



BRITISH IRON TRADE.

A Sheffield despatch to the Manchester Examiner of the third says:

"In the heavy branches of the iron trade the approaching revival of trade is already making itself felt. Men are still busy on railway material and agricultural implements. The latter branch has been smually active for some weeks, and still promises to yield abundant work. In outlery some of the best houses have large orders in hand, and will nave no difficulty in finding their work-people employment for some time to come. It was thought the United States had thrown Sheffeld overboards of far as cutlery was concerned, but such is not the case, and many dealers who required good quality rather than cheapness have reopened accounts with local houses."
