the high contracting parties for protecting the lives or property of its subjects.

"Article 2.—If either Great Britain or Japan, in defence of their respective interests as above described, should become involved in war with another power, the other high contracting party will maintain strict neutrality and use its efforts to prevent other powers from joining in hostilities against its





Suggests Public Sentiment as Remedy for the Growing Tendency.

BY JAMES BRENNOCK. Nestor of the Chicago labor movement and treasurer of the Carpenters' District

It is not only brutal, of is inhuman, for an employer to say that a man who has spent his whole life at a business shall be carded at 45 years of age. It might be charitable to have a law to shoot a man at 45, as has been suggested, if he is to be denied work at that age. It would put him out of misery. A man is in his prime, in the vigor of physical and mental attainments at that period of his

life, when work is a comfort and idleness would be torture for him. What would you say to the proposition to take a man out of professional life at

professional man is of the most value. This is true. It is the same way with a mechanic. Both improve on their methods with experience, and their work is more to be relied on than that of young men.

Ill Health Only & Bar.
With a man in general good health, the
capacity to perform is not impaired at 45, and certainly his intellect is not impaired at 40, unless incapacitated by ill-health, a mechanic is just as capable as a professional man from 45 to 60. I am 74 years old. If in the old days employers had enforced a rule depriving me of work at 45, whit would I have done for the past 29 years? I worked steadily at my trade until after I was 60 years old at regular journeyman's wages. Of late years I have worked constantly in the trades union movement, and still feel equal to the daily tasks of a busy life. Last summer I worked at my trade some. 
