

The Problem Of Apple Packing

Maxwell Smith Takes Exception to Views Held by Toronto Globe.

Qualities Which are Essential to the Properly Constructed Box.

The following article on "Packing Apples" appears in the Toronto Globe of July 9.

The problem of apple packing has not been solved to the satisfaction of the British dealers by our recent legislation fixing the maximum size of apple boxes. All the arguments in favor of the box as compared with the barrel seem plausible from the standpoint of the shipper, but the British importers are not satisfied with the change. They recognize the advantage of boxes, so far as economy in vessel space is concerned, but the question of cost is also decided in favor of boxes. It is the cost of almost any kind of lumber. But the dealers find that the cost of handling is an objectionable factor. It is not rolled about by one man, and though the rectangular packages are much smaller than the barrels in capacity, they require much more labor in handling, as each box is an objection on the ground of the smaller quantity disposed of at each sale. The merchants have as much trouble in selling a box as a barrel, and their trade is consequently rendered more costly.
