



Freehold Farms For Fighters Tweyle Thousand Acres Given As Homesteads For Veteran Warriors London, Sept. 16—An estate of 12000 acres on which soldiers and sailors can settle after the war has been given to Scotland. The donor is the Duke of Suth-erland who owns large tracts of fine land in Northern Scotland. It is the first practical step in the United Kingdom in a move-ment to provide small farms for veterans of the great war. 



WONDERFUL VICTORY FOR LIBERALS IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

The Provincial elections in British Columbia last week re-sulted in almost a clean sweep for the Liberal candidates only six Conservatives out of 47 be-ing safely elected.
