The Chapter met on Thursday, 14th November, when full accounts of the financial affairs were presented and considered. It appeared that some reductions had been made in the debt. It is proposed shortly to publish a statement of the financial history and present position of the Cathedral, in a form which will make this information accessible to all.

It was reported that an additional stall had been taken up; this being the twentieth, of which fourteen are paid for, and six partly paid:

The question of choir scholarships and bursaries was referred to, but it was thought that the matter required further consideration before being brought up for formal discussion.

The Girls' Auxiliary gave an entertainment in the crypt on the evening of the 27th November, which was largely attended, and was very successful.

On Thursday evening, 3rd December, the Rev. Canon Macnab delivered a very interesting lecture on the Cities of Italy, with lime light views, under the auspices of the ladies of the W.A.

The receipts from both of these entertainments are to be given through the W.A. towards a special appeal put forth by the Bishop of Algoma.

On Sunday 1st December, being the birthday of her Majesty Queen Alexandra, the national anthem was sung at the evening service, with the new verse which has been lately published. The three verses as sung are as follows:

God save our gracious King;	In perfect peace serene

Mrs. John A. Wood has presented to the Cathedral a pair of cut glass cruets for the communion service, a timely and well-appreciated gift.

The communion service is, however, not at all complete. An additional chalice is required.

CHRISTMAS OFFERTORY.

It has not hitherto been the practice in St. Alban's to hand the Christmas offertory to the clergyman as is the rule in parish churches in this diocese; but this year His Lordship the Bishop has directed that the offertory on Christmas Day shall go to the Rev. Canon Macnab, who receives no more than the small stipend of priest-vicar. We feel that we have but to notify the congregation of this arrangement in order to ensure a liberal offering.
