





Mr. Siddall informed the committee that since his last' report had been sent in he had been in communication with the Dominion Bridge Company, with the result that he had secured a further modification of the steel buttresses, which would reduce the additional estimate of \$35,500 by \$7000.

To Ald. Leslie he said the Dominion Bridge Company had approved of all this.

Engineer Rust handed in the report, which he had been instructed by the Board of Control in the morning to make. Its essential clauses read as follows:

"I am of opinion' that the safest course to pursue is to take the piers and the south wall down and have them rebuilt in cement mortar. If cement mortar is used the old bricks could be utilized. Also that the piles should be cut off to the water level and covered with at least two feet of concrete. If this is done Mr. Siddall's







YORK COUNTY AND SUBURBS.

Township Council Will Provide \$2380 to Run the Junction Schools Till August.

BIG CONCERT IN EAST TORONTO.

Toronto Junction, May 25 .- The regular meeting of the Public School Board was held in the Council Chamber to-night, with Dr. Mavety in the chair. The board passed a resolution instructing principals of the schools in town to refund the amount of \$1 per month charged to non-resident pupils. It is the intention of the board to instruct Mr. A. H. Royce to collect from the Township of York the sum of \$2380, now in their hands, which will run the schools until August. Under the impeachment of this tradition, almost universally held, that the property of the nuns was the scene of Wolfe's great victory, a thero search was undertaken in the Imperial departments, the Tower of London and other public record offices in London, the United States and France, for the purpose of establishing the actual site of the battle beyond any possibility of further dispute. The assistance of the most prominent public men of both Great Britain and Canada was invoked by the searchers after bistorical truth, and the result has been the discovery of a valuable mass of hitherto unknown manuscripts, maps and plans of the time of the British conquest of Canada. Every one of these plans and maps shows conclusively that no part of the battle of 1750, which decided the fate of New France, was fought upon the ground now known as the Plains of Abraham. The original title deeds of the property have been found and traced, and they show that the present sup-posed site of the battlefield never formed any part of the battlefield never formed any part of the original Plains of Abraham, and never belonged to Mattre "Abraham," or Abraham Martin, who gave his name to the property upon which the battle was fought.
