Actificial Arm.—Mr. Phelps, of this city, known as an ingenious constructor of trusses, abdominat supports, and other useful apparatus, completed an artificial arm last week, for a lady in Maine, that is an admirable substitute for the lost member. He took a cast in plaster, of the limb on the left side, and then matched it in wood. The elbow works delightfully; the wrist has both flexion and rotation, and all the fingers, and even the thumb, which has the true ball and socket-joint, are so skilfully made, that, when gloved, no gentleman who was permitted to take her arm under his own, would mistrust that it was a wooden one. Nearly half the arm, from the shoulder down, was preserved for a stump, which slips into a socket—and the whole is made fast and kept up in place by attachments to a thoracic belt, analogous to common stays. By the stump, any direction the lady chooses can be given to the extremity; but the flexion and extension is adroitly brought about by the other hand.
