REPORT

OF THE OPERATIONS OF THE PRIMITIVE METHODIST MISSIONARY SOCIETY,
CANADA, FOR THE YEAR ENDING APRIL 30th, 1856.

A GREATER work than that of evangelizing the world, by the extension of Christianity, cannot engage the attention of mortals. The spread of commerce, the circulation of knowledge, the downfall of empires, are of small importance, when compared with this. The statesman, who makes laws; the warrior, who spreads the fame of his country; the man of science, who reveals nature; and the philanthropist, who acts the part of the good Samaritan towards his abject fellow-countrymen, are doing but little to elevate humanity, and spread the divine glory, when compared with those who are daily engaged in spreading the doctrines of the cross; for, however science may spread, learning abound, additional territory be won, benevolent Institutions increase, it is, after all, only righteousness that exalteth a nation. The page of history, however cursorily read, will confirm the truth of these remarks.

The Committee of the Primitive Methodist Missionary Society, while they rejoice in the success of every measure, whether of commerce or science, legislation, or philanthropy, that bears on the well-being of men, believing that nothing can save our sin-stricken world but the Gospel,—not the Gospel as represented by some schools of learning, who mix the word of man's wisdom with the pure word of God, and exalt reason to an equality with inspiration; nor as some would have it, who mix therewith the traditions of men,—but the pure Gospel, which was proclaimed by the great Master, preached by the Apostles, revived by the Reformers, defended by Martyrs, and held forth by a Wesley, a Whitefield, a Knox, a Morrison, a Coke, a Clowes, a Bourne, and many others, who, in different nations, amongst numerous tribes, and in various periods of the world's history, have seen numberless instances of its power, causing them to subscribe to Paul's noble declaration, "I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God unto salvation to every one that believeth, to the Jew first, and also to the Greek."

The Committee, therefore, rejoice in the spread of the Gospel in every part of the world, no matter what section of the Church may be honoured with that sacred embassy. No one section of the Church, as at present constituted, could possibly spread the Gospel throughout the world, as speedily, as all the sections labouring in harmony for this object could do: how pleasing, then, to a christian mind, that while the section of the church with which we are members is unable to enter every open door that presents itself to the heralds of salvation, that there are other sections who are sending their agents to those parts, so that souls are won to Christ, the triumphs of the cross are displayed, false systems of worship are destroyed, and blessings innumerable find their way to the miserable abodes of men. How glorious is the theme now under contemplation! How prolific in sentiment! How rich in ideas! How vast and comprehensive the work that is contemplated! Look at China, with its numerous inhabitants; India, with its teeming millions; Africa, with its down-trodden, oppressed, and superstitious population; Australia, with its gold mines, and rapidly increasing inhabitants; or the Islands of the Southern Pacific, the frozen climes of Greenland and Labrador, or the countries that come under your observation on the Continent of Europe, or in your highly exalted America; and in all these parts "the common salvation" is preached, in more than *six hundred* languages and dialects of this babel earth. This, we believe, fills the minds of angels with unmingled delight.

The Missionary Society, whose Report is now in the hands of the reader, though by no means so gigantic in its operations as some others that could be named, yet we believe the time will come when its influence will be far more powerful than it has yet been. Already, in connection with its honoured Parent, to whose fostering care it owes not a little of its strength and stability, it has brought many hundreds to Jesus, who are now travelling to Mount Zion, and were it in our power to view the great multitude, there would be found not a few who owe their elevated position to the instrumentality of this Society.

The year 1855 is one never to be forgotten. The awful scourge of war was then spreading devastation everywhere. By it millions of lives and treasure were sacrificed. Balaklava, Inkermann, Sebastopol, have now become household words. But fearful as was

the desolation thus made, every son of Britain must rejoice that many soldiers, while fighting their country's battles, were also distinguished soldiers of the cross, and laboured with great zeal to extend the blessings of redeeming mercy to their fellow-soldiers, who, with themselves, nobly faced the enemy. But, alas! though the war has closed, (for which we desire to be thankful to the giver of all good,) yet heavy are the burdens which the people have had to bear in consequence. Taxation, which was always heavy, has now become more oppressive, still the people, to their honour be it recorded, bear it patiently.

As might be expected, the resources of various Religious Societies, in Britain, have been much below what they otherwise would have been, had war not been raging; and, doubtless, the May Meetings, which are being held in Exeter Hall while we are penning these lines, will exhibit a state of finance far from flattering; but we know too much about the liberality of Britain's sons, to suppose that they will cease their active labours for the world's salvation. The day of trial will pass over, when the supplies will again be more plentiful. We understand the income of the Wesleyan Missionary Society in England, has actually been £119,000 sterling. Astonishing for a year of war, and highly creditable to all concerned.

The English Primitive Methodist Missionary Society, being supported almost entirely by the labouring population, has had hard to struggle during the past year, though we must do our friends the justice to state, that their ordinary income has suffered but little diminution; but one source, from which they derived an unusual supply of means for a few years, having entirely failed, they were compelled to close their accounts for the year 1855 with a serious amount of debt, and the prospect of that debt increasing, rather than otherwise. This is the more to be regretted, as that honoured Society never had a wider field of usefulness before it, and better prospects of success, than now, if men and means were but forthcoming. The calls for additional Missionaries from Australia, and New South Wales, are both long and loud. A feeble reinforcement has been sent to these respective fields of labour, but they are as nothing to what are wanted; while our friends are also anxious to strengthen the hands of their Missionaries at home, and take a more vigorous part than they have ever yet done in Ireland's evan-

gelization, they are not, we are happy to say, regardless of Canada's cry for help. Last year, it will be remembered, we ventured to ask for £2,000, and *sixteen* Missionaries, but this was too much to ask at once; however, we have received three beloved brethren from the Parent Society, viz. Revs. G. Wood, T. Nattrass, and J. R. Swift. As to pecuniary matters, it is a source of trial to the Committee in Canada that they have still to be so far dependent on the liberality of England, for means to carry forward the work of God amongst us; though we rejoice to state, that for the year just closed, we did not draw so heavily as on some former years; and we trust that the time may soon arrive that Canada's liberality will be commensurate with her means; then our Missionary Exchequer will be well replenished, and the Parent Society will have the more at its disposal, to evangelize the more destitute parts of the earth, which are full of the habitations of cruelty.

The Committee must now proceed to lay before its numerous friends and generous supporters some details respecting the past year's operations, which, though by no means so prosperous as we could have desired, yet they are such as to justify us in stating, that the smile of heaven is evidently resting upon the agents of this Society. Besides making up for the losses sustained through various removals, declensions, &c., the Committee are happy to find that there is a net increase of 217 Church members in the Stations under their care; *three* new Stations have been supplied with Missionaries, and *three* other places are anxiously waiting for messengers of salvation. The operations of the Society have increased in other respects, so that while *one* of the Missionaries lately in the service of the Society has seen fit to withdraw, and labour in another section of the Church, and a *second* has seen fit to locate, thereby weakening the hands of the Committee, still they see cause to "thank God and take courage."

The Committee respectfully submits the following summary of notices respecting its Stations, being confident that they are such as will meet the approval of those whose liberality has enabled them thus far to progress.

Reach. The increase for the year on this Station is 20. It was contemplated by the Committee, that this Mission should this year have become a Circuit, as they do not wish to assist in maintaining places that ought to support themselves, but another year's care

was asked for, and the Committee consented, trusting that the official brethren will see it to be their duty next year to be made into a Circuit.

Galt and Guelph. This united Station has progressed a little during the year, there being an increase of *eight* members. It continues to draw heavily on the funds. At the urgent request of some friends at both places, the Conference decided that the Station should be divided, and one Preacher stationed at *Guelph*, and another at *Galt*. We hope the arrangement will be conducive to the spread of the cause at both places.

Orangeville. The Committee regret to state, that here there has been a small *decrease* in the number of Church members. The Mission is laborious, and some outposts were vacated, as they were too distant to be efficiently worked by the Missionary.

Kingston. There has been an apparent decrease on this station, occasioned by a transfer of members to *Portland*. The Missionaries have laboured to establish societies in some parts of the country where our Church is not much known, and have met with some success. The Chapel in the City has been settled on trust for the Connexion, and, with a view to pay more attention to the City, *Bath Road* has been made into a separate Station.

Peel and Wellesley. The Missionary placed in charge of this Station last year has thought fit to follow the example of his predecessor, and retire from our work, and leave his post almost at a moment's notice, so that for several weeks there has only been one Missionary labouring, instead of two. The number of members is less by *four* than last year, but the Committee is thankful that this number is not larger. A Parsonage has been erected, which was much needed, and the Committee hopes that the ensuing year will be one of peace and prosperity with our esteemed friends in this section of our Israel.

Woodstock. The Committee regret to say, that here also there has been a decrease of members, there being *nine* less reported than last year, which is a source of grief to all concerned.

London. The increase for the year is 16. The Missionaries have made several new openings westward of London, and they assure the Committee, that they consider the prospects very cheering, and fondly hope that the ensuing year will be one of great success.

Brantford and Paris. The Town of Brantford has, during the last winter, been visited with an astonishing work of grace, which has not been confined to one section of the Church of Christ, but in the Episcopalian, Wesleyan, Congregational, Baptist, and Primitive Methodist Churches, the arm of the Lord has been made bare. Our brethren report an increase of 33. They have laboured under various disadvantages in both towns, for want of better places of worship. One Chapel has been opened during the past year, and subscriptions, to a cheering amount, have been taken up for one in Brantford. The present Mayor, W. Mathews, Esq., has lent his valuable aid to our brethren in this undertaking, which, the Committee believes, will prove a great blessing to our infant cause in that town.

Portland. This Mission continues to prosper; there are now 212 Church members. During the year, some members have been given to it from Kingston, in addition to which, several others were added during a very excellent revival, with which God was pleased to visit the Station.

Bosanquet. The Missionary labouring here has succeeded in gathering 35 members into the Church, and has established service at eight places, and is taking steps towards building a Chapel.

Brant and Durham. Here 26 members have become identified with our Church, and 11 places opened for preaching. The Missionary, Brother Lomas has succeeded, with the aid of friends, in getting a Parsonage erected; he has done much of the carpenter work with his own hands, and has also laboured in the harvest field, as a day-labourer, that he might get parties to assist in the building. He speaks flatteringly of the surrounding country, and loudly calls for an Assistant Missionary; but the Committee, not having men and means at its disposal, sufficient for such a purpose, are necessitated to wave such calls.

St. Vincent. This is a new Station, opened since the last Report was issued. The Missionary visits four different Townships, and holds services fortnightly, or otherwise, at eight places. The number of members reported at Conference is only 14, but it is confidently hoped that this number will soon be considerably augmented.

Napanee. This Station, situate about 25 miles from Kingston, was taken up last summer, and in the succeeding fall the Missionary held a most successful Protracted Meeting, as the result of which he has

been enabled to report an accession of 50 members, with the most cheering prospect of usefulness. God grant that the work may still prosper.

In addition to the above, it will be seen that the Committee contemplates sending Missionaries to *Osprey, Walsingham, Montreal, and Minto*, but how much time must elapse, before they will be able to do so, remains to be seen. At the first named place, there are at least some 20 or 30 members settled from one Circuit alone; and a kind friend has engaged to give a portion of land for a Chapel and Parsonage, as soon as a Missionary is sent. At the *second* there are also several members of society settled, who have begun to hold meetings among themselves, and promise to raise a considerable portion of a Missionary's salary. The Committee is very desirous to supply both these places as speedily as possible. The others are places of importance, and are deserving of attention from the friends of the Society.

In the Report of last year, allusion was made to the timely aid rendered to the funds of the Society by reason of some Juvenile friends in Toronto, and a hope was expressed, that on the various Stations efforts would be made to enlist the co-operation of our young friends in general; but the Committee regrets to state, that from only *two* stations have remittances been made for the Juvenile Mission Fund; *one* or *two* others have raised small sums, which have not been sent to the Treasurer in time to be acknowledged in this Report. The Committee would beg respectfully to call the attention of our Superintendent Ministers to this matter, with the hope that, on all our Stations, a few Cards may be put in circulation amongst our young friends. The Committee would also suggest to the various Deputations appointed to the next Missionary Meetings, the importance of making allusion, in their addresses, to the necessity of action amongst our young friends. Suitable Cards have been prepared by the Committee, which will be forwarded to all applicants.

The Committee also beg to express their continued sympathy in the progress of the kingdom of Christ, in connection with the two Conferences of the Primitive Methodist Church in the Eastern and Western States of the neighbouring Republic, and begs to express a hope, that the time is not far distant, when from one or both these Conferences there shall be a Representative attending our Canadian Conference, which will doubtless reciprocate the kind feelings which such an interchange would produce.

CONCLUSION.

The Committee, in drawing their Report to a close, beg to thank all those by whom they have been assisted in the past, and assure their friends that nothing shall be wanting on their part to retain that confidence hitherto reposed in their management and fidelity. The income of the past year, as the Balance Sheet will show, has been very encouraging, although at the beginning of the year the funds were greatly embarrassed, and fears were entertained that the Committee would not be able to get through the year comfortably. We are sorry to say that, at one quarterly meeting, the Committee was obliged to reduce the allowance of the Missionaries 15 per cent. The Balance on hand, at present, will doubtless appear great, but, it must be borne in mind, that more than this sum will be required by the Committee to meet the quarterly allowances of the Missionaries, before any other remittances can be made from the Stations on account of Missionary Meetings; and we have no certain grounds to calculate that the Parent Society, in England, will be able to make us any remittance during next year. The Canada Conference, at its last session, adopted an appeal to the British Conference, for an Annual grant of Missionary Money; how far the appeal may be responded to, remains to be seen. The Conference also resolved, that instead of making up the deficiencies of Mission Stations, as heretofore, that the Committee, should make out a list of the appropriations for the respective Stations, and use every means possible to induce the Stations to raise a proportionate share of the sums required, to meet their expenditure, in order that the Committee may have the means to assist in still further extending the glorious Gospel.

The case, then, is now before our friends. The present income of the Society will barely sustain the ground already taken up, while every part of Canada is open to receive the messengers of salvation. The poor Indian waits for Christ's ambassadors; the Romish Church is labouring, with great zeal, to inundate the land with its errors and corruptions, while thousands are every year pouring into Canada from the old world, and finding their way to our back woods, and would be glad to be told of the way of Salvation. Hence, every section of the Church must be up and doing; Canadian Christians must learn to "give as the Lord hath prospered them." They have not yet come up to the Scriptural standard. The scale is too low.

Hundreds are accumulating wealth, purchasing land, and making fortunes for their children, while their contributions to the cause of religion bears no proportion to the amount of their gains.

The cause of God greatly needs an increase of suitable labourers. How few are training their children for the Church! Their education is cared for, influential stations are looked after, and all seem anxious that their descendants should rise in the world, but where are our Hannahs "lending their Samuels to the Lord?" Is not the Missionary work honourable? Why are Christians so reluctant about having their sons and daughters engaged in this holy work?

The greatest want is an increase of holiness in the Church. The Church has too little of the Spirit that lived and breathed in Christ. There must be more prayer for the outpouring of the Holy Ghost. The Church must have a deeper Baptism. O that the ensuing year may be greatly distinguished for "showers of blessings!" Every requisite would then be forthcoming; men and means would not be so scanty as now. The Church needs to feel its individual responsibility. Each member must be brought to ask himself, "what am I doing for God?"

With a view to beget a spirit of greater earnestness infused into the Church, the Committee would respectfully urge that more attention be paid to the monthly Missionary Prayer Meeting. On no account let this be omitted. Whenever practicable, let preparatory Sermons be preached on the Sabbath previous to the Missionary Meeting, and in numerous instances a Sermon might be preached on the afternoon of the day on which the Public Meeting is held. Regardless of the gain, in a pecuniary sense, much spiritual good might thus be accomplished.

"Blessed be the Lord God, the God of Israel, who only doeth wondrous things. And blessed be his glorious name for ever; and let the whole earth be filled with his glory: Amen and amen."

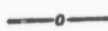

2. The Editor thanks the brethren for the punctual manner in which they have forwarded their returns. There were only some two or three sent in after the 1st of May.

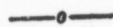
3. It is more than probable that some names will have been wrong printed, for, in looking over the sheets before sending them to the printer, there were several names that we were not able to make out.

5. Missionary Money must be sent to the Treasurer with as little delay as possible, after it has been collected; so that he may be able to prepare his books for the Conference.

6. The Editor regrets the late appearance of the Report; but circumstances prevented him getting it ready sooner, so that he hopes to be exonerated.

7. For the correctness of the additions of the various Stations, the Secretary, whose name is inserted at the foot of each return, is responsible.
