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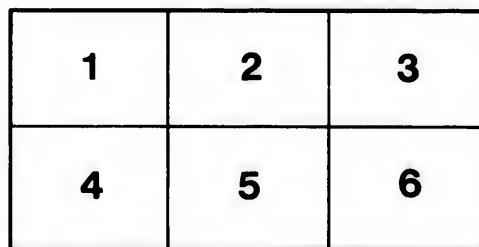
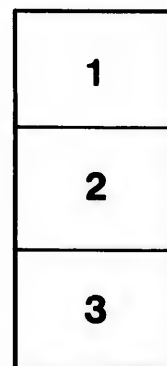
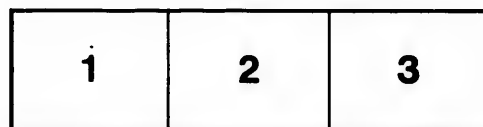

ECLIPSES.

THERE will be five Eclipses this year; three of the Sun and two of the Moon.

I. There will be an Eclipse of the Sun on the 11th January, at 11h. 19m. A. M., invisible in America except about Cape Horn.

II. There will be an Eclipse of the Moon on the 26th January, at 0h. 54m. P. M. consequently invisible to us.

III. There will be an Eclipse of the Sun on the 8th July, at 2h. 5m. A. M. invisible here. This Eclipse will pass central and total through Europe and Asia. It will be visible in every part of Europe, and in almost every part of Asia.

IV. There will be an Eclipse of the Moon on the 22d July, at 6h. 1m. A. M. invisible.

V. There will be an Eclipse of the Sun on the 31st Dec. at 2h 6m A. M. invisible to us,

Cap. 59. — Coin, Bullion, Diamonds, Horses, Mules, Asses, Neat Cattle, and all other live stock, Tallow, Raw Hides, Rice, Corn, Grain unground, Biscuit or Bread, Meal or Flour, Fresh Meat, Fresh Fish, Carriages of travellers, Wheat, Flour, Beef, Pork, Hams, Bacon, Wood and Lumber, Hay and Straw, Fruit and Vegetables, fresh; Salt, Cotton, Wool, Goods the produce of places within the British Dominions, imported from those places; or from the United Kingdom; Herrings, taken and cured by the inhabitants of the Isle of Man, and imported from thence; Lumber, the produce of and imported from any British Possession on the West coast of Africa; any sort of Craft, Food and Victuals, except Spirits, and any sort of Clothing and implements and materials, fit and necessary for the British fisheries in America, imported into the place, at or from whence such Fishery is carried on Drugs, Gums or Resins, Dye-wood and Hard-wood, Cabinetmakers' Wood, Tortoise-shell, Hemp, Flax and Tow.**

* This further duty is only charged when its amount, if any, shall exceed the amount of the previous duties, sec. 11, 3rd and 4th Will. IV. cap. 59, but as this is not likely to occur, except with very high priced articles, it may be considered as merely nominal.

† This further duty will, in every case, exceed the previous duty, the excess will, therefore, be charged; the amount payable cannot, however, be shewn by table, as it will vary in every case according to value of the article.

CHANGES in the PROVINCIAL LAWS.

The Provincial Duties are Sterling instead of Currency.

The 3 per cent, formerly allowed for waste in calculating the Provincial duties is discontinued.

The Drawback on Salt for the Fisheries is discontinued.

The Provincial Duty on Spirits is made chargeable according to strength by *Sykes'* Hydrometer, the gallons over-proof being liable to duty.

The Credit by Bond, formerly allowed on specific duties amounting to £20, under separate Acts, and the Credit on *ad valorem* duties amounting to £100, are discontinued. The Credit now allowed for £50 and upwards, is six months—but all bonds after 1st of September, are due on 1st April.

The Warehousing system is applied to the Provincial Duties, and the same Credit allowed on Goods ex Warehouse as when entered from the importing ship.

The following articles, formerly free, are made liable to 5 per cent. :—Apparel for private use, Butter, Cheese, Flax, Honey, Hemp, Pitch, Rice, Rosin, Skins, Tar and Turpentine.
