I would allow free coal and every other element of manufacture, except labor, to be entered free. In other words, this free port should be a great consumer of American labor, the product of which. under the most encouraging conditions, should be for import and export only. And if it were removed from the port for the purpose of domestic consumption, it should pay the same duty as if imported from abroad. I do not see where the American people could be harmed by such a policy and it would result in furnishing employment to those who choose to live beneath our flag, consume our products and work at the American scale of wag-

All New England would be benefitted by such a port somewhere on tffe North Atlantic coast. A similar port should be established in vicinity of Norfolk and another on the gulf. 

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST.

Homestead Regulations. Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 26, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less.




