SAINT JOHN: TUESDAY, AUGUST 18, 1829.

The arrival of the July Mail on Saturday last, has furnished us with London dates to the 3d of that month. We are thus enabled to announce the prorogation of Parliament on the 24th June, and to lay before our readers His Majesty's Speech, delivered by the Lord Chancellor, on that important occasion.

WE understand that His Majesty's Sloop Columbine, Captain the Hon. Mr. Townsend, is to relieve the Rose, on this station, for the remainder of the season. The Rose returns to Halifax about the 25th instant, whence the Columbine has proceeded for Quebec, with despatches for Rear-Admiral Sir Charles Ogle.

ANNO DECIMO GEORGI IV. REGIS. CAP. XLIII.

An Act to amend the Laws relating to the Customs. [19th June, 1829.]

WHEREAS several Acts were passed in the sixth year of His present Majesty's reign, for consolidating the Laws of the Colonies, and for making certain alterations and amendments therein; be it therefore enacted by His Majesty's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, That from and after the Twenty-first day of June, One thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, the several Enactments herein-after contained shall come into and be in full force and operation, for all the purposes mentioned therein in like manner as if such Duties and Drawbacks had been imposed in and by the said last-mentioned Act, or by any other Act, and had been set forth in the Tables thereto annexed: (that is to say)

TABLE OF NEW DUTIES INWARDS, 1829.

Table listing duties for various goods including Anchoveries, Boots, Shoes, Calashes, and Women's Boots and Calashes.

MELANCHOLY OCCURRENCE.—On Monday morning last, at Mr. CALVEY'S CAMP, in company with a Mr. Davis, a ship-carpenter, was crossing the Oronto in a canoe, about three miles above the entrance of the River, he accidentally fell out, and, melancholy to relate, was drowned. He has left a wife and seven children, to lament a loss, which can never be repaired.

MEANWHILE ACCIDENT.—On Friday evening last, as Mr. John Manson, of the Parish of Douglas, with his hired man were returning from Richards' Carding Mill, (in a Canoe,) whether they had gone for the purpose of taking home some wool, having proceeded as far as Captain Currie's, where the water is very rapid, it was discovered that the water was making its way into the Canoe, and in the act of shifting the bags of wool, the Canoe unfortunately upset and precipitated both into the river: the man made every exertion to save Mr. Manson, but without effect, and he was unfortunately drowned, leaving an aged widow and nine children to lament the loss of a kind husband and indulgent parent.

Mr. Manson was a native of Scotland, from the County of Nairn, and in the 70th year of his age.—Royal Gazette.

The Weather during last week has been intensely warm, and many have been complaining of its debilitating effects. On Saturday, and yesterday afternoon, there were several very heavy peals of thunder, accompanied by vivid flashes of lightning, but we have not heard of any bad consequences resulting therefrom.
