—PREACHER.

A Sharp and Clear Analysis of the Work by a Goderich Critic.

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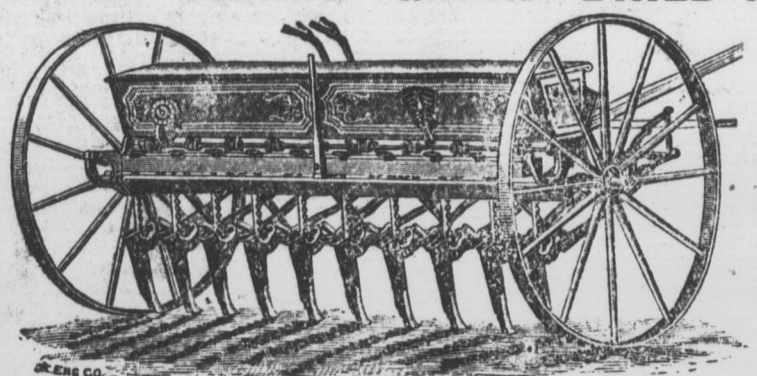

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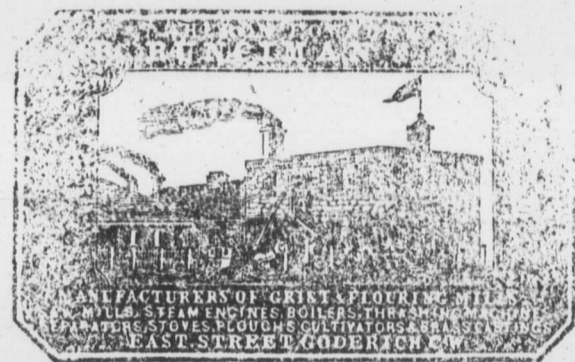
