Though brief the letter contained several matters that will be of particular interest to the people of Dawson. One is concerning the Klondike Mines Railway. Mr. Bradford says that he had met Mr. Fitzhugh and Mr. Heney in New York only the week before and they assured him and he is morally sure the road will be built to the Forks this season. He also says that he has received the assurance from the most authentic sources that a portion of the Valdez road will also be constructed. During the winter the writer confessed to having done all in his power toward dispelling the local ignorance prevalent in that section concerning the Yukon and Alaska, and he still has several letters yet to deliver before leaving for the north. At the time of his writing, Buel the cartoonist had just arrived in New York on his first visit to the metropolis and had called on Mr. Bradford. GOLD RUN SULPHUR

Sluicing is in Progress Along the Creeks

Dumps on No. 2 Below Sulphur Showing Up Far Better Than Was Expected.

On Monday, April 27th, sluicing commenced on Gold Run, Sulphur, and Dominion below the mouth of Gold Run. Brown of 256 Dominion, Morrison Bros. of 32 Gold Run and Crowley and McBride of No. 2 below Sulphur were the first to open the season. By the time this appears in print sluicing will be general on these creeks.

Crowley & McBride had their first clean-up on Tuesday, which showed that their dump is much richer than they had anticipated. Should they claim turn out as well as this one, No. 2 below, a surprisingly large yield of gold dust may be looked for on Sulphur creek. The above mentioned dump is running 25 ounces to the man for eight hours work. Similar gratifying results are being obtained on Gold Run and Dominion.

No. 8 below will be worked extensively this summer. A large plant will be operated and a great many men employed. This property belongs to "Humboldt" Gates and the working of it will be managed by his brother Ed.

No. 265 Dominion, recently prospecting by Mr. Woolfery, is considered to be one of the rich claims in this particularly rich vicinity. It shows an immense body of pay dirt which runs from 25 to \$1 to the pan.

A building boom has struck the new town of "Palmer" on 244 Dominion in real earnest. Within the last fortnight there have been erected a barber shop, a public hall, a Roman Catholic church, two stores, a bath house, a new roadhouse, a butcher shop and several other buildings, both private and public. A business centre of this kind is of great convenience to the miners.

90-19 and 20 below and on No. 1 below Sulphur there have been difficulties with regard to wages and nearly all the men employed on these claims struck last Monday. They had been receiving \$4 per day and board, but refused to work longer unless they were given an increase of 25 per cent. Other operators on Sulphur are still paying the usual wages of \$5 per day and board. It

NEWS FROM WESTWARD

Miller and Glacier Coming to the Front

Upwards of 300 Tons of Supplies Carried Into That Country Last Season.

Daniel McGuire, formerly in the employ of the N. W. M. P., in the capacity of detective, but now in the roadhouse business, having no less than three hostleries west of Dawson on the Miller, Glacier and Boacher trail, was in town a day or two ago when he stated that already travel between Dawson and the creeks above mentioned is picking up and that the prospects for a lively season to the westward are very flattering.

Mr. McGuire says that between 300 and 400 tons of supplies were taken to the above mentioned and other western creeks last season and that the demand this year will exceed that of last fully 50 per cent. He says a government ferry across the Yukon at Dawson would do more to stimulate the development of the country to the westward than any other feature, but that the miners are confident this boon will be extended them in the very near future, in fact at the meeting of the Yukon council next week.

Mr. McGuire says that from information gleaned from miners coming in for supplies the clean-up on Miller and Glacier this summer will surprise those who have imagined them to be little more than wage propositions.

No Arrests Yet Made New York, April 13.—No arrests have as yet been made as a result of the investigation, said to be in progress of the charges that an alleged promotion syndicate has been operating to secure payment from employees of the New York postoffice for increases in salaries. Postmaster Van Cott said today that he had heard nothing official from Washington yet concerning the alleged post-office scandals. He is still loth, he said, to believe that any such syndicate exists.

SKAGWAY LOTHARIO

Comes to Grief After Deserting Family

Francis Marion Rumbaugh Will Serve Fifteen Months on McNeil's Island.

Early day Skagwayans will remember Francis Marion Rumbaugh who, with his wife and four or five children, resided there from the spring of 1898 until 1900, in which year they returned to their former home in Oregon. A few months ago Francis Marion returned to Skagway with another woman who he introduced as his wife, giving but that No. 1 had been gathered to his people. His statement was accepted and No. 2 was welcomed to Skagway society. Everything was as smooth as a skid road for sometime, but with the arrival of a steamer one day from the south wife No. 1 marched down the gang plank with blood in her eye and the billing and roaring of Francis Marion Rumbaugh and Mattie Barry was rudely terminated.

Now wife No. 1 has her revenge for at the late term of court held at Skagway the gay husband and his paramour were each sentenced to the U. S. penitentiary on McNeil's Island for fifteen months.
