In the aggregate this is the smallest number of vessels sunk dur-Old Sea Captain Cured His Own Rupture After Doctors Said "Operate or Death." ing any one week since Germany began her intensified submarine warfare last February. Two fishing vessels also were sunk last week. The previous week's loss by tonnage, said to be 62,000 tons, was the smallest aggregate in this respect since February.


