

Property Owners and others interested are reminded that the By-law for \$75,-000 for water mains will be voted upon on

THURSDAY, December 14th.

This amount is urgently required to meet the cost of renewing certain mains laid down many years ago during the Furniss management, which, owing to increased consumption, are now too small and insecure for the service demanded from them; and also for mains much needed in the newly opened districts of the city, which are at present without any supply for domestic purposes and fire protection.

It must not be forgotten that ever since the works have been in the hands of the city, the property in the unsupplied sections has been taxed for its share of the expense of maintaining the Waterworks and Fire Departments, without receiving any benefit therefrom, and now that his outlying property is being rapidly built up and settled, it is but justice that it should be supplied with water in common with the rest of the city.

Should the By-law fail to meet with the support of the Property Owners, a difficulty will arise, of which there seems but one solution, viz, the placing the amount in the estimates of next year thus making an addition. year, thus making an addition of at least a mill and a half to the rate of taxation.

It is confidently presumed that the fairer course will be sus-tained of spreading the pay-ment of the amount over forty years by the issue of debentures.

On these views, therefore, your support of the By-law is requested.
