JURY BILL .- (UPPER CANADA)

The mode of choosing Juries under the old Act was liable to many and grave objections, for forming a part of the duty of the Sheriffs, alike responsible and invidious, parties deeming themselves aggrieved, were ever prone to charge ou the administrator the injury of which the system was redolent. Individuals residing a long distance from the County town were frequently subpanned to almost every other Court, while others resident perhaps in the immediate vicinity of the Courthouse enjoyed a dispensation of many years envalue of the property and make arrangements for apprehension of partiality as regards the Selectors in the first instance, and leaving the after results which, admitting of much laxity and partiality in its working, occasioned great inconvenience, and was the subject of many complaints. The new act constitutes the Mayor in cities, and the Reeve in towns and townships, with the Assessors, er portant office. On the contrary the office exceeded the powers confered by the Act of 1849. officio Selectors of jurors. On the 1st of September annually, the Jurors List is to be made up by a selection of not less than two-thirds of the names on the Assessment Roll, at the discretion of the Board of Selectors; the Mafor, Reeve, or in his absence the Assessor he'ding the largest Assessment Roll, having a cesting vote. The parties named on the list are to be divided into four classes, according to their competency, in the estimation of the Selectors, for the functions respectively assigned them. 1st., Grand Jurors in the Superior Courts; 2nd, Grand Jurors in the Inferior Courts ; 3rd., Petit Jurors in the Superior Courts; and 4th., Petit Jurors in the Inferior Courts-the Selectors making a declaration as to their having performed according to the best of their judgment and information, without fear, favor, or affection, the duties of their office, and drawing up a duplicate report of the selection and distribution.

The Clerk of the Peace is to prepare ballots from a "Juror's book" deposited with him, the balloting to take place in open Court at Quarter Sessions; the Court having determined, from the appearance of the calendar, whether a full, a twothirds, or a haif Jury List will be requisite. A full Jury List compr ses 48 Grand Jurors for the Superior Courts, 144 Petit Jurors in the same, 96 Grand Jurors for the Inferior Courts, and 288 Petit Jurors in the same. The ballotting to be performed by the Chairman of the Court and Glerk of the Peace, and from the list thus ballotted, the Sher.ff is publicly to draft the pannel. The roll of Petit Jurors, unless by order of the Judge, in no case to contain less than 48, nor more than 72 names, from which the Clerk will ballot the pannel as required.
