TWELFTH YEAR.
THE BOLT HAS PETERED OUT.

MR. CHAPLEAU'S NEW FAULTS TO BEHOLD, TAKING SUBSTANCE.

It Shows Government and Then Efforts—The Minister Can Do Without the "Big Head" Secretary of State and He is Simply Ignored—Angers and Outlets for the Cabinet.

MONTREAL, Oct. 29.—The Chapleau bolt is petering out. When I left Ottawa and reached here this morning I found the political pot boiling, or rather the sensational papers so heated. At present his name is being rapidly subsiding. Mr. Chapleau, attended by two of his followers, was to be seen driving about in a one-horse hack, smoking cigars and appearing before the public with a full head of steam on.

The party drove up to the St. Lawrence Hall, where they were surrounded by a few other members of the opposition. The party was long back here, and then all adjourned to a parlor for a confab. Thereafter Mr. Chapleau jumped again into a cab and started for Ottawa.

The great bulk of the people are paying no attention to him, and of the few who are watching him the majority are laughing at him. It is all over with the Chapleau movement, and there is no doubt that Mr. Abbott will manage to get along with the government as a colleague. Mr. Chapleau has given up the idea of resigning, though he is aware of the fact that Mr. Abbott and his colleagues have made up their minds not to build a cabinet with him. The Chapleau kind will go out of power.

But there is no denying that the Chapleau wing may still be in the air. The party is still together, but they would not hold together a week and by two weeks they would be broken up. As far as I can gather, Governor Angers will soon be brought to Ottawa. He will then Mr. Oulmet, and after that the retirement of Sir Adolphe Caron will be looked upon as a foregone conclusion. Sir Adolphe Caron will be succeeded by Sir Hector Langevin and some other member of the cabinet. The other changes in the cabinet will be made.

HE HAD RESIGNED.

No Doubt that the Secretary Had Resigned.

Ottawa, Oct. 29.—Hon. J. A. Chapleau has resigned. There is not the slightest doubt but the Secretary of State has resigned.

This morning Mr. Chapleau's private secretary was in the Minister's office, busy with a staff of clerks packing up the Minister's private letters and correspondence. The private secretary was asked whether he had any definite answer as to whether his Minister had resigned or not, but he said he did not know. He said he was waiting for a definite answer from Mr. Chapleau.

Mr. Chapleau's resignation was announced by a note to the effect that he had resigned. The note was signed by Mr. Chapleau and was addressed to the Prime Minister.

There is a disposition in political circles this evening to believe that the Chapleau crisis is nearing an end. That the resignation of Mr. Chapleau is the end of the matter is the opinion of many. It is believed that Mr. Chapleau has resigned and that the cabinet will be reorganized and re-habilitated.

TOO MUCH BONE IN THE MEAT.

It is estimated, however, that in addition to the loss referred to there has been considerable damage done along the coast.
