


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
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BEING THE SECOND AFTER LEAP-YEAR.

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ECLIPSES.

THERE will be five Eclipses this year; three of the Sun and two of the Moon.

I. There will be an Eclipse of the Sun on the 11th January, at 11h. 19m. A M., invisible in America except about Cape Horn.

II. There will be an Eclipse of the Moon on the 26th January, at 0h. 54m. P. M. conse-

quently invisible to us.

III. There will be an Eclipse of the Sun on the 8th July, at 2h. 5m. A. M. invisible here. This Eclipse will pass central and total through Europe and Asia. It will be visible in every part of Europe, and in almost every part of Asia.

IV. There will be an Eclipse of the Moon on the 22d July, at 6h. 1m. A.M. invisible,

V. There will be an Eclipse of the Sun on the 31st Dec. at 2h 6m A.M. invisible to us.

Dye-wood and? Hard-wood, Cabinetmakers' Wood, Tortoise-shell, Hemp, Flax and Tow.**

CHANGES in the PROVINCIAL LAWS.

The Provincial Duties are Sterling instead of Currency.

The 3 per cent, formerly allowed for waste in calculating the Provincial duties is discontinued.

The Drawback on Salt for the Fisheries is discontinued.

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The Provincial Duty on Spirits is made chargeable according to strength by Sykes' Hydrometer, the gallons over-proof being liable to duty.

The Credit by Bond, formerly allowed on specific duties amounting to £20, under separate Acts, and the Credit on ad valorem duties amounting to £100, are discontinued. The Credit now allowed for £50 and upwards, is six months—but all bonds after 1st of September, are due on 1st April.

The Warehousing system is applied to the Provincial Duties, and the same Credit allowed on Goods ex Warehouse as when entered

from the importing ship.

The following articles, formerly free, are made liable to 5 per cent.:—Apparel for private use, Butter, Cheese, Flax, Honey, Hemp, Pitch, Rice, Rosin, Skins, Tar and Turpentine.

The Act to create a Fund for defraying the expense of enabling Emigrants to proceed to the place of their destination, &c., will be in force after the first of March next.—Tax, 5s. each adult passenger.
