## Miles of Stamps.

*From Happy Days.*

Uncle Sam printed just a few postage stamps during the year 1898. The number of 2-cent stamps issued during the year was about 2,500,000,000. Such a number, obviously, is beyond the grasp of the human mind, but perhaps the matter may be made more clear by putting it otherwise.

An ordinary 2-cent stamp is exactly one inch long. From this fact, by a little calculation, it is easy to discover that the number of stamps of this denomination issued in 1898, placed end to end, would extend a distance considerably exceeding 39 000 miles. In other words, they would make a continuous strip of stamps, each one adorned with the head of the Father of His Country, stretching in a belt more than once and a half around the equator.

Of course, though the 2-cent stamps are those principally used, there are others. Enough 1-cent postage stamps have been issued during the year 1898 to stretch from New York City, by way of Europe & Asia, to Bombay, India, if similarly arranged in one strip. All other stamps, as to production and sales, are of minor importance, comparatively speaking, but it is interesting to know that almost exactly one mile of \$1 stamps were manufactured for the demand of 1898. Of \$5 stamps the production was equivalent to a little more than half a fur-

long, or about one-fifth of a mile.

Now, if all the postage stamps printed by the United States Government in 1898 were placed one on top of each other, as nearly as might be without putting them under pressure, how high do you suppose the pile of them would be? There is no use guessing; you would never get it nearly right, unless you went to work to calculate it for yourself. The 3,500,000,000 stamps of all denominations printed the current year—the statement, of course, is approximate—would tower to an elevation of 21 miles. This is more than thrice the height of the highest mountain in the world—Mount Everest, in the Himalayas. If the same number of stamps was piled up in the form of the ordinary sheets of 100 each, it follows that the stack would be over a fifth of a mile high.

During the year 1898 the number of special-delivery stamps sold was about 5, 250,000. It is only reasonable to suppose that the average journey of the special-delivery messenger is half a mile. Indeed, that is an absurd underestimate; but let it go at that. On this assumption the distance traveled for special delivery in 1898 was about 2,625,000 miles. That is a very considerable space to traverse, as may be realized when it is considered that a messenger boy, in order to accomplish that total distance, would have to go about 11, 000 times around the world, or 5 times to the moon and back.

It appears, from figures furnished by the Postoffice Department, that the average person in Massachusetts, including men, women and children, spends \$2.30 on postage per annum. New York comes second, with an expenditure of \$2.27, and D. C., third, with \$2.16 Colorado is fourth, with \$1.93, and Connecticut is fifth, with \$1.80. The States ranking lowest in this regard are South Carolina, with 25 cents per capita; Mississippi, with 34 cents; Alabama, with 35 cents; Arkansas, with 37 cent, and North Carolina, with 41 cents.

### A Talk about Stamps.

A writer in the Stamp Exchange July No. tells us that the stamps of N. Brunswick which have been sold lately at 50c a set, are remainders which were recently sold to dealers.

He also states that Canadian Revenues are becoming more popular since the issuance of the new issue, which all reports say are very pretty, although as yet he had not seen them. He omitted to mention that all the unused Cuban and Porto Rican stamps now for sale are remainders which had been sold to dealers.

In the case of New Brunswick, whatever stamps were on hand when Confederation took place, were of course remainders and as there were not many collectors in those days quite a few stamps remained in some country post-offices—until hunted up lately by energetic stamp dealers and I only wish there had been a few of the British Columbia and Nova Scotian stamps left over as remainders, which would have been good enough for poor people.

I think Canadians will be surprised to hear that there is to be a new issue of Revenue stamps, perhaps they are the new Tobacco and Cigar stamps. They are indeed much handsomer than the old stamps, but the fellow who goes around cancelling them on boxes of Tobacco, nearly always manages to render them useless to collectors by punching the Queen's head full of holes instead of punching them only on the spot marked "Cancel here".

I have not seen any Newfoundland stamps offered at wholesale, advertised or mentioned in any Philatelic Paper except by the above mentioned writer in the Stamp Exchange.

### "Odd Collections"

The average collector only secures one specimen of each stamp issued by a given country and little dreams of the freaks and oddities collected by the specialist. He in turn is ignorant of many unique and "Positively Unique" (this latter by permission of "Drew" of Boston) collections which one will find in this country and abroad.

One collector collects in pairs, used or unused, and then in blocks of 4, 6 or 8 as the case may be, still another collects stamps by the entire sheets. A certain collector in England has a collection of the 1d blacks 1840, on the entire covers, each one dated and used each day while the issue was in use.

Some American collectors procure entire envelopes by the box. A collection of this kind is arranged on shelves the date, issue and size of the envelope being on each succeeding box, of course only the rich can indulge in this wholesale accumulation.

Several, in fact thousands, endeavor to secure, one specimen of the first issue of every county on the globe, but very few of these are complete as many of the first stamps issued are among the rarest of the race.

The collection of entires, both envelopes and adhesives, is very fascinating, the only thing that vetoes this among many collections is the space required for arranging and classifying them.

An odd and interesting collection of one collector consists of several hundred ordinary 1c and 2c stamps each one bearing a legible cancellation and representing all the large cities in the "Union". This can be secured by any collector, at a slight cost and which when shown to visiting friend (non collectors) will cut more "ice," as the kid says, than a collection of rare stamps. Right here I would say; it don't pay to show rare stamps to folks unless they are educated enough to appreciate them. As stamps worth 2c are just as interesting to the average person as one worth \$50.00.

The above are only a few of the many known oddities in the way of collections, there are probably hundreds of others just as interesting and unique.

### Honduras.

*Regarding Mr. Stone's Review in the "Era" and Other Points.*

Mr Stone, of the *Era*, took exceptions to a statement I made in an article Honduras in the July number of this paper. The statement was "These stamps, of course, never went to Honduras at all." After making a thorough research I find I have no authority for that statement, and most

graciously beg the pardon of all interested parties for having made the statement.

Mr. Stone says "I don't believe in running down the stamps unless you can back up your statements". Now I hold that I did not run down the stamps. That they could not be lower after my statement than before. The Bogert & Durbin Co. state in their own publication, No 267 page 37, "Our contract with Mr. Seebeck calls for 100,000 series and 200,000 extra of each of the 1c and 2c". How can it affect the status of these stamps by sending them to Honduras, they must be returned and could not be used in any postal capacity. I quote from Mr. Gremmel in No 44 of *The Post Office* "Would Mr Seebeck kindly let us know how many sets were sent to Honduras?" From which I would understand that Mr. Gremmel had some doubt of the stamps being shipped to Honduras. I think any fair minded collector will see that the simple act of shipping these stamps to Honduras and back, does not enhance their value nor establish their legitimacy.

The cry of philatelists seems to be against the "speculative" and "unnecessary issue." That every government has the legal and moral right to issue as many stamps as they like is beyond question. That collectors do not always know the necessary from the unnecessary issue I believe to be a fact. That stamps that A. wants, B. doesn't want. We all collect stamps for some purpose, that we should collect every stamp issued is far beyond my comprehension as it is beyond my pocket-book.

Let everyone collect such stamps as further the purpose for which he is making his collection. The multiplicity of stamps



must further this aim rather than deter it.

If the governments of the world were to issue a new series of stamps every year and collectors saw in them a chance to gain knowledge, pleasure or profit, let them be collected, otherwise leave them alone.

### Canadian Items.

An item recently appeared in the *Mail and Empire* reporting the receipt of a letter from Moscow, sixteen years after date of posting. Distance about one hundred miles.

This reminds me of Old Algate Pump in London, England. The pump a structure about six feet in height, on three stone steps, stood at a point where two streets met in V shape. For years the handle had been removed, and when improvements caused the removal of the pump it was found to have been used as a letter-box.

Lately I posted parcels of stamps to Russia and New Zealand, first making enquiries of the postmaster if same were sufficiently paid and everything all right. To my surprise they were received by dead letter post. Russian, marked insufficiently paid by 64c. New Zealand "No declaration." Fortunately my return card was on them or in due time those parties would have been put down as not over particular in making exchanges.

Moral: Use Starnatian Bros' printed envelopes.

I have noticed several reports that the P. O. department at Ottawa have a supply of two-cent purple stamped envelopes. This may be the case, but some time ago, \$22.50 sent for one thousand was returned with remarks, "issue exhausted."

We often hear the remark, what foolish-

ness to collect stamps but who are the most foolish, those who do or do not?

Stamp collecting was first introduced by a Belgium school-master in the early '40's who saw the benefits his scholars would derive.

Although the number of collectors has increased one thousand fold, there is still money to be made in collecting, at least that has been my experience, since again taking up the hobby.

Those readers of the *Philatelic Advocate* who noticed an article in a Toronto paper of July, representing the prices that an English firm would pay for certain values of Jubilee and Maple Leaf issues and anticipating sending any away, would do well to write first, or state the lowest cash price they will take. The writer knows of returns made on several varieties considerable less than prices referred to and on these varieties less than same would have brought here. Of course no blame can be attached to the firm, as the Stamp Market fluctuates the same as other articles of commerce, and no doubt the high prices sent considerable numbers of stamps across the waters

To date I have received over 82 postals for my booklet and all mention the Advocate.

There were 9 million 3c numeral surcharged 2c and only about 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  million maple leaf surcharged. Allowing for the stamps wasted by non-collectors there would be only about 1 million maple leaf surcharges for collectors so they will be a good thing to collect.

*The Manitoba Philatelist* will not appear owing to the ill health of the publisher.

*The Jubilee Philatelist* is a new monthly announced from Smith's Falls, Ont.

The Ontario Stamp Co., Trenton, Ont., is the name of a new firm of which Wm. Snyder is manager.

THE ADVOCATE is now the only monthly stamp paper in Canada. There are others called monthlies but as they appear about every other month they cannot be monthly.

Letters may be sent to Cape Colony now for two cents. When the rest of South Africa falls into line, the pressure on New Zealand and Australia will be very great and we may expect to have Imperial penny postage with these countries shortly.

The second Philatelic Exhibition will be held in Brooklyn, March, 1900.

**New Cancellation.**

Philadelphia's coming exposition is being advertised by means of postage stamp cancellation.

Postmaster General Smith has issued an order to the effect that hereafter all letters leaving the Philadelphia post office shall be cancelled with stamps bearing the imprint of the big industrial show. The use of the new cancelling machinery went into effect August 24th, when five of the cancelling machines in the central office began marking all letters in this manner. The fourteen remaining machines have since been supplied and now every letter that is delivered in Philadelphia or sent from there is stamped with the official imprint of the National Export Exposition.

The imprint is in an oval to the right of the regular post mark and reads as follows:

"N. E. T. L. EXPORT  
SEP. 14—1899—NOV. 30  
EXPOSITION."
