on Railroads being formed in all these Provinces as highly necessary agents, in effecting a measure which was of the first importance to the prosperity of British North America. But he trusted that a time was now coming when all prejindices and local in-fluences would be forgotten, that Canada would overcome all such distinctiveness, and that associ-ation with her sister Colonies of smaller means and dimensions would ever by her be looked upon with favour; and he (Mr. J.) viewed the Railroad as a measure of the first importance in efforts of small countries to enhance their own consequence and nagoing their dimensions, to what is commonly seen, when a being of less then ordinary dimensi-net and stature endenvors to make up for his min-nature size by assuming a straightened figure, a pompous strut, and look of importance; that argu-ed, that such was often the effect of small colo-nies, in their individual politicial efforts.
