A Breeze on the Mexican Border. The United States troops lately crossed the Rio Grande in pursuit of a band of marauding Indians and attacked them on Mexican territory. This move was provoked by the inability of the Mexican officials to prevent raids into Texas and their failure to punish the raiders.

The Pope and Thiers. The story told by the Paris correspondents of the German papers—namely, that the movement for the overthrow of Thiers began in the Vatican—is confirmed by the gratification expressed by His Holiness at the elevation of MacMahon to the Presidency. Mr. Thiers did very much to consolidate the Vatican, and his was a successful mission.

The telegraph reports to-day that Sir Hugh Allan has succeeded in getting a portion of the money required for the building of the Canada Pacific Railway, the rest to be supplied as required.

London, May 27. A fire occurred this morning in Berkeley Square. Six persons were unable to escape from the burning building and perished. Six others were injured by a falling wall. No water was available and the flames spread with great rapidity.

A Paris despatch says the new French Government has resolved to adopt the free trade policy, and to reduce military expenditure.

Four thousand Indians have assembled at New Westminster, from all points of British Columbia, under pretext of holding a council. Dr. Powell, superintendent of Indian affairs in that region, will meet the Indians to-morrow to hear their grievances.

A fire broke out in a hotel in Bedford, Canada, Saturday night, destroying a large portion of the village, including the town hall, three hotels, and the leading stores.

General Angur telegraphs that the Mexicans on the border are well pleased with the punishment of the Kleophas. The Kleophas threaten retaliation.

Three bodies, two males and one female, were recovered from the Atlantic wreck on Wednesday. On Thursday a body was seen wedged among the debris of the wreck, supposed to be that of Mr. Fisher, of Vermont.

The wreckers from the hull of the Atlantic report that a large quantity of cargo is still in the vessel, and the side of the vessel having fallen in on the cargo makes its rescue very difficult.

The heavy rains in this vicinity have swollen the lumber rivers that about five million feet of lumber have gone down.

Parties who have just returned from the eastern townships report that Saturday night a fire broke out in a hotel at Bedford, and a large portion of the village was soon in ruins.

The Derby in the usual motion was offered to adjourn on the fifth of June, Derby Day. Thomas Hughes protested against the practice, and denounced as a public humiliation such action of Parliament in deference to what was called the national sport.

The Italian Chamber of Deputies has finally disposed of the bill for the abolition of religious corporations.

The Captain General of Cuba has been officially notified to carry into effect the order of March 24th directing the emancipation of 10,000 slaves.
