Third, the strips of leather that form the belting should be cut lengthways and not crossways of the hide, and then cemented and riveted with short Laps. ## MONTREAL

 DOMINION EXHIBITION GUIDE.MONTREAL
This the great Commercial Metropolitan City of the Domin:on and the most populous of Canadian cities, is situated at the head of navigation for ocean vessels, 540 miles from the Gulf of St. Lawrence, on the Island of the same name, which lies between the two great rivers of the north, the St. Lawrence and the Ottawa. The island is about 30 miles in length and at its widest some 10 in breadth. With the exception of the mountain, which rises to the height of about 550 feet, it is nearly level, and forms one of the most fertile districts of the Dominion, the climate being particularly favorable to the growth of nearly every kind of grain, vegetables and fruit, and from the display of the latter at the present Exhibition, will prove that no better can be grown in any part of the world.

The following are some of the noticeable incidents of the City and its commerce.

## THE PORT.

Montreal is the point at which ocean navigation terminates and inland navigation commences. Prior to 1851, only vessels of light draught could pass through Lake St. Peter and come up to the wharves ; but a lapse of twenty-nine years shows a great change, for vessels drawing twenty-two to twenty-five feet water now pass down from Montreal to the sea.

THE HARBOUR.
There is at present existing more than four miles of whartage in different points from Mill street to the cotton factory at Hochelaga of which more than one-half is in 24 feet depth of water and the Harbour Commissione2s have been duly justified in providing such extensive accommodation, by the immense increase of shipping, arriving in the port this summer, for any person visiting the City will be well repaid to visit the wharves, and witness the number of ships from the largest steamer, and first-class sailing clipper, to the smaller, barques, brigs, schooners etc. now moored along side the wharves, from one extreme end to the other.

## THE WHARVES.

The wharves are surmounted by a massive cut-stone wall, along the height of which is a pleasant promenade and wide street, affording a fine view of the

## CHARITABLE INSTITUTIONS.

Among the Principal of which are the following,
the montreal general hospital.
Owes its origin to the philanthropic efforts of a number of ladies who, about the year 1815. formed themselves into a Society calleo the "Ladies Benevolent Society." The inhabitants entered so heartily into the scheme that, in 1818, a fund of $£ \mathrm{I}, 200$ was raised for the purposes of the Society, and a soup kitchen was opened, where the ladies superintended the distribution ; but more than this was needed, and the necessity of providing for the sick was presented to the public. The citizens determined to proceed with the erection of a building, and on the 6th day of June, 1821, the foundation stone of the building (which now forms the centre portion) was laid with Masonic honors, by the Right Worshipful Sir John Johnson, Bart., Past Provincial Grand Master of Canada. In less than a year the building was finished, and on the first of May, 1822, it was opened for the reception of patients. On the 18 th May, 183 I , the Hon. John Richardson, the first President of the Institution, died, at the age of 76 years. His friends, des:rous of erecting some monument to his memory, at first decided to place a cenotaph in Christ Church, but, when the subscription list was closed, it was found that the amount subscribed for exceeded that required for the work, and, as the demands for admission to the hospital were greater than its capacity, it was resolved to devote the money thus acquired to the enlargement of the building, by erecting a wing, to be called the "Richardson Wing."

In 1848, the widow of the late Chief Justice Reid added the wing known as the "Reid Wing," as a monument to the memory of her husband.

Two years ago another wing was added in memory of Mr. Morland. This building fronts on St. Dominique street.

## THE WESTERN HOSPITAI.

An Act of Incorporation having been obtained in 1875, a subscription list was opened, and in a very short time upwards of $\$ 30,000$ was subscribed to build a hospital in the western part of the city, to be called the "Western Hospital," for the benefit of the sick poor, irrespective of creed, country or color. A large block of land was purchased upon the corner of Dorchester street and Atwater avenue, and upon one corner of this property Major Mills has erected a handsome building, costing $\$ 13,000$ dollars, which, will give room for about fifty beds.

The Governors have wisely determined not to open this building until they have sufficient money on hand to pay off a balance upon the land, and to complete and properly furnish the building. A great advance has been made towards obtaining this money, through the handsome legacies of $\$ 2,000$ by the late Benaiah Gibb, Esq., and of $\$ 5,000$ by the late lamented president of the hospital-Wm. Workman, Esq., and it only remains for some of our philanthropic citizens to follow their noble example, to enable the Governors to open an institution that would be a priceless blessing to the sick poor of the western part of the city, as well as to the many poor fellows who meet with accidents in the numerous manufactories along the canal, and upon the Grand Trunk Railway.

## THE HOTEL DIEU

Was founded in $\mathbf{r} 644$ by Mdme. de Bouilon for the reception of the sick and poor, and was situated in St. Paul street, along which it extended 324 feet, and on St. Sulpice it was 468 feet in depth. The buildings consisted of a hospita!, convent and church. Before the establishment of the Montreal General Hospital this was the only place to which the afflicted poor of the city could be sent for relief. It furnished for many years a refuge for the miserable, and help for the sick, to whose comforts the Sisters devoted themselves with the most praiseworthy benevolence. The increased demand for aid rendered it necessary that more extensive premises should be obtained, added to which was the fact, that the neighborhood was so thickly built up, that it became necessary to remove the hospital to a more open locality. To meet this the present extensive premises on St. Famille street were erected. This is the mast extensive religious edifice in America. It is composed of the church, convent and hospital. The grounds are surrounded by a massive stone wall, the circumference of which is one and a half miles. The physicians of the Institution are the Professors of the French School of Medicine. The surgical cases for the most part coming under the care of Dr. Hingston, late President of the Canada Medical Association, and one of the most accomplished surgeons on the Continent. Previous to the Conquest the Hotel Dieu was supplied with medicines and other necessaries by the French Government ; at present the funds are derived from rents of lands, charitable bequests or donations, and an annual grant from Parliament.

Is a large hospital and nunnery situated on Guy street, and extending south to Dorchester street. Of the size of the institution we may form an idea from the fact that at present it contains ${ }^{2} 39$ nuns [known as Sisters of Charity], 37 novices, and 500 inmates, while over 5,000 visits are made annually to the sick

## DRIVES

The drive to Back River, 6 miles from Montreal, is one of the most pleasant in the vicinity of the city. The roads are in splendid condition. and the scenery along the way is varied and attractive. On the banks of the River [the Ottawa] are situated the Convent of the Sacred Heart [one of the largest in the Dominion], the Palace of the Archbishop of Montreal, Jesuit's College, paper, saw, grist mills, \&c.

Here also is situated "Peloquin's Hotel," one of the largest and best situated country hotels in the Dominion. It commands a magnificent view of the Ottawa River, and from the piazza rafts may be seen shooting the Rapids and passing under the Bridge. Fishing, bathing and amusemedts of all kinds may be enjoyed here.

whose achievements there have been recognized by a statue adorning one of the entrances. The view from Mount Royal is very beautiful ; suddenly, after an easy ascent by a winding road, we are looking forth on the city with its spires, its gardens, and avenues; beyond is the broad flowing St. lawrence, with the Victoria Bridge and the Lachine Rapids just visille in the distance; fading away toward the horizon are the fhills of Vermont, many miles away. A road from the Park connects with the Mount Royal [Protestant] and Ronan Catholic Cemeteries, two beautiful burial places, with many fine monuments and tombs.

The next drive is the one "arocnd the molentan." This was, until lately, the drive, and still remains a pleasant and attractive one ; beautiful bits of scenery may be seen all along the route.

The drive to Lachine, nine miles distant, is of great interest ; the Rapids can be leisnrely viewed, and the descent of a steamer observed by properly timing the excursion. The great masonry works on the new canal will also shew some of the resources of nodern engineering, in the powerful steam derricks and excavators used.

Another favorite drive is, in an opposite direction to the last, to Longue Pointe, passing through the village of Hochelaga. The river scenery in this direction is very fine, and of quite a different character from that west of the city. It takes us through the villaga of Hochelaga, the terminus of the new railroad recently constrcuted, the Quebec, Montreal, Ottawa and Occidental. About a mile from the depot is the beautiful convent of the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary, where many young ladies from the United States receive their education. The next noteworthy building is the Lmatic Asylum. This immense house, containing nearly eight hundred maniacs, idiots and imbeciles, is controlled by the Sisters of Providence ; these ladies, with the exception of a physician and six guardians for desperate characters, having sole charge. They find no trouble in the care of the numerous inmates, and, by their kindness and tact, restore the mental balance in all the cases where a cure is possible in a tithe of the time it used to take in the old days, when the insane were treated with harshness anid cruelty.

On our way to Longue Pointe we notice St. Helen’s Island, now, a free public pari, with its disarmed fortifications, and the villages of Longueuil, Boucherville and Varennes on the opposite bank of the river.

## NELSON'S MONUMENT.

This monument, erected in 1808 to the memory of the hero of Trafalgar, stands in Jacques Cartier Square. The monument is built in limestone, and the ornaments are of a composition invented by Code $\&$ Secly, of London, Eng., and were executed by them. The base is square six and a half feet broad on each side, and about ten feet high. From the top of this a circular shaft or column rises fifty feet in height and five feet in diameter. It is of the Doric order, and finished with mouldings. On the top of the pillar is a square tablet, the whole surmounted with a statue of Nelson, cight feet in height. The principal ornaments are in panels on the four sides of the base or pedestal, and are emblematical of the battle of the Nile. On the panel on the upper side are cannon, anchors and other naval trophies, with a laurel wreath, which surrounds the following inscription :-

## IN MEMORY OF

The Right Honorable Vice-Admiral Lord Viscount Nelson, Duke of Bronnte, who terminated his career of naval glory in the memorable battle of Trafalgar, On the 21 st of October, 1805 , after inculcating by signal, this sentiment, never to be forgotten by his county :
"england expeots every man whl do his duty." This monumental column was erected by the inhabitants of Montreal in the year 1808.

## THE VICTORIA BRIDGE

Serves the important purpose of giving uninterrupted rail communication between the Eastern States, Canada and the Great West. It is used only for railway transit, and gives to the Grand Trunk Railway full control of railway approaches from the East. This great work, was completed in 1860, under the superintendence of Robert Stephenson and his associates, and is one and a quarter miles in length or two miles including the extensions. It is supported on twenty-four piers, the central span being three hundred feet, the remaining ones two hundred and forty-two, with massive abutments ; the bridge tube is of iron twenty-two feet high by sixteen wide, slightly lessening at the ends. It was erected at a cost of $\$ 6,300,000$. The height of the centre span above ordinary river level is sixty feet. Three million cubic feet of masonry and ten thousand tons of iron enter into the construction of this gigantic work. Near the centre there is an opening which affords a magnificent view of the river and city. No railroad train is allowed to enter this bridge without a written permit from the proper officer, this insuring exemption from collision or accident ; the passage is somewhat cheerless, occupying some six minutes, though seeming much longer to the passenger. By obtaining a permit at the Grand Trunk offices, tourists can inspect a portion of the interior of the bridge. The river beneath the bridge has a swift current, and the piers are calculated to withstand immense pressure from descending masses of ice.

## PROGRAMME:

The Exhibition will open at 9 a.m., on Tuesday the 14th of September, and continue open until two o'clock, p.m., on Frid\&y, the 24th of Neptember, closing daily at six p.m.

His Excellency the Governor-General will formally open the Exhibition on Tues. day, the 21 st September, at two o'clock in the afternoon, when an address will be presented to His Excellency by the Committee.
The Industrial portion of the Exhibition, including Manufactures, Arts, Implements and Machinery, \&c., (by no means the least interesting branch), will be on view from the opening to the close. The show of Horses, Cattle, Sheep, Pigs, Poultry, Agriculturad and Dairy Products will take place during the second week, when every branch of the Exhibition will be in full operation.
It is also the intention of the Committee to provide several prominent attractions outside of the regular Exhibition, during its continuance.
Great alterations have been made, and also many additions to the grounds for the present Exhibition. Seven acres have been taken in, and numerous edifices have been erected, and quite changed its aspect and appearance. They front on Mount Royal Avenue, the road connecting Bleury and Main streets. Bleury runs on one side of the grounds and the continuation of St. Urhaln on the other. The main entrance is from Mount Royal Avenue and, for the public, will be through registering turnstiles. There will be six of these, three entrances and three exits placed at convenient distances, so that there may be no confusion for people going in or ${ }^{\text {- }}$ departing from the grounds. It will be necessary to present the right change for admission, which can, however, be procured at the Exchange Office close by the Turnstile Entrance. front on Mount Royal Avenue. At this end of the grounds is also the otlice of the C'ommittee, Secretary, Judges, Press, 'lelegraph, Police, l'arcel Room, dc.

After passing the gate the visitor has a fise coup d'ruil of the grounds and Buildings. Away up the contre is the main building, the Crystal Palace as it is called, and on the left hand side, extending towards the gate, the Carriage Building, the stalls for over two hundred horses, extending alinost the whole width of the grounds.

On the right hand side, as the visitor looks up the grand avenue that leads to the centre buidding, are the Machinery Hall, nearest the top of gromil, the l'oultry llouse, and liggery, two long buildings for sheep, and about five hundred stalls, from five to seven feet wide. There is also stabling for seventy five animals for Lxlibition purposes.

Having seen this prospect the visitor can march up the Ivenue to the main building, but his attention is tirst attwoted by the great ring for cattle. Here it is intended to have a prize cattle procession every day, so that visitors may the easier view the animals. The splendid horses which will be exhibited this year will show their paces in the ring.

## THE MAIN BUILDING

This it is seen is built after the morlel of the Great Crystal Palace, erected by Prince Albert to receive the first world's exhibition in 1851 , and will attract the attention of every person on entering the grounds, it is of brick except the dome and roof which are made of iron and glass. It is capacions, well lighted and ventilated. It is in the sliape of a large eross, being one lundred and oighty feet long, eighty feet wide, and the transepty each cighty feet by sixty feet in width-from the ground flo or to the top of the dome is 120 ft . high. An annex has been added to this building and is connected by a 24 feet wido passage, the dimensions aro 145 feet in length by 73 feet in breadth. This gives a very large area to the Main Building, and forms one of the finest Exhibition Buildings in the Dominion.

Large galleries also extend around the Main Building.

## THE MAIN RESTAURANT.

This, altho' perhaps of minor importance to some, is of great importance to the many, for it is not probable that exhibitors or visitors would like to andergo the "Tanner" principle-therefore it has been provided that those who do not wish to do so should be well taken care of, and consequently good arrangements are made for them. The principle building for it is close to the Crystal Palace, inclining to the left, it is eighty-five feet long by fifty-five feet wide, witl a capacious kitchen attached. This Restaurant is under the management of tho well known caterer, Victor Ollevon, lately chef de cuisine at the Windsor, hero can be procured refreshments from the light lunch to the most recherche dinner, and all at City prices.

For the convenience of the many persons who will visit the gronnds three lesser Restaurants are provided where may be obtained anything, from a sandwich to a more substantial repast, also temperance drinks of all kinds, these are situated in different parts of the grounds to suit the convenience of the public.

## THE MACHINERY HALL.

On the right of the Main Building will be seen the Machinery IIall, this will be a great centre of Interest. It is a spacious building and has a very fine appearanceit is 120 feet long by 50 feet wide, with two transepts each 31 feet wide. The machinery will be driven by a line of shafting by a very powerful engine. This engine has been supplied by Messr's. Thompson \& Williams, of Stratford, at their own expense. The boilers are supplied by Messrs. W. P. Bartley is Co, of Montreal. The large leather belt supplied by Messrs. Barry, Snith d Co, at this city (free of expense) is well worthy of inspection.

## MANITOBA BUILDING.

A short distance from the Root and Grain Building will be seen the building for the Manitoba exhibits, no doubt this will attract much attention to people from all parts. This country now becoming a very important part of the Dominion. This building is 100 by 36 feet..

## ADMISSION TO THE GROUNDS.

The entry tickets upon animals or articles will admit the person bringing them to the Show Grounds for exhibition, along with such animals or articles without the use of any other ticket. Afterwards, such parties must he provided with proper passes, as above.

## FIRE AND POLICE PROTECTION.

Every possible precaution will be made to guard against fire; and with the precautions taken it is believed the danger of such an occurrence is very remete, but exhibitors desiring insurance must give the matter their personal attention.
An ample police force, detailed for the purpose by the city, will be on duty night and day during the continuance of the Exhibition. A full corps of watchmen will also be present at all times ; but exhibitors are expected to exercise constant supervision over their articles on exhibition, as the Committee will not be responsible for loss or damage by theft, fire, or otherwise. Small and valuable articles should be exhibited in show cases, which may be securely locked when desirable.

## TELEGRAPH AND POST OFFICES.

The Montreal and Dominion Telegraph Companies will have offices on the grounds; and a Post office will also be provided for the delivery and dispatch of letters. Telephone communication will also be established with the City.
