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

CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS. ONTARIO.

The number of transactions in white pine lumber during the past week has shown a slight increase, which is regarded by some as an indication that retailers and consumers are becoming convinced that lumber prices will not weaken in any marked degree in the near future. The conditions seem to favor the Canadian manufacturer of white pine, who, while experiencing a considerable local demand, is also receiving numerous inquiries for stock from the Eastern States. Some of these inquiries are due to the position taken by the manufacturers in the pine-producing districts of the United States, who have held their stock at what the eastern dealers consider in exorbitant price, and one not warranted by the demand. Generally, or r manufacturers have few complain of dull trade to make, as a brisk move ...ent of stock is not expected at this season of the year. Recent heavy rains have swollen the streams in the Georgian Bay district, and most of the logs are getting along satisfactorily. Une ieorgian Bay concern, however, reports that a large proportion of their logs will not reach the mill till September, so that the lumber cut from these can scarcely be marketed this year. It is estimated that 160,000,000 feet of logs will come out of the Spanish river.

The tendency is towards lower prices

for lath. The scarcity of this material has been relieved, and the demand at the present time is not large.

Hardwood lumber is moving only moderately. Consumers are pursuing a hand to mouth policy in respect to purchases, apparently believing that the dearth of hardwood lumber which characterized the trade of last year will not be experienced again this season. Notwithstanding the somewhat backward demand, manufacturers have been offering little inducement to buyers in the way of a reduction in price, and their action in this respect has greatly assisted in maintaining the strength of the market.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

The slight advance in the price of Quebec square timber seems to be justified by the receipts of timber at Quebec. The statement of the Supervisor of Cullers shows that up to July 14th the quantity of waney pine, white pine, red pine, and oak timber received at the port was less than in the corresponding period last year, while of elm, ash and birch there was a slight increase. The difficulty of securing tonnage, however, may have some effect upon the market. Only a moderate trade in lumber is doing in the eastern provinces. Export trade is satisfactory, but the demand from the United States has fallen off since the 1st of July. Notwithstanding, manufacturers and dealers look forward to a busy fall, although there is some uncertainty as to prices. Shingles are in steady demand. New Brunswick celars have shown but a slight decline in price, and seem to have secured a strong hold in the New England market. On Boston rate of freight quotations are as follows : Extra, \$3.10 to \$3 25 ; clear, \$2.65 to \$2.85 ; second clear, \$2.10 to \$2.35; extra No. 1, \$1.85.

UNITED STATES.

An increase in the number of enquiries for stock is about the only change in the lumber situation of the United States. Recent rains in Dakota and Minnesota have improved the crop outlook, and this has given retailers courage to buy lumber. Those who have been running along with light stocks are now more disposed to replenish their supply, but the uncertainty as to prices has had a deterrent effect. Several of the lumber associations, however, are holding meetings this week to establish a basis of prices for fall trade, and when this has been done a considerable movement of stock is confidently looked for. The indications are that building operations during the balance of

the season will be on a more extensive scale, as the prices of building materials generally are now somewhit lower than in the spring. A report from Minneapolis states that the demand for white pine lumber is more active than it has been for a month past, and that the farmers in the vicinity are undertaking improvements which were temporarily abandoned. In Chicago the most active demand pertains to common inch lumber. Twelve inch No. 1 boards, in lengths from 12 to 16 feet, are selling at \$20 wholesale, and shorter lengths at \$19. The reports from Boston tell of a slow movement of spruce, but notwithstanding this fact prices are being maintained. In the New York market narrow strips are selling at \$16 to \$18 and wider widths at \$17 to \$19. The feature of the hardwood trade is the continued buying in a small way by consumers, who seem to prefer to take the chances of getting stock as required. Oak, elm and basswood are selling moderately at Buffa-lo, but in Wisconsin it is reported that tl ere is very little demand for hardwoods with the exception of basswood. Maple flooring is showing great strength, although the effect of the large production of maple logs last winter has had some effect on the price of maple lumber and planks.

There is very little demand for lath, and the price is gradually declining from the high figures at which it was sold last winter. At Bay City and Michigan current quotations are \$3 and \$3.50, against \$4 and \$4.50 a few months ago. The yard price at Chicago for 110. I white pine lath is \$3.75, while No. 1 mixed sells at \$3.25 and No. 2 mixed at \$3.

GREAT BRITAIN.

The tendency of the British lumber market is towards further strength. The high freight rates are a strong factor in the market, as they are likely to result in reducing the quantity of stock imported. The complications in China will doubtless be responsible for the building of several new vessels, in the construction of which a considerable amount of lumber will be used. It seems reasonable, therefore, to expect a liberal demand for lumber during the next few months. Pine and spruce deals are now arriving in considerable quantities, but the bulk of the stock has been contracted for previous to its arrival. At Glasgow there are numerous enquiries for spruce, particularly in sizes of to inches and up. First quality pine deals have been sold in that market at \pounds 28 17s 6d, and boards at \pounds 32, while third quality dears have brought £12 15s. At Liverpool waney board pine is going freely into consumption. Ouebec elm has also been in good demand, and practically every log that has arrived has gone into consumption direct from the quays. The import of birch has moderated, and although the consumption has been good, prices are slightly weaker.

SHIPPING MATLERS.

The str. Manchester Shipper has been chartered by Geo. McKean to take a cargo of deals from West Bay, N.S., to Manchester, at 528 6d.

The str. Pocohontas is loading deals at St. John, N.B., for the U.K. The barque Inver-lochy has been fixed to load deals at same port for Melbourne, Australia, at 75s.

The news has been received of the destruction by fire of the Canadian Yukon Lumber Company's mill at Selkirk, in the Yukon district.

STOCKS AND PRICES.

The str. Janeta sailed last week from St. John, N. B., for Glasgow, with a carko of deals.

The str. Hueloa is loading a cargo of deals at Quebec for London, consigned by McLean, Kennedy & Co.

The str. Labuan is loading a cargo of three and one-half million feet of lumber at West Bay, N. S, for the U. K.

Haley & Son, of St. Stephen, N. B., ave recently shipped several car loads of box shooks to the British market.

The Millen Arnold Lumber Company, of Duluth, recently sold 8,000,000 feet of lumber to Albany parties, at \$18 for No. 2 and better.

The steamship Nitocris took on a full cargo of timber and deals at Indian Cove, Quebec, and sailed for Dublin, Ireland, on the 15th inst.

The Michigan Hemlock Association is reported to have reduced the price of hemlock one dollar a thousand, making the quotation \$9.

The Saginaw Lumber and Salt Company, Saginaw, Mich., are reported to have sold their entire production of pine lath at \$3 and \$3.50.

At Buffalo quotations are \$8 to \$8.50 for first class dry elm flour barrel staves, 6 to 6 4 cents for first class dry basswood heading, and \$9 to \$9.50 for 6-foot coiled hoops.

B. J. Gilligan has 9.000,000 feet of pine logs almost out of the Plantoin Creek, which empties into the Mattawa river The logs were taken out for the Hull Lumber Company, of Hull.

A report from Marinette, Wis., states that one firm there sold 500,000 feet of elm lumber early in the spring to New York parties at \$20 per thousand, while they are now selling similar stock at \$15.

It is reported that the Skillings, Whitney & Barries Lumber Co. have purchased the entire cut of the Longford Lumber Co., and that the output of Messrs. Mc-Pherson & Co., of Longford Mills, has been bought by the Laidlaw Lumber Co.



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
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
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
