

The formal declaration of the Union of the churches constituting, "The Maritime Baptist Convention" and "The Free Baptist Conference of New Brunswick" took place in St. John, New Brunswick, on the 10th day of October, 1905.

A similar Union was formally declared between the churches of "The Maritime United Bautist Convention" and "The Free Baptist Conference of Nova Scotia" in Yarmouth, Nova Scotia, Sept., 3rd, 1906.

By an act, re the Union of the Baptist churches in New Brunswick, passed in the New Brunswick Legislature on March, 22nd, 1906, the agreement to unite under the name of "The Association of the United Baptist churches of New Brunswick," became law and incorporation under that name was duly granted by the legislative assembly.

Inasmuch as a similar procedure, under the somewhat different conditions in Nova Scotia, may be necessary, it will be attended to-at the proper time, and the various names and titles, legal and otherwise, effected by the Union will be properly adjusted.

By the latest denominational returns in the Martine Provinces there are at present 588 United Baptist churches, 298 ordained ministers, 95 licentiates, 65,242 members with an adherency of about 185,000.

The formal Union between the Bay View and.

Beaver River United Baptist churches took place at Port Maitland, Dec. 7th, 1906.

Prior to this meeting the following resolutions were unanimously passed by the respective churches involved.

Resolution passed by the Bay View United Baptist church Oct. 3rd, 1906, whereas "The United Baptist Convention," and "The Free Baptist Conference of N. S., have united, and whereas we believe it would be to the best interests of the cause in these communities to have local Union consummated:

Therefore resolved that we as a United Baptist Church put ourselves on record as most heartily favoring and desiring Union with the Beaver River United Baptist church at the earliest possible moment.

Resolution passed by the Beaver River United Baptist, (formerly F. B.) church, Oct., 1906.

Resolved:—"That we are agreed to unite as a body with the Bay View United church on condition that the property (except the fixtures and furnishings) of the former Free Baptist church become the property of the United church, which shall also assume the liabilities of the former Free Baptist church.

Resolution passed by the Bay View United Baptist church, Dec. 7th, 1906:

Whereas the Baptist and Free Baptist denominations of Nova Scotia have united in one body and whereas the members of the former Free Baptist church have accepted the invitation of the Bay View United Baptist church to unite as one local church;—Therefore resolved that we accept the conditions as proposed by the former Free Baptist church.

And further resolved that we hearfily welcome

our brothers and sisters of the former Free Baptist church and trust that the Union now consummated will tend to advance the spiritual interests of all concerned and for the upbuilding of the cause of our Heavenly Master in these communities.

The above resolutions were unanimously carried at the respective business sessions at which they were considered and as far as it is discernible there is no disposition to dissent from the conclusion thus reached.

Readers will note that this was neither a case of a Free Baptist and Baptist church, nor of a Free Baptist and United Baptist church uniting, but the case of two United Baptist churches uniting. Re the Union of the two bodies these two churches had little to do. That matter was decided by all the churches and ratified by the general bodies namely, the Convention and Conference. The question we faced and so wisely decided was, is it economy for the members of one denomination bearing one name, to perpetuate two organizations having three places of worship within two miles of each other? God is praised in this sensible decision and the generations that follow will call us blessed.

As soon as the two churches had United the list of members of both churches was prepared in alphabetical order as it appears in list of members on page 11. It was a difficult task to provide such a list.

The names as found on the respective church, books were enrolled on the new-one.

When it was known that membership had been taken elsewhere the name was dropped. If any were omitted or added it was because of lack of knowledge concerning the facts regarding them. Let all be assured that any errors that may appear was entirely unintentional on the part of the editor of the directory.

# Doctrinal Statement of the Bay View United Baptist Church as adopted in the Basis of Union in 1905.

### DOCTRINAL STATEMENT.

- (1) The Scriptures—The Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments have their authority from God alone, and are given to us by divine inspiration. They are the only perfect supreme, infallible and sufficient standard of faith and practice.
- (2) God—There is one true living God; He is an infinite Spirit—self-existent, omnipresent, omniscient, omnipotent, good, wise, just and merciful. He is the creator, preserver and sovereign of the universe; He is inexpressibly glorious in holiness, and worthy of all honor, confidence and love. In the Godhead there are three persons in one—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, who are equal in divine perfection, and who execute distinct but harmonious offices in the great work of redemption.
- (3) Jesus Christ—Jesus Christ, the son of God, is the person of the Trinity who by virtue of his sacrificial work, is the world's Redeemer and the Saviour of all who believe. He is at present the intercessor of his people at the right hand of the Father, and is to be the Judge of all men.
- (4) The Holy Spirit—The Holy Spirit is the person of the Trinity by whom all saving, comforting and sanctifying power is exerted upon human hearts.
- (5) State and fall of Man—Man was created sinless. By his own disobedience he fell into sin. Through his fall into sin, an evil nature was transmitted to the whole race, revealing itself in actual transgressions, and bringing all under the reign of condemnation and death.
- (6) Atonement—The perfect life, vicarious death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ; have removed the obstacles in the way of the Holv Spirit's regenerating power and of the Father's forgiving

grace being extended to the sinner, and constitute for every believing soul an all-prevailing plea and sufficient ground for righteousness before God.

(7) Regeneration—In regeneration a new life principle is begotten in the soul of man by the Holy Spirit through the word of truth, producing a disposition to joyful obedience to Christ and to holy conduct in life.

(8) Repentance—In repentance, the sinner, having seen his sin, being moved by the energy of the Holy Spirit, is led to grieve for and hate it as an offence against God; and apprehending the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. he lovingly returns to God

to walk in the way of His commandments.

(9) Faith—Faith is a conviction of the intellect that God will perform all that he has promised, and an implicit trust of the heart in Christ as a personal Saviour. It includes a hearty concurrence of the will and affections with the whole plan of salvation as revealed in the gospel, and is a condition of justification and of cleansing from the pollution of sin and of all subsequent gospel blessings.

(10) Justification—Justification is an act of God, wherein he accepts as righteous the sinner, to whom is imputed the perfect righteousness of

Christ, on the condition of faith alone.

(11) Sanctification—The Scriptures teach that sanctification is the process by which according to the will of God, christians are made partakers of His holiness; that it has its beginning in regeneration, and that it is carried on in the hearts of believers by the presence and power of the Holy Spirit, in the continual use of the appointed means—the Word of God, self-examination, self-denial, watchfulness and praver.

(12) The Christian Sabbath-We believe that the first day of the week is the Lord's day or Christain Sabbath, and is kept sacred to religious purposes by abstaining from all secular labor and sinful recreations, by the devout observance of all the means of grace, both private and public, and by preparation for that rest that remaineth for the

people of God.

(13) A Gospel Church—We believe that a church of Christ is a congregation of baptized believers, associated by covenant in the faith and fellowship of the gospel; observing the ordinances of Christ, governed by His laws and exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by His word. In a more general sense the word church is used to designate all whose names are written in the Lamb's Book of Life. The only Scriptual officers are bishops or pastors and deacons, whose qualifications, claims and duties are defined in the epistles to Timothy and Titus.

(14) Baptism—This is the immersion of believers in water in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, in which are represented their death to the world, the washing of their souls from the pollution of sin, their resurrection to newness of life, the burial and resurrection of Christ, their resurree at the last day, and their engagement to serve God.

(15)—We believe that the Lord's Supper is an ordinance of Christ, to be observed by the churches in accordance with His instructions. Matthew

xxvi-26, 30.

- (16) Death—At death our bodies return to dust, our souls to God who gave them. The right-eous being then perfected in happiness are received to dwell with God, awaiting the full redemption of their bodies. The wicked are cast into Hades reserved unto the judgment of the great day.
- (17) Resurrection—There will be a judgment of the quick and dead, of the just and the unjust, on principles of righteousness, by our Lord Jesus Christ, at his Second coming. The wicked will be condemned to eternal punishment, and the righteous received into the fulness of eternal life and joy.


