FACTORIES ON DON FLATS.

WOOLEN MANUFACTURE GRANTED A TEN YEARS' LEASE.

Ashbridge's Marsh as a Site for Smelting Works and Factories Again Discussed. One Application Granted—Plans to Draw Up and the District Visited—Will the Ontario Government Aid?

The sub-committee on factory sites met at the City Hall yesterday, Aid. Burns in the chair.

Ald. Thompson mentioned a company that is desirous of establishing smelting works on Ashbridge's Marsh. They would require the marsh to the extent of 50 acres, which they asked to be leased to them for a nominal sum. They also would require a bonus.

Ald. Crawford said the matter could not be put informally on the agenda. They must have definite proposals from the company. The granting of the land claimed by the applicants might be entertained, but a bonus was quite another thing.

Let a Plan be Decided On. A communication was read from Engineer Keating, stating that until roadways were decided on and means for their access it was useless for him to draw a plan with precise lots and streets.

The committee concurred, and the district will be visited by a sub-committee in the afternoon.

Ald. Lamb got a motion passed that the City Solicitor report on the title of the land in question. It was held that the patent of the marsh belonged to the city, but that the title to the Ontario Government.

Time something is Done. The Chairman said that Ashbridge's Bay is costing the city this year \$140,000, and it was high time that something was done towards procuring some revenue.

Ald. Hewitt then retold the story of the Alexander syndicate, whose offer was accepted by the Ontario Government, but refused by the council. "We have still got the bay and the marsh, and ourselves to blame."

The Chairman: Will the Ontario Government help us in any reclamation for factory sites?

Ald. Hewitt: They will not, but they will take any rents for the keeping up of Queen's Park.

Ald. Lamb and Hallam thought the Ontario Government should be approached on this line.

Ald. Joliffe: At the time of the boom we might have done well with the marsh. We cannot give it away now.

A woolen factory on Don Flats. Ald. Hallam mentioned a firm with a capital of \$150,000, who were desirous to lease a site on the Don Flats for the erection of a woolen factory.

The building would cost \$15,000 or \$20,000, and the machinery between \$80,000 and \$90,000. It was not a new enterprise, but one in business now and employed 80 hands. If they secured an eligible site they would employ 120.

Ald. Joliffe: Let them have the site; it is no use to us. [Laughter.] Wouldn't the Esplanade suit them?

Ald. Crawford thought the council was not at present at liberty to lease any Esplanade sites. Besides, it was not thought suitable to have factories on the Esplanade front.

The land on the Esplanade has cost the city \$20,000 an acre; the sites on the banks of the Don only \$4,000 or \$5,000.

On motion of Ald. Hewitt it was agreed to let the company two acres on the Don Flats at \$500 a year for 10 years for this woolen factory.

A Register of City Sites. Ald. Lamb suggested a registry of factory sites, to be available to the City Hall for parties wishing to locate.

Ald. Joliffe: We tried that and only got inquiries from the agents and speculators. We got no bona fide offers from manufacturers.

Ald. Lamb: Still I think it should be known that there is a register of eligible sites kept.

Ald. Atkinson thought they must visit the Alameda's district and have a plan so as to be able to intelligently consider such offers as Ald. Thompson's and Ald. Hallam's.

The committee concurred in this. The whole question will be referred to the City Solicitor and City Engineer. It will probably come up at the next meeting of the Board of Works.

A BABY SEA LION.

Born in Captivity in a Park is the Pacific Northwest.

Shortly after noon yesterday Superintendent Haas of the Yester Avenue street car line was surprised at receiving a message from Mr. Riley, who keeps a fruit stand at Lechi Park, to send down a nurse to the sea lions in the park.

Mr. Haas and two of the employees hastened down to the tank, and found upon the platform the sea lion Tony, with a little baby lion at her side. The mother fondled the newcomer much as a cat does a kitten, and lifted it about from place to place by grasping the loose skin.

The baby lion is about eighteen inches long, has a head that resembles a pug dog, and the body is covered with short stiff hair of a steel-gray color. He lay in the water as if he were nearly an hour after seeing light for the first time, while the mother crawled back and forth over him, and putting her face to the little one's as if kissing it.

Tony appeared to be overjoyed at having a son, and kept Elickey, the other sea lion, who died about five weeks ago, and took to the water, swimming about at a furious rate all the afternoon. She refused to eat anything, and remained under water most of the time.

Superintendent Haas caused a platform to be placed alongside the float so Tony and the baby could get on it. As the workmen pulled the platform into position Tony became scared, and grabbing the baby by the nape of the neck, plunged into the water. It was feared that this would drown the baby, but Tony brought him back all right in a few minutes.

It will be three days before the baby will be able to swim, and by Saturday or Sunday Tony will give him lessons in swimming and diving. To make the little one more comfortable, an addition to the tank is being built, with a sand beach accompaniment. This will enable the sea lions to come ashore when tired of the water.

The sea lions in Lechi Park were bought in California about three years ago. There were at that time four of them. One escaped from the tank and was captured at Ballard, being returned to the tank, where he was later she gave birth to a pup which died. Five weeks ago the big male, Jack, was found dead, which left remaining Tony and Blinky. It was supposed by all that the tank contained three male lions, but recent events dispelled that idea.

GAVE ALL HE HAD.

Pat His \$37,000 Into a Church, and Now He is a Donor.

GAVE ALL HE HAD.

Put His \$37,000 Into a Church, and Now He is Its Janitor.

"Denver has the extraordinary instance of a man who gave his entire fortune toward the building of a church and then became its janitor," said William S. Graham recently. "It is nothing unusual to see the man who gave a large donation to the church become a leader in the congregation; but here is a man who gave every cent of the \$37,000 he had accumulated and was then content to serve in a lowly position with a small salary. This is a rare instance of self-sacrifice and particularly interesting to Pittsburghers, as the noble man who gave a large donation to the church was born in one period in his life spent his time between Alliance and this city."

"Many years ago there resided in Alliance, O., a man who, in order to make a better living for himself and wife, opened a restaurant in addition to his regular duties as engineer on the Fort Wayne road between Pittsburgh and his native town. He gained a little money in the pursuit of his vocations, but when the Western fever broke out and Denver was looming up out of the haze of the setting sun as the coming metropolis of the West he packed up his earthly possessions and started for that growing place. With the little savings he had taken from him he purchased a home surrounded by some little property. As luck would have it, a portion of the land adjoining his house suddenly became very valuable and he sold it at a great profit. Having acquired taste for real estate he bought and sold, always being successful, until his savings had increased to what in those days, and we might say even now, were thought to be a considerable fortune—\$37,000. But the engineer's path was not to be all roses, for about this time his wife died, leaving him alone in the world. He mourned her loss very bitterly. Feeling that he should do some good in the world he became very much interested in church work."

The Christian Church at Denver had received a call from another city, and was about to accept it when the Pittsburgh engineer came to him and argued that his proposed going away was ill advised. "For," he contended, "while the church has increased rapidly, we are now at a standstill. What we need now is a counter irritant to stir up the people for the good work. Establish another Christian Church here, and you will see what great good can be done. The minister concurred in this opinion, but could see no way to accomplish the establishment of another church, as funds were very scarce. With this the engineer near agreed to donate \$12,000 toward purchasing a lot, and to build a new church if the pastor would renege that he not only gave his promised \$12,000, but kept adding and adding to his donation until, when the \$35,000 church was completed, he had given every cent he had in the world, \$37,000, leaving himself utterly without money or means of support. The church proved to be one of the finest in Denver, and is to this day the pride of the city."

"But what was this benevolent man to do? He had given his all to the church, but he must live. He went meekly and asked for the position of janitor. Of course he was accepted, and to this day he is filling that position. But he is no ordinary janitor; he is rather a king in the congregation. He is about 70 years old, and lives in the church. Away up in the belfry which he built he has a comfortable bedroom arranged, and down in the basement he sits his meals. He receives a salary, but every cent that is not required for his frugal living he gives to the alma mater. I said, 'With this the engineer. On every question which comes up about the church his opinion is asked for and respected. He is in content with his life, having made a sacrifice of himself and his wealth to the great cause. I doubt if another such instance of self-sacrifice can be found in recent times.'—Pittsburgh Dispatch.

Wheat will be a fair crop, barley a fair average, peas a half crop, while oats are reported badly raised. All grains are heavy in the straw, but lay in many sections by rain and wind and difficult to harvest. Potatoes abundant; plums, peaches and peaches not near the usual yield, and apples, owing to frost, will not be more than a half crop.
