



STANDING BULES

FOR THE

CONSTITUTION AND GOVERNMENT

OF THE

NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY.

NAME.

1.—The Name of this Society shall be "The Newfoundland Church Society."

OBJECTS.

2.—The objects of this Society shall be, (1) to contribute towards the maintenance of the Clergy and Licensed Lay-Readers, (2) to assist in the erection, enlargement or repairs of Churches, Parsonages, or School-rooms, and in the purchase of land for Glebe or other Church purposes, (3) to provide for sale a supply of Bibles. Prayer-Books, School-Books, and other Religious Books and Tracts, (4) to assist in creating and sustaining a Special Fund for the endowment and support of the Theological College in St. John's, and (5) to create and maintain a separate Fund for assisting the Widows and Children of deceased Clergymen of this Diocese.

MEMBERS.

3.--The Members of this Society shall be, (1) all persons who shall have paid to their Clergyman or the Treasurer the two preceding years the annual sum of ten shillings for the objects of the Society; and (2) all Clergymen who shall have officiated in Newfoundland or Labrador the two preceding years with the Bishop's license.

4.—All Members shall have power to vote at the annual and other general meetings.

OFFICERS.

5.—The Officers of this Society shall be (1) the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, President; (2) the Venerable the Archdeacon and the Rural Deans, Vice-Presidents; (3) a Treasurer; and (4) a Secretary; the last two to be chosen by the members of the Society at the annual general meeting; but in case of resignation of office, or removal of either Secretary or Treasurer, during the interval between two annual meetings, the Committee shall appoint a person to act in either case, until the next annual meeting.

MANAGERS.

6.—The Committee of Management shall consist of the officers of the Society, and certain Lay-Members, elected as representatives in each of the Deaneries, viz., four elected by members of the Society resident in the Deanery of Avalon; three by members resident in the Deanery of Conception Bay; two by members resident in the Deanery of Trinity Bay; two by members resident in the Deanery of Bonavista Bay; three by members resident in the Deanery of Notre-Dame Bay; two by members resident in the Deanery of Placentia Bay; and two by members resident in the Deanery of Fortune Bay.

7.—The election of Representatives shall be as follows:—On some day in Easter Week, in the year 1859, and in every succeeding fourth year, a meeting of the members resident in each mission, shall be convened by the Clergyman in charge at some convenient hour and place, of which notice shall be given (with the Bishop's consent) in each Church in the mission on some Sunday in the previous month; at which meeting the Clergyman, or, in his absence, some other person then to be chosen by the members, shall preside, and the members present shall vote seriatim for the prescribed number of representatives.

8.—When the voting, which may be continued, if necessary, six hours, but not longer, is completed, the Presiding Officer in each Mission shall report the result to the Rural Dean, and the persons who have obtained a majority of votes in the Deanery, shall be elected Representatives: provided that every person to be a member of the Committee must be a Communicant of the Church of England.

9.—The Rural Dean shall report the result of the election in his Deanery, to the Secretary in St. John's, the first convenient opportunity.

10.—The new Representatives shall be convened by the Secretary at the Michaelmas quarterly meeting; until which time the former Representatives shall continue in office.

11.—As often as it shall become necessary, from the death; absence from the Colony, resignation, disqualification, or refusal to serve, of any of the Representatives, to appoint another or others in their place, a special meeting of the Members, in the Deanery where the vacancy has arisen, shall (as soon as the Rural Dean, or, in his absence, the Clergyman next senior in standing in the Diocese, may in his discretion

appoint) be convened in like manner as the Easter meeting, when the required Representative or Representatives shall in like manner be elected.

- 12.—The President or a Vice-President, and six other Members of the Committee shall be competent to manage the business at every meeting duly convened.
- 13.—All Clergymen of the Diocese holding the Bishop's license, shall be ex officio honorary members of the Committee, with the right of speaking, but not, with the exception of the Officers, of voting at its Meetings.

TRUSTEE.

14.—The Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be the Trustee of this Society, and shall have power to let or to take houses or lands, and to receive all rents and interest of monies as the same shall fall due, and shall pay the same to the Treasurer for the time being, taking his receipt, and handing it over to the Committee.

GENERAL MEETINGS.

- 15.—An Annual General Meeting of the members and friends of the Society shall be holden in St. John's on the second Thursday after Trinity Sunday, or as soon after as the Bishop may appoint. The Secretary shall give notice to each of the Clergymen in St. John's, who shall publish it [with the Bishop's consent] in his Church on the previous Sunday.
- 16.—At the Annual General Meeting a report on the state of the Society, with the Treasurer's accounts, duly audited, shall be submitted by the Committee, to be printed, or otherwise, as shall be then and there determined by the members.

17.—A special general meeting may be convened at any time, [1] by the President; [2] by a Vice-President and six members of the Committee, or [3] by any twelve members of the Society whose payments are not in arrear; provided notice of such meeting be duly given as in the case of annual general meetings.

18.—The Chairman shall not vote at any general meeting, except in the case of an equality of votes.

COLLECTIONS.

19.—It is expected that a collection for the various objects of the Society will be made every year by every Clergyman in the Diocese, from every head of a family and every adult member of the Church in his Mission, assisted if need be by his hurchwardens and other respectable members of his congregation.

20—Every Clergyman shall transmit to the Secretary a list of the contributors to the objects of the Society in his Mission, with the amount of their several payments, and to the Treasurer one-fourth at least of his whole collections, on or before the last day in every year, or as soon after as practicable.

N. B.—This Rule does not apply to the Clergy of St. John's, who shall send in the whole of their codections to the Treasurer.

21.—All Clergymen who have collected as far as possible from every head of a family, and from every adult Member of the Church in their Missions, towards the objects of the Society, for the two years immediately preceding, and who have remitted to the Treasurer one-fourth of the whole collections, shall be entitled to assistance from the funds of the Society towards any of its objects in their own Mission; pro-

vided that no Clergyman shall make a collection for his own maintenance separate from or independent of the general collections; and that pew-rents and assessments be not considered as part of the said collection or collections.

GRANTS.

- 22.—It shall be the duty of the Committee to determine from time to time on the appropriation of the Funds, by making grants towards the objects of the Society under the recommendation and sanction of the President.
- 23—No Clergyman declining or neglecting to collect for the Society, or to transmit a list of the contributors, and their payments, and a fourth part of his collection (as directed in Rule 20) shall be entitled to receive any grants from the Society, for himself, or for any of the objects of the Society, in his Mission; provided that where a collection has been duly made, and the list, with the fourth part of the collections, transmitted for the two previous years by his predecessor, any Clergyman newly in charge may, before sending his annual collections, ask and receive for any of the objects of the Society, excepting only his own maintenance.
- 24—It shall be competent to the Committee to make grants in the usual manner to any Mission, in connection with the Society, which supports its own Clergyman; and any such Mission shall be held to be in connection with the Society whose Clergyman subscribes ten shillings, and makes a collection in his Mission, annually, towards the general funds of the Society.
- 25.—If a Clergyman leave his Mission before the time for sending in his annual collection, the Commit-

tee shall have power, on the recommendation of the President, to grant him a sum which shall appear equitable.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

- 26.—In the absence of the President, the Archdeacon, or in his absence the senior Vice-President, shall take the chair at all meetings of the Committee or members, and shall have a casting vote.
- 27.--The Treasurer shall receive all monies forwarded to him for the objects of the Society, and shall pay or disburse the same as determined by the Committee, and shall furnish to the President and Committee a statement of accounts up to the day appointed for auditing the same.
- 28.—No money shall be paid or disbursed by the Treasurer except on a written order, specifying the amount to be paid, and its object, which order must be signed by the Chairman of the Committee at which the grant was made, or in his absence, by the senior Officer of the Society in St. John's.
- 29.—The Committee shall meet for the despatch of business in St. John's, on the first Thursday after every quarter day, at 2 o'clock, p. m.
- 30.—A special meeting of the Committee may be convened at any time, either (1) by the President, or (2) by two Vice-Presidents, or (3) by any five members of the Committee; provided due notice of such meeting, with its objects, be given the day before to all the other members of the Committee in St. John's.
- 31.—At a special meeting to be holden seven days before the annual meeting, the Committee shall ap-

point two of their number to examine the Treasurer's accounts up to that season, which accounts examined, approved and signed by the Auditors as correct, shall be submitted to the Committee, to be by them incorporated in, or appended to the next yearly Report, and so presented to the members at the next annual general meeting.

32.—The Committee shall fix the salary of the Secretary, and shall provide for all the contingent expenses of the Committee and the Society.

DUTIES OF THE SECRETARY.

33.—The Secretary shall summon and attend all meetings of the Committee and Members, and shall arrange the business, and record minutes of the same to be signed by the Chairman. He shall prepare the annual report, and superintend the printing of the same; shall conduct the correspondence with the Clergy and others on behalf of the Committee; and shall be responsible for the safe custody of all books, receipts and papers belonging to the Society.

PRAYERS.

34.—All meetings of the Society, or of the Committee, shall be opened and closed with the prayers used at the meetings of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or others provided for the purpose by the Bishop of the Diocese.

ALTERATION OF RULES.

35.—These rules may be altered, repealed or added to by the members assembled at any general meeting: provided the proposed alteration has been stated in writing by any person intending to propose it, to the Secretary, at least a month before, for the information of the President and Committee, and that assent has

been given to it by the President and a majority of the whole Committee convened for its consideration: and provided also, that it shall be competent to the President to propose any alteration to a general meeting, notwithstanding such alteration may not have received the assent of the Committee.

NEW DEANERIES.

36.—New Deaneries created by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese shall be allowed to elect Representatives: provided that in every Deanery there shall be at least two resident Clergymen, and ten Churches and congregations.

SECURITIES.

37.—At each annual meeting there shall be appointed three members of this Society, who shall be requested to examine all securities belonging to the general funds of the Society, or belonging or appertaining to the Clergy Widows' and Orphans' Fund, or to any other fund over which the Society has or shall have control, and to report in writing to the President, or, in his absence, to the senior Vice-President, in St. John's, their opinion upon the sufficiency or insufficiency of the same; and if necessary a special meeting of the Committee shall be convened to consider such report, and to take such action upon it as shall be deemed requisite.

38—All title deeds, mortgages and other sccurities belonging to the Society, or over which it has control, shall be deposited and preserved in a suitable muniment box to be provided by the President for the time being, at the expense of the Society, and to be always kept in his charge for the use of the Society.

Note.—While it is expected that every Clergyman in the Colony will make a yearly collection for the

promotion of the objects of the Church Society, and impress upon every individual under his Pastoral charge, the obligations by which he is bound to contribute thereto, year by year,—the system of the Church Society does not require any Clergyman to withhold the ordinances of the Church in any case of refusal or neglect to pay towards his support.

BYE_LAWS

OF THE

COMMITTEE

OF THE

NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY

RESPECTING GRANTS.

NEW BUILDINGS.

- 1.—No grant shall be made towards the erection of any Church, School, or Parsonage, or towards the purchase of any Land in any Mission or Settlement, until the Land has been secured in trust for the Members of the Church of England resident in the said settlement for ever.
- 2.—No grant shall be made towards the erection of any Church, School, or Parsonage, until a plan with an estimate of the cost, and the means of meeting the cost, have been submitted to the Committee.
- 3.—No grant to any Church shall exceed one-third, and no grant to any School or Parsonage shall exceed one-fourth of the estimated and probable cost; except under special circumstances, approved by the Committee.
- 4.—The first moiety of any grant towards the erection of any Church, School or Parsonage, shall not be payable until the building is at least boarded all round

and covered in; and the second moiety shall not be payable until the building is finished and ready for occupation and use.

N.B.—All the above rules shall apply in respect of the enlargement of any Church, School or Parsonage House.

REPAIRS.

- 5.—No grant shall be made towards the repair of any Church, School or Parsonage House, until an estimate of the cost, and the means of meeting the cost have been submitted to the Committee.
- 6.—No grant shall be made until after an interval of seven years from the last grant for a like purpose; and no grant towards the repair, including painting of any Church, shall exceed one-half, or of any School or Parsonage, one-third of the probable and estimated cost, except under special circumstances, approved by the Committee.
- 7.—No grant towards the repair of any Church, School or Parsonage House shall be payable until the work is fully completed, and the cost ascertained, and the whole amount, with the Society's grant, provided for.

PROCEEDINGS

At the Thirty-first Anniversary of the Newfoundland Church Society holden at St. John's, in the Cathedral Sunday School Building, on Tuesday, September 3rd, 1872.

The Chair was taken at 8 o'clock, P. M., by His Excellency Governor Hill, C. B., supported and assisted by the Revd. T. M. Wood, Rural Dean, Vice-President of the Society.

After prayer, the business of the evening commenced with reading the Report, and submitting the Treasurer's Accounts, after which the following Resolutions were proposed, seconded, and carried unanimously:—

1.—Moved by W. V. WHITEWAY, Esq., Q. C., seconded by Revd. A. C. Wood, M. A.:—

That the Report now read, with the Treasurer's Accounts, be adopted and printed.

2.—Moved by Revd. E. Botwood, seconded by G. J. HAYWARD, Esq. :—

That this Meeting recognizes with devout thankfulness the great goodness of Almighty God manifestly vouchsafed to the Newfoundland Church Society during the past year.

3.—Moved by Revd. G. Hutchinson, B.A., seconded by W. H. Mare, Esq. :—

That this Meeting, on behalf of the members of the Church of England in this Diocese, desires gratefully to acknowledge the munificence of Joseph Curling, Esq., R. E., in presenting his yacht *Lavrock* for the use of the Bishop in his voyage of Visitation, and requests that this resolution be communicated to Mr. Curling.

4.—Moved by Revd. J. F. Phelps, seconded by E. L. Jarvis, Esq.:--

That the thanks of this meeting be given to the President, Officers, and Committee, for their services in the management of the affairs of this Society. That W. H. Mare, Esq. be appointed Treasurer, and Rev. G. M. Johnson, Secretary, for the ensuing year; that J. S. Hayward, George T. Rendell and Robert Alexander, Esquires, be appointed to discharge the duties indicated by the 37th Standing Rule.

5.—Moved by F. B. CARTER, Esq., Q. C., M. H. A., seconded by Revd. W. Pilot:—

That the cordial thanks of this Meeting be respectfully tendered to His Excellency the Governor, for his kindness in presiding on the present occasion.



REPORT - 1871.

In consequence of the protracted stay of the Bishop of the Diocese in Bermuda, and the expected departure of the Coadjutor Bishop before the time when the business of the Church Society could have been satisfactorily prepared for the Annual Meeting, it was thought advisable that it should be deferred for the settlement of the Treasurer's Accounts, by the time of the completion of which it was also confidently hoped that the Bishop's return from Bermuda would have taken place. In this latter expectation your Committee are sorry that they have been disappointed. His Lordship was heard from by the last mail, and, in compliance with his wishes, the present meeting has been appointed to take place. Your Committee also regret the absence of the Coadjutor Bishop, who though so recently here was unable to remain a sufficient time to give the meeting the benefit of his valuable assistance.

Having made these explanatory remarks, your Committee proceed to give an account of the Society's funds since the last annual meeting.

The following Tabular Statement will give a comparative view of the income of the two last years set one against the other:—

It will hence be seen that there has been a falling off during the past year of £31 15s 9d., a result your Committee dld not at all expect, seeing that the fisheries of 1871 were every where so successful. analysis of these amounts it cannot but be observed that the deficiency arises altogether from the diminished sums contributed by the Cathedral congregation and the Sealers, since the St. Thomas' collection is considerably larger than last year, and the payments from St. Mary's have also slightly increased. With regard to St. Thomas' this is as it should be, inasmuch as the vote to that Church has also been increased by £25 per annum, since the last meeting, on an appeal submitted by the Bishop from that congregation, with a recommendation by His Lordship in its favor. It is hoped that the St. Thomas' contributions will in the course of time come up once more to their former annual amount, which they are even this year still considerably below. While pointing to the lessened total of the amount from the Cathedral, your Committee desire to observe that the number of names on the list sent in is slightly increased, so that the loss has arisen from smaller sums having been given by individuals. The number of contributors from St. Thomas is much enlarged this year, that from St. Mary's is about the same. The payments from the Outharbors to the Church Society, which were in 1870 £286 3s. 7d., have been in 1871 £284 0s. 4d., which is also a trifling diminution. The Clergy standing votes have been much the same as those recorded in the previous report. The sums expended on Churches and Parsonages have been somewhat larger, as have also those coming under the head of Miscellaneous objects. The whole, however, or very nearly so, of the increased expenditure arises from the circumstance of five quarterly payments having been made, in consequence of the delay of this meeting, to most of the Clergy, since the last anniversary, and a second year's payment also of the Secretary's salary and incidentals. This also explains the cause of the reduction of the balance to the credit of the Society in the hands of the Treasurer.

Payments are charged in the Treasurer's accounts of the amount of £1,096 17s. 10d. under the following heads, leaving a credit balance of £496 4s. 10d. :—

Of the condition of this fund, your Committee are able to report favourably. This is a matter of great thankfulness, considering the number of pensions with payment of which it is now charged. Happily no death has occurred among the Clergy, and therefore, no addition has been made to the number of widows dependent on the income of this fund, which has been as follows, since the last meeting of this Society:—

Widows' pensions for 1½ years have been paid, amounting to £397 10s., leaving a sum of £110 0s. 6d. to be added to the then existing balance of £144 13s. 6d.; an amount, therefore, of £254 14s. in the Commercial Bank, now awaits a further opening for investment. A capital sum of £3,821 12s. 8d. is represented by the amounts already invested, together with the above floating balance.

BOOK DEPOSITORY:

Accounts in the usual form have been made up of the business done during the year ending May 1, 1872, by which it appears that Books and Tracts of various kinds have been sold to the value of £501 2s. 8d. This is a very satisfactory statement; but your ď

Committee have been informed that but for delay, represented to have been unavoidable, in receiving books from the Parent Society, the sales would have been still larger. Your Committee again earnestly commend the Depot to the use of all Members of the Church, as the place in St. John's where all books of a religious character, best suited to their wants, can be purchased at the lowest cost, and hope that its usefulness as a Church Institution may become more generally known and appreciated. The Depot is now kept by Mrs. Rouse, at No. 305, Water Street, next door to Messrs. Tessier's, nearly opposite its former situation.

THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE ENDOWMENT FUND.

With regard to this fund, in the absence of the Bishop, your Committee have nothing to add to the information furnished last year. It is believed that no additions to its amount, requiring special mention, have been received, nor has any change been made in the manner of its investment. The capital sum of upwards of £7,000 sterling is still administered by the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, as holding the same in trust for the purposes for which it has been contributed. This Society, it is proper to mention, kindly continues to make up the same income as heretofore, for the maintenance of the College.

BISHOPRIC ENDOWMENT FUND.

This fund, which was originated for the purposewhich its name bespeaks, has been already made-

known to the Clergy generally, who will, your Committee doubt not, promote its object to the utmost of their power and influence. Since last year, in addition to the vote from the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, of £2,000 sterling, then announced in their report, your Committee have the great pleasure of informing Members of the Church in this Diocese, that a further sum of £2,000 sterling, has been set apart by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, upon the same condition, viz., that an amount sufficient to make up a total of £10,000 sterling be raised within five years to meet these grants. A Committee to accomplish this object was formed in St. John's in September last, into the care of which sums have been already paid amounting to £1,805 15s. 5d. currency. Subscriptions have been promised by a few individuals, chiefly in St. John's, which, when realized, will make a total at the five years' end of not less than £3,750 currency, to be added to which, at the lowest estimate, your Committee are unwilling to suppose the congregational collections of the various Missions will yield less than £200 currency annually, or £1,000 in the aggregate, while, with special donations in hand, it cannot be expected that the five years allowed by the conditions of the grant of the two Societies which are our great benefactors, will produce less than another sum of equal amount to that collected by the Clergy in their Churches and among These results would leave a their congregations. sum of about £950 currency only to be provided by the large overflow of these estimates, which the liberal

and zealous way in which the appeal has been met in the capital, and the few places from which time has yet allowed of any response, reasonably leads your Committee with all confidence to expect as soon as the occasion for the appeal becomes generally known, and its great importance fully understood. Your Committee hope that the privilege of thus providing for their Bishop's future maintenance will be properly appreciated everywhere throughout the Diocese, and that offerings other than spontaneous which may be procured beyond its limits, will be in excess of the £10,000 sterling contemplated for the endowment and perpetuation of the Episcopate in this Colony of Newfoundland.

The absence of the Coadjutor Bishop on a voyage of visitation, has been already referred to. Your Committee feel, in returning to this circumstance, that however little mention of his graceful and generous action would be desired by him, it is incumbent upon them to speak in terms of most grateful acknowledgment of the noble gift by Joseph Curling, Esq., R. E., of the beautiful yacht Lavrock, to supply the place of the Church-ship Star, so unfortunately wrecked on the Western-shore, near Burgeo, in August last. the circumstances under which this offering to the needs of the Bishop and the Diocese was made they forbear to enter further, knowing that it would be distasteful to Mr. Curling; but they cannot help adding expression of their sense of the kind and thoughtful way in which, after having devoted his

ship to the use of the Church in this Colony, he supplied her with everything calculated to make her outfit as complete as possible in every detail for the holy service to which she had been thus dedicated. Your Committee trust God's fullest blessing may be given to her donor, and likewise to the work to which his gift has been so piously devoted. It only remains to record, in connection with this subject, that the Lavrock sailed North on her first voyage, as the Newfoundland Church Ship, on St. John Baptist's day, and has now gone South to complete work that was necessarily left undone last year in consequence of the shipwreck of the Star. His Lordship has visited Labrador from Battle Harbor to the North-shore of Esquimaux Bay, and Twillingate and Fogo on his return, and now purposes visiting St. Peter's and Lamaline, and the Missions of Burin and Harbor Buffett, in Placentia Bay.

Three Ordinations, all by the Coadjutor Bishop, have taken place since the last Annual Meeting of this Society. At Christmas, Mr. Winsor, of the Theological College, was ordained Deacon, and since Trinity Sunday the Rev. F. G. Hall, late Missionary at St. George's Bay, has been ordained Priest in the Cathedral, and at the same time Mr. Cecil Wilson, of the Theological College, was ordained Deacon. The Rev. George Bishop was the subject of the first ordination on the Labrador shore, having been ordained Priest at St. James' Church, Battle Harbor, during the Bishop's late voyage. Your Committee regret to state

that Mr. Hall has been obliged to return to England on account of ill health since his ordination, with scarcely any prospect of being able to resume work here. Mr. Wilson has gone to Bermuda at the Bishop's request.

A very important subject remains yet unmentioned. At the time of the last general meeting of the Church Society, a very large number of Clergy and Lay Delegates was assembled to consider the establishment of a Diocesan Synod. Nearly a week was given to the careful consideration of the business, resulting in the adoption of a "Declaration of Principles, Constitution, and Rules for electing a Bishop," together with the following resolution:—"That a Synod, in accordance with such Constitution and Rules, be established, and be styled "The Diocesan Synod of Newfoundland," and that the Lord Bishop be empowered to summon such Synod."

Very great harmony prevailed at this preliminary meeting, and great things are hoped from all future assemblies of our Synod. The Constitution and Rules have been printed and circulated, and the first meeting of the Synod is expected to be holden in St. John's next midsummer, and thenceforward biennially as provided and ordered by the Constitution. Representative action will thus, it is hoped, be brought to bear in assisting the Bishop in the constitutional government of the Diocese, and it is earnestly to be desired that all Missions and Clergy will join from the outset with

their Bishop and their brethren in securing that acceptance for the regulations of the Synod which will the more largely result in proportion as we are found to be more completely at unity among ourselves. A great benefit will follow should this wish be realized, and a good augury for its fulfilment, it is believed, exists in the unanimity which prevailed, and was the characteristic of the late proceedings in this business.

With renewed expressions of regret at the absence of both the Bishop of the Diocese and the Coadjutor Bishop, and with utterance of the feeling of grateful pleasure at the presence of His Excellency the Governor, your Committee close this their Thirty-first Annual Report, satisfied that from all that has occurred since the last similar meeting, there is abundant cause to "thank God and take courage."

N. B.—Clergymen subscribing to the above Fund are requested to be punctual in forwarding their own payments, in conformity with rules 4 and 5; and making collections throughout their Missions, and forwarding them to the Treasurer, as required by rule 7.

It is requested that subscriptions and collections may be remitted together as ordered by the latter clause of rule 7.

Subscriptions paid after Jan. 31, in each year, will come under a fine of 10 per cent. See rule 5.

It is particularly requested that all subscription lists and remittances to the Church Society may be made up and sent in, as far as practicable, not later than some time in the month of March in each year.

OF THE

CLERGY WIDOWS' AND ORPHAYS' FUND.

- 1.—THE NEWFOUNDLAND CHURCH SOCIETY'S Special Fund, for assisting the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen of the Diocese of Newfoundland, shall consist of all monies paid to the Treasurer of the Society for that object.
- 2.—The Committee of the Church Society shall have the management of the Fund.
- 3.—Every Hundred Pounds of available surplus shall be invested by the Committee as opportunities occur. Smaller sums shall be deposited every quarter in the Savings' Bank.
- 4.—All Clergymen in the Diocese holding the Bishop's license, may secure the benefit of this Fund by contributing within six months from the time of obtaining their License from the Bishop, as follows:—
 (1) Unmarried Clergymen and Widowers without a child, one pound (£1) per annum; (2) Married Clergymen (and such as shall afterwards become married,) and Widowers with a child, two pounds (£2) per annum.
- 5.—Annual subscriptions shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of January in each year: provided that Clergymen on entry shall for that year pay

only a rateable proportion of the annual subscription up to the 1st day of January following. Thirty days grace shall be allowed, but every Clergyman neglecting to make payment within that time, shall forfeit his claim upon the Fund. to be recovered only upon payment of arrears, with ten per cent. thereon, before the following 1st day of January.

6.—Any Clergyman neglecting to subscribe according to Rule 4, or to pay his annual subscription within the time limited by Rule 5, may, if the Committee see fit to admit or re-admit him, secure the benefit of the Fund by the payment of two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.) if married or a widower with a child; and one pound ten shillings (£1 10s.) if unmarried or a widower without a child, from the day on which the last annual subscription to be paid was due, or from the date of his being licensed by the Bishop, and from the date of such admission or re-admission, he shall come under the operation of Rule 4.

7.—Every Clergyman securing the benefit of this Fund will be required to make a yearly collection for the same in his Mission, and to forward the amount with his own annual subscription, to the Treasurer.

8.—The Widow of every Clergyman who shall have paid his annual subscription, and forwarded an annual collection, till his death, or till incapacitated by mental or bodily infirmity, shall be entitled to receive a yearly pension of thirty pounds (£30) currency, during widowhood.

9.—If the Fund should at any time permit, the Committee may increase the amount of pension to any sum not exceeding £50; such an addition, however, being subject to be withdrawn wholly or in part, should the state of the Fund not warrant its continuance.

10.—If the Widow die or marry again, the pension shall be paid to Trustees for the benefit of such Children of the deceased husband, as may be, if boys, under sixteen, if girls, under eighteen years of age.

11.—The Trustees named by a deceased Clergyman, in the event of the death or marriage of his Widow, shall be recognized by the Committee in paying the pension for the benefit of the child or children; but if the Trustees so named are unwilling or unable to act, the Bishop of the Diocese shall act as Trustee in the application of the pension.

12.—If the wife die before her husband, his child or children shall receive the pension, so long as there is a claimant under Rule ten.

13.—The pensions shall be paid half-yearly by the Bishop's order on the Treasurer, on the first of January and first of July. The first payment to be calculated for the interval from the husband's death to the day of payment.

14.—If a Clergyman having joined the Fund after the 24th June, 1863, removes from the Diocese after having served less than fourteen years, his connection with the Fund shall cease, and he shall be entitled to receive back half the amount of the annual subscriptions he has paid. If he removes after having served fourteen years and less than twenty-one years, he shall be allowed to remain in connection with the Fund by paying an annual subscription of six pounds or nine pounds if residing within the tropics; or he may receive back half his annual subscriptions, upon which his connection with the Fund shall cease. If he removes after having served twenty-one years, he shall be allowed to remain in connection with the Fund by paying an annual subscription of five pounds, or seven pounds ten shillings if residing within the

tropies; or he may receive back three-fourths of his annual subscriptions, upon which his connection with the Fund shall cease. All Clergymen in connection with the Fund previous to the 24th June, 1863, to be governed by the original Rule 14 thereof.

15.—A yearly statement of the Treasurer's accounts with this Fund shall be published, with the Society's Report.

16.—None of the above Rules shall be altered or repealed, except at a General Meeting of the Church Society, and after a full years' notice to the members of the proposed change.

The following is the Original Rule 14, governing Clergymen in connection with the Fund before June 24, 1863:—

"14.—If a Clergyman removes, with the Bishop's consent, from the Diocese, after officiating in it not less than seven years, he shall be allowed his claim upon the Fund, on the payment of an annual subscription of three pounds (£3); or, if he desire it, may receive back half the amount he has paid, which repayment shall release the Fund from all his claims upon it."
