On page 397, we read that in 1602 the Thames ebb'd and flow'd twice within an hour, and in November the heavens seem'd to be on fire; also on the 24th of Feb., being a great frost after a great flood, there came down the River Severn such a swarm of flies, beetles, etc., apparition of a procession of persons clothed in black which vanish'd away. A sow farrowed a pig with two bodies, eight feet and but one head. A mare brought forth a foal with two heads and a long tail, growing out between the two heads; a field of three acres in Blackmore with the trees and fences, moved from its place and passed over another field, etc. All this and many other marvels recorded on pages 397 and 398.

Rushworth's (John) HISTORICAL COLLECTIONS of Private Passages of STATE, Weighty Matters in Law, remarkable Proceedings in the Parliament, *vacants* Vol. VI., 1645-48, also Vol. VIII., containing the *Tryal for High Treason of Earl Strafford*, 6 vols, folio, half calf, some covers looe, AND VERY CHEAP FOR 5.50 the lot, 1652-1701. 55

An English lawyer who afterwards became ASSISTANT CLERK to the HOUSE of COMMONS during the LONG PARLIAMENT. He diligently pursued the practice of compiling the above valuable materials for history, and with which no historian of the Commonwealth period can dispense with.

COLE (Christian) MEMOIRS of AFFAIRS of STATE, containing letters written by ministers employed in foreign NEGOTIATIONS, from 1597 to the end of 1708, with Treaties, MEMORIALS, and other transactions mentioned in the letters, thick folio, calf, 1.25, printed for the Editor by Woodfall, 1782.

An important volume of 569 pp. It should find a place by the side of Rushworth.
