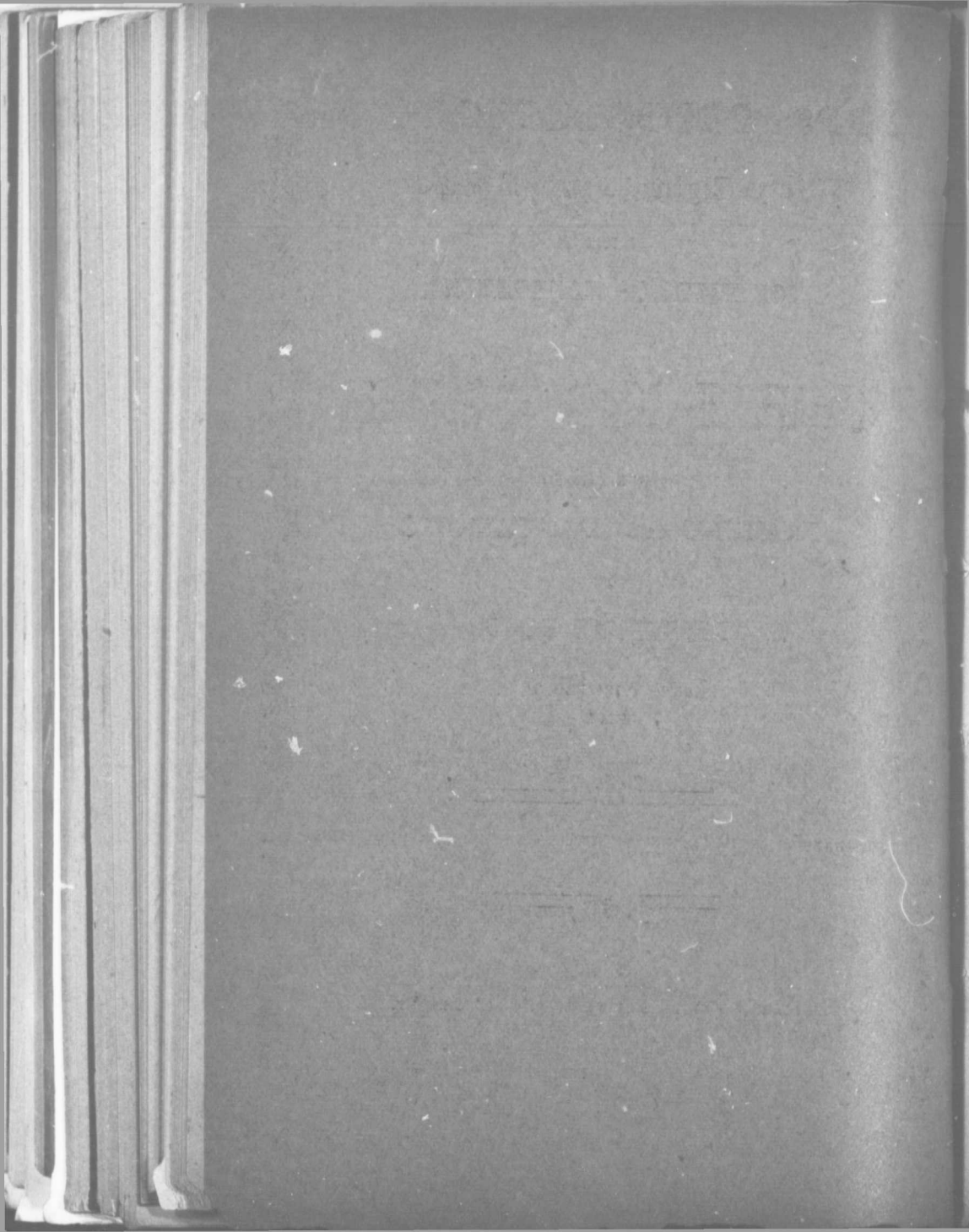

BOYS' HOME.

THIRTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL MEETING.

The Thirty-Eighth Annual Meeting of the Board of Managers of the Boys' Home was held at the Home in George St. on Wednesday, 16th February.

Among those present were Right Rev. Bishop Sullivan, Sir Casimer S. Gzowski, A. D. C. to the Queen; Rev. Dr. John Potts, Victoria College; Rev. Prof. Robinson, Knox College; Rev. Dr. Thomas; O. A. Howland, ex-M. P. P.; Principal MacMurchy; Mr. Angus MacMurchy; ex-Warden Massie; Mr. Warring Kennedy; Dr. J. E. Elliott; Dr. J. H. McCollum; Prof. Wong; ex-Ald. Scott; Ald. MacMurrich; Dr. Oldright; Dr. Julia Thomas, and others.

Letters of regret for unavoidable absence were read from Sir Oliver Mowat, Rev. W. J. Macaughan, St. Andrew's; Rev. Alex. MacMillan, St. Enoch's; Lieut.-Col. John I. Davidson; Mr. J. Gordon Macdonald; Hon. G. W. Allen; Rev. O. S. C. Wallace; Rev. John Pearson; Rev. G. H. Kuhring; Rev. W. G. Wallace; Rev. Wm. Patterson, and others.

Ex-Warden Massie presided, and Rev. Bishop Sullivan opened the meeting with prayer.

The boys sang the national anthem and other selections, after which Rev. Dr. Potts was asked to read the Secretary's Report, as follows:

THIRTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

In presenting their Annual Report the Board of Management desire to record once more, as in past years, their

sincere thanks to the numerous friends who have given liberal support to and taken a warm interest in the Boys' Home.

The number of boys in the Home on the 31st December, 1897, was 111. Forty-six were admitted during the year, making a total of 157. Of these eleven were sent to places in the country, 45 were removed by parents and friends, and one died. The managers regret to report this death; little Charlie, a bright boy of five; his mother, a poor deserted wife, had been obliged to part with him for three months; leaving him with a friend, in another town. After trying vainly to get the husband's relatives to assist her to provide for the boy, she met him at the train, and brought him direct to the Home. With an affectionate good-bye she left him, saying she would come to see him next week. Six days later he was taken suddenly ill, with what proved to be a malignant form of scarlet fever; sent to the Isolation, where he received the kindest care and attention, but became rapidly worse, and, to the regret of all, died next day. The poor young mother never saw him again. The disease must have been in his system when admitted.

The general health of the boys throughout the year has been very good. The mild form of scarlet fever which appeared in October of the previous year, causing the matron and her assistants a long weary period of quarantine, disappeared, leaving no ill effects of any kind. And the managers would again express their best thanks to Dr. Sheard, Medical Health Officer, for his kind and valuable assistance and advice, which enabled the matron and her assistants to feel safe, in the knowledge that the home had been thoroughly disinfected. Although the disease was very prevalent in the City in early summer, no new cases appeared.

The managers refer to the Medical Officer's report for full particulars, and once more express their deep sense of

gratitude to Dr. Thorburn, ever ready in time of need, and particularly during the term of quarantine. Owing to an unfortunate accident, Dr. Elliot, whose services, day or night, are at all times so freely given, was unable to attend, and Dr. Thorburn proved his devotion by his constant daily attendance, proving that the old time interest is as fresh as ever. To avoid the necessity of again having to ask him to resume active service, the Managers, at his suggestion, asked Dr. J. H. McCollum, Jarvis Street, to become associate physician, which he kindly consented to do. Grateful acknowledgment is again made to the Manager of Victoria Hospital for Sick Children, for continued kindness in receiving and caring for any little ones requiring extra care, both in the City and in the Lake Side Home.

The Managers report some changes on the Board. While ever ready to welcome new members, they part with old friends with sincere regret.

Mrs. George Dickson, a most valued member, finding that new duties would require all her time, resigned. Mrs. Stephen Heward, also a much esteemed member, and Mrs. Ferguson, found it necessary to resign.

The boys continue to make very satisfactory progress under the efficient care of Miss Hodgert and Miss Kerr, whose interest in the boys' welfare cannot be too highly praised.

The want of a nursery is still very much felt, as a num-

ber of small boys, too young to be "in school" are cared for in the recreation room.

The much-required additional laundry room has been provided for, by extending the north end of the East wing to the extreme limit of the lot "all the way up" and making an alteration in the kitchen, thus enlarging the laundry, the dining-room and the upper dormitory. A drying closet was also added, enabling those employed in this part of the Home to perform their work with very much more comfort.

During the erection of this extension the outside drains, from some unknown cause, were found defective, but under the very careful supervision of architect W. K. Gregg the whole system was put in perfect order, and a plan made of the same for reference at any time. Owing to this unforeseen expense, and the cost of the laundry extension, the Managers were reluctantly compelled to postpone the erection of the much-desired north wing, feeling that the cost would be more than it would be prudent to undertake under existing financial circumstances.

The Sunday School is still under the care of its most efficient and esteemed superintendent, Mr. Robert Kilgour, and his devoted assistant Mr. S. B. Brush, as leader of the music, both supported by faithful assistants.

The Christmas Dinner and Tree were again very successful. The boys were all present at both, ready to enjoy the good dinner so kindly provided by kind friends, and to be made happy with the various articles from the Tree, and the entertainment provided by true friends of the Home. As usual, a number of old boys were present to enjoy the dinner and the Christmas Tree.

The Home correspondents continue as usual to be of interest. One very interesting letter, from one of two brothers, now residing in the United States and both in a fair way of making a name for themselves, may be given :

DEAR FRIEND,—As it draws near Christmas, my thoughts are back to my old days when I was under your care in the Boys' Home. I did not realize how good you were to me at the time, but as I grow older I hardly know how to return thanks for the goodness in securing good places for David and I through your kindness, and the interest you took in us. We shall be brothers as long as we live. I have seen the rest of our family, with the exception of Johnnie. The last we heard of him, he was in Rochester. I was there, but could not find him. Both Aleck and Willie are in Elizabeth, New Jersey, both steady, good workers. I suppose you know David is over here now, and is getting along well. He is working for the Edison Electric Light Co. here; he has charge of the stock room. His wages comes to ten dollars and a half a week. We intend going into business for ourselves some day. I am still conductor on the "street cars." I get from \$10 to \$12 a week, but it is a hard job on the system, working nights and mornings, and, worst of all, Sundays. I am now in hopes of getting a job in the Armour Packing Co. now building her; it is a fine one. The manager is a Scotchman, and he is going to give me the first chance. David goes to the Y.M.C.A. night school. I shall be his companion. I have been all through New York and other big cities, which I never expected to see. I will have to close, as it is near working time. We both join in wishing you a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year. Give Miss McKay and the boys our best regards, wishing them the same. You will receive one of our pictures, with this letter, as a slight token of our thanks.

Another boy, one of several from whom similar letters have been received, writes:

"DEAR _____: I received a letter from you about

two weeks ago ; I was glad to get it, too. You asked me in your last letter if I was too busy to write. No, I was not too busy, but I did not think of writing until I received your letter. Well, Miss ———, I will try and write a few lines. I have not very much to say, but I will tell you all I know. You tell me that Lady Aberdeen was at the Home speaking to the boys, bidding them be good, honest, brave men and do what is right when they go out into the world. I suppose there are very few boys now in the Home that were there when I was there ; they will be all small boys there now. I saw Willie ——— a few days ago ; he told me that he was at the Home, and that he was at the Christmas Tree. He thought the boys were well provided with presents, and a good many of the boys got skates. Well, I hope they will have a good time skating. I do not know how much I weigh, but I think the last time I was weighed it was one hundred and twenty pounds. I am five feet seven inches high. I got a very nice book from you. I do not know if it was you that sent me the book or not, but I think it was you and I thank you for it very much. I am not going to school just now, but will be going after a while. Our teacher is sick. This is all I have to say now.

Another boy writes :

"I was glad to hear from you. I was also glad to hear that Lady Aberdeen was visiting the Home. You were telling me in your letter of some of the boys thanking you for getting them good farms. Well, I thank you for getting me a good farm, and I think Charlie can, too. I am getting along very well. My time will be up in Jan., 1899. I think I have said all, so I will close, wishing you, and all at the Home, a happy New Year. I remain,

The Charlie mentioned is a younger boy, sent to the same farmer, to be ready to take Hubert's place when his term expires.

It is pleasing also to receive letters from farmers, expressing their satisfaction. This one is from one in the County of Kent, who made personal selection, after having gone to the other Institutions in the City.

"It is now two months since I arrived home from Toronto with my boy, I. P., and I am pleased to say that he has proved entirely satisfactory to us. I asked him to-day if he wished to go back to the Home, and he replied, "No, I might get sent to a worse place next time." He did not mean to imply, however, that this place was "pretty bad," but we all had a good laugh at his expense. He is well satisfied to stop with us, and in fact we could not get along without him; he is just the sort of boy I expected he would be. It is rather hard to find a place for another boy at this late date, but I will keep a constant lookout and hope to find places for one or more in the spring. Send us the indentures for my father's signature, and oblige.

The managers would also make grateful mention of pleasant trips to Island Park, Hanlan's Point, Victoria Park, Lorne Park, Sabbath School Picnics given by Cooke's Church, Southside Presbyterian Church, and All Saints' Church, by the captains of the local steamers, and to Mr. Hill, Manager of the Industrial Exhibition, for free entrance, and to Mr. McKenzie, through the kindness of Mr. George Green, for free conveyance in special cars to and from the Exhibition—treats which the boys thankfully enjoyed. And to all friends of the Boys' Home for kindly remembering the boys throughout the year and at Christmas, with supplies for the dinner and Christmas Tree; to Mr. E. B. Osler for his continued kindness in the annual gift of a new ten cent piece for each boy; to the Lady True

Blues for five dollars for the Christmas Tree, which, with donations from other friends, enabled the Matron and Mr. Brush to provide the various articles for each one of the ninety-nine healthy, happy-looking boys.

And last, but not least, the Managers have pleasure in reporting a delightful visit to the Home from Her Excellency the Countess of Aberdeen. Although her time was very much occupied during her residence in the City, she found or made time to visit the Home, and, in her usual happy manner, speak a few kind words to the boys, telling them of some brave men, and bidding them to strive to grow up to be good men.

In conclusion the Managers would again express their continued appreciation of the faithful services of the Matron, Miss McKay, whose interest in the welfare of the boys increases as the years pass; and also to her assistant, Mrs. Robinson, whose interest in the welfare of the boys is very sincere.

In closing our report, we would again thankfully acknowledge the goodness of the Father of all mercies for blessing our labors during the past year.

THIRTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL MEDICAL REPORT OF THE HOME.

During the past year the health of the Home has been unusually good with one exception.

In July last one of the little boys died from malignant scarlet fever.

I was called early in the morning to see him. Within an hour he was removed to the Isolation Hospital, where he died the same evening.

Every precaution was at once taken to prevent the further spread of the disease, and I am pleased to inform you that no other case has since occurred in the Home.

Previous to this date two or three of the boys had been removed to the Hospital for Sick Children, suffering from other diseases, where they soon recovered.

Since July last the boys have been entirely well, except a few cases of colds, etc.

I feel I should draw the attention of the Board to the fact that we have only sleeping capacity for 90 boys. The Medical Health Officer has more than once expressed the opinion that the Government would withhold the grant if more than 90 were admitted to the Home.

I am convinced from our experience of the past couple of years in the disposal of our sick that it would not be wise to expend a large sum of money in erecting a separate infirmary or hospital in the grounds of the Home.

The contagious cases have been removed to the Isolation Hospital, and the other cases of sickness which were likely to last more than a few days were removed to the Hospital for Sick Children.

Both these hospitals are so convenient and the Medical

Health Officer so very obliging in promptly removing any of the little sufferers in the ambulance, that we have been relieved of the worry of hunting a nurse and fitting up a special room for a hospital.

I must express the satisfaction it is to the medical staff to have so efficient a matron as we have in Miss McKay.

After a short address by Mr. ex-Ald. Scott and Mr. R. H. Baird, and a few interesting remarks by the Chairman, the meeting closed by Dr. Potts pronouncing the benediction.

OBJECT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

Duties of the Board of Management and Officers.

The Institution is open to the boys of the ages mentioned in second Rule of the Regulations, the claims of admission being the utter friendlessness of the applicant, or being a child of drunken or dissolute parents; the object of this Institution being the prevention of juvenile crime, by training these poor outcasts in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

The management is vested in a committee of Ladies, chosen from the subscribers at the Annual General Meeting in February of each year; the said Committee to consist of thirty-three members, from among whom eight shall be chosen as Directresses; and among them there shall be a first and second Directress, Treasurer and Secretary.

The first Directress, or in her absence one other Directress, shall preside at the monthly meeting, audit and sign the accounts presented for that purpose by the Treasurer, propose and declare the resolutions, and sign the minute of the preceding meeting.

The Treasurer shall receive and keep an account of all moneys belonging to the Institution, and also the earnings of all the boys, a separate account of which must be kept with each. All the accounts must be presented each month, at the meeting of the Managers, for the signature of the first Directress, or in her absence, the lady presiding.

The Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the Society; keep a list of the names, ages, and peculiar circumstances, as far as practicable, of all the boys, in a book provided for that purpose; attend at each monthly meeting, take the names of those present, and minute the proceedings in a book, which must be read at each ensuing meeting, and be signed by the presiding lady.

Two members of the Committee in rotation shall visit the "Home" daily, each week; inspect the house; ascertain from the Matron the conduct of the boys, and enter a report at the weekly meeting on the Monday.

The weekly Finance Committee shall consist of the Directress, Secretary, Treasurer, and two of the Committee, who shall have been appointed to purchase or otherwise obtain the necessary clothing for the boys. Five shall form a quorum, and their order shall be sufficient authority to the Treasurer to advance the money requisite for the above purpose, or supply such things as may be considered necessary for the "Home."

The General Committee shall meet on the second Monday of the month, at eleven o'clock a.m. Each meeting shall be opened with prayer. The minutes of the preceding meeting having being read and signed, the vouchers of the Treasurer produced and signed, the Secretary shall inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place during the last month, and the first Directress shall put before the meeting such resolutions as may be put into her hands, take the votes, and declare the decision. Seven shall form a quorum, and when a tie arises, the presiding lady shall give the casting vote. All admissions that have taken place during the past month shall either be ratified or disallowed, at the direction of the meeting.

As soon as the meeting is opened, all conversation not addressed to the presiding lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order, and stopped.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOYS' HOME.

I. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the boys ; to conduct the household affairs generally ; to admit applicants with the doctor's certificate, subject to the approval of the Weekly Committee ; and she shall daily see to the personal cleanliness of each boy, and every morning and evening conduct family prayer.

II. Boys from the ages of five to twelve are admitted as inmates, and none shall be placed in a permanent situation until he has been one year in the Institution. This rule may be suspended under peculiar circumstances, at the discretion of the Managers.

III. The boys shall rise at 6 a.m. from 30th April to 30th September, and at 7 a.m. from 1st October to 1st May ; the time for going to rest being from 6 to 8 p.m. Their meals to be at regular hours—Breakfast at 8 a.m., dinner at 12, and tea at 5.30 p.m. Grace to be said before and after meals by one of the elder boys ; and all hours not occupied by such meals, or by instruction, to be employed, under the supervision of the Matron, in bodily exercise, house cleaning, or at play.

IV. All the boys shall regularly attend Sunday School and Divine service in a Protestant Church, every Sunday, in charge of the Matron ; and in the afternoon receive such religious instruction as can be given by the Matron, or any visiting friend of the Institution.

V. The charge for each boy, of parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$5 per month, unless an exceptional case shall occur. If more than one boy of the same parents or friends gains admittance, a reduction shall be made, as approved of by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

VI. Prompt and implicit obedience must be given to the orders of the Matron.
