

Sun cable.)—The American attempt to bring the Sultan to terms excites comparative little interest in Europe, chiefly because the Old World does not expect the New to succeed in a game wherein European diplomats always fall.

Boer Force of 10,000 Came Thru Wessels' Nek, But Fell Back When They Saw the Mounted Infantry.

London, April 22.—(S. A. M.)—A command of 10,000 Boers came thru Wessels' Nek Sunday morning. They crossed Sunday's bridge and advanced to the crest of a ridge, but fell back when they saw the mounted infantry, who opened fire. Later the Boers shelled Elandsbaagte colliery. Ten shells fell close to the mine, but did no damage. The work at the mine was stopped, but it is hoped will be resumed tomorrow. The British guns opened fire. The naval brigade, on the right, sent a few shells in the direction of the Boer camp, which was pointed on a long ridge, 4000 yards to the right of the bridge. They were difficult to locate, but the Boers were seen retreating over the hills toward Wessels' Nek. Several of the shells caught the Boers, and have done some damage. Late in the day the Boers showed activity in the direction of the mine at Elandsbaagte. They fired 407 shells toward it to relinquish their work. This position was only 4800 yards distant from Elandsbaagte.

Rundle's Force in Action. Lord Roberts Wires That the Boers Were Driven From the Position Near Wepener.

London, April 22.—(S. A. M.)—The War Office has received the following despatch from Lord Roberts: "Bloemfontein, April 21.—Rundle's force came in contact with the enemy yesterday morning at 10:30 a.m. The Boers occupied strong positions covering the town. The Yeomanry and Mounted Infantry seized another position, which enabled Rundle to drive the enemy off and occupy the high ground the enemy had been holding. Rundle advanced this morning early, and the Boers again engaged with the enemy. Our casualties yesterday were two men severely, and seven men slightly wounded."

Has Dewet Been Killed? London, April 22.—The Daily News has the following from Lord Roberts, dated Friday, April 20: "It is reported here that Gen. Dewet has been killed."

How a Great Injustice is Being Done to Ordinary Citizens Under the Law.

The following is a carefully prepared and absolutely correct summary of chap. 8, 62, Victoria, "An Act to supplement the Revenue Act of the Province of Ontario, passed April 1st, 1899, and shows its results up to date. In entering upon the subject it is advisable that a brief reference be made to the Assessment Act of 1899. Section 2, sub-section 2, defines personal property as goods, chattels, interest on mortgages, dividends from bank stocks, value, notes and accounts at their actual value, and all other property except real property. Section 6 says that all municipal taxes shall be levied equally upon the whole rateable real and personal property. Section 25 says that real and personal property shall be assessed at their actual value as they would be appraised in payment of a just debt, from a solvent debtor. Section 29 enacts in part that the personal property of an incorporated company shall be assessed against the company in the same manner as if the company were an unincorporated body, in practice which is the sub-section under which Loan and Insurance Companies are assessable. Section 18 says that real property shall be assessed in the municipality and ward in which it is situated. Section 43 says that municipal property in the sole possession and under the sole control of any person, trustee, guardian, executor or administrator shall be assessed against such person, trustee, guardian, executor or administrator as if he were a solvent debtor. From these different sections it is quite clear that the Legislature intended that no real or personal property, except where expressly exempted, should escape the assessment. Having these primary facts in mind, we now approach the radical changes as enacted by section 6 of the Ontario Revenue Act.

GERMANS IN BRAZIL

Have Prospered on Land Granted by Dom Pedro and Are Growing Obstreperous. THE GERMAN FLAG WAS RUN UP At Which Brazilians Were Annoyed - Germans Now Said to be Bringing in Guns.

Washington, D.C., April 22.—The public should be prepared for frequent news that which comes thru the press despatches from Brazil about a movement to establish German sovereignty in the southern part of that republic. Many years ago Emperor Dom Pedro, for the establishment of a German colony, made a grant of several million acres of land in Rio Grande do Sul, which has the best climate, the best pastures, the most fertile soil and the greatest advantages for immigrants in any part of Brazil. It has grown and prospered until it is now the most progressive and the wealthiest portion of the republic, including several hundred thousand Germans, and the number is increasing rapidly. They have never bothered about politics, but have attended to their business and made money. Occasionally, however, their national characteristics have been displayed, when local affairs did not suit them, and the Brazilian authorities have been taught to ignore the rights of them, as well as an apprehension that their love of independence might ultimately impair the authority of the Government.

Much interest was taken in the words of His Lordship by the fact that he was for six or seven years a parishioner of St. Paul's, and first coming to Toronto, His Lordship, during his remarks, reviewed the history of the church since its inception in 1827, when the original structure, a frame building with a tall spire, was erected on East Bloor-street, in 1841, by J. G. Howard, architect. The spire was made of four pine trees, each 80 feet long, presented to the church by Hon. W. Allan of Meade Park, and was put together on the ground and then raised into position. This frame building was opened for divine service on Sunday, June 22, 1841, by Rev. Charles Matthews. The land was deeded by Hon. Mr. Allan and the late James Henderson. In 1852 the frame building was replaced by the present Gothic structure, at a cost of \$25,000. The frame church was removed to the north side of West Bloor-street, and to the south side of the new building.
