London, Feb. 4.—The secret investigation into the leakage of information over the unwarmed six weeks ago, has just been completed.

Leys' Source of Information. Newspapers have repeatedly given what purported to be evidence in support of these allegations, and of the marvelous means of communication used to be possessed by Dr. Leyds.

Where is the Traitor? The solution of the mystery is that there has been a treacherous leakage of news, and the traitor is located either in the Eastern Telegraph Company's staff or in the War Office itself.

Telegraphers Repudiate It. The Eastern Telegraph Co. are proud of their staff and confident of their loyalty, and they scout the idea that the leakage is upon their system.

Two or Three Routes. There are two or three routes over which messages might go, such as the Atlantic cable to Bilbao, and the American cables to New York and back by the French cable.

MR. GEORGE MONRO DEAD.

Well-Known Customs Appraiser in Toronto Passed Away From Heart Failure on Saturday.

Mr. George Monro, the well-known appraiser at the Toronto custom house, passed away quite suddenly at his home, 485 Sherbourne-street, on Saturday, Mr. Monro was attacked by grip on Wednesday, but his family did not think his illness was serious. On Friday, however, his condition became worse, and he passed away on the following day from heart failure.

George Monro was not only one of the landmarks of Toronto but also a family man. He was the father of a family of five children. His father, the late George Monro, was an eminent attorney and a member of the Legislature for the Third Riding of York.

The deceased was a widower and leaves two sons and one daughter, who are at home. He was 70 years of age and entered the customs service in 1872.

The late Mr. Monro, who was a long resident of the Queen's Hotel before his death, was a brother of Mr. George Monro.

There is a large estate in Toronto in the hands of the 3-year-old family. This includes Monro Park, on East Queen-street. The funeral will take place this afternoon at 4 o'clock at the residence of the customs house will attend in a body.

SMALLPOX SCARE AT ROSSLAND.

Everybody Must Be Vaccinated - Mails Are Delayed for Fumigation at Northport.

Roseland, N.C., Feb. 3.—The Local Board of Health today issued a proclamation directing that all the inhabitants of Roseland be forthwith vaccinated, as a preventive against the smallpox epidemic in Washington and other states to the south.

Incumbent mail continues to arrive in some what irregular fashion, and the mails opened mail bags are detained at Northport, and fumigated for 16 hours, and then sent on. Closed bags come this direction and most of the eastern and western Canadian mail comes by this route.

An isolated hospital building has been completed, but so far no cases of smallpox have occurred. The health authorities keep up a strict quarantine over passengers, mail and baggage from the south.

TEACHERS SUSPENDED

Because It is Thought They Did Not Use Due Diligence in Rescuing Children From Fire.

Trenton, N.J., Feb. 3.—Miss Maria M. Wright and Miss Sallie Cullis, teachers of the Livingston public schools, have been suspended, pending an investigation as to whether they used due diligence in getting the children out of the burning school house yesterday afternoon.

The teachers claim the children became unmanageable for them to jump from the windows. Had the children followed the teachers down the stairs, some would have been injured. None of the injuries proved fatal.

LEGAL FIGHT OVER AN ESTATE.

New York, Feb. 3.—Rudolf Evans, a brother of the late Dr. Thomas W. Evans, the millionaire dentist, who saved the Empress Eugenie by taking her out of Paris in his Airship, has sued the executors of his brother's estate for a partition of the real property owned by Dr. Evans in this state. Dr. Evans died in Paris in November, 1897. He had no wife, and the bulk of his property was left by him to different institutions.

A Blase at Prescott. Prescott, Feb. 4.—A fire occurred about 12 o'clock last night in the store known as the Glasgow Bros., dry-goods merchants, of this place. The fire is supposed to have caught from the chimney in the attic. The firemen were promptly on the spot, and succeeded in containing the fire to the attic. The stock was considerably damaged by smoke and water. Stock and building fully insured. Loss at present unknown.

Prominent Brockville Man Dead.

Brockville, Feb. 4.—H. B. Street, died very suddenly this afternoon of pneumonia. He has for many years conducted a jewelry business, and was one of Brockville's most prosperous business men. He was 65 years of age.

MR. BRECKHAM SWORN IN.

Frankfort, Ky., Feb. 3.—Gov. Goebel died exactly at 6.44 o'clock. Arthur Goebel of Cincinnati and Mrs. Braumaker of Ohio, a married sister, both of whom have been constant attendants at the dying man's bedside, were alone with him when the end came. They had previously requested Dr. C. P. H. Stock to perform the duties of a physician.

Stricken with sorrow and anguish, the brother and sister did not move from their places. He entered the room and the door was closed for a few minutes. Soon after Dr. Hume's arrival, and to him Arthur Goebel announced that Mr. Goebel had died at 6.44 o'clock. At 7.37 notices of Mr. Goebel's death were passed thru the hotel corridors.

Mr. Breckham Sworn In. Frankfort, Ky., Feb. 3.—The death of Mr. Goebel, J. C. W. Breckham was sworn in as Governor of the state, the oath being administered by J. Shaker, clerk of the Court of Appeals.

The first official action of a new Governor was an appointment of a new Attorney-General, and his last act before assuming the oath was an order removing Adjutant-General Collier and Assistant Adjutant-General Dixon.

Mr. Breckham seemed deeply affected by the position in which circumstances had placed him, and during the ceremony of joy over the congratulations which, although in the room showered upon him, also he accepted them gratefully.

Covington Mueh Shocked. Covington, Ky., Feb. 3.—The news of Goebel's death produced intense feeling in this city, and all parties to the funeral were tolled, and people gathered in groups and talked of the event in low tones. Nothing is said about the arrangements for the funeral, because all of the details are being kept secret. It is thought by some here that he may be buried in Frankfort, in order to have a monument at the State Capitol.

WRIT OF HABEAS CORPUS IGNORED. An Order to Release Stenographer Alonzo Walker Was Not Executed.

Frankfort, Ky., Feb. 3.—Gov. Taylor and Adj.-Gen. Collier late this evening failed to recognize a writ of habeas corpus issued by Judge Hester for the release of Alonzo Walker, a stenographer, who was arrested and put into confinement yesterday after planning a notice of a writ of injunction on the door of the Executive chambers in the Executive Building. Judge Moore said after Sheriff Suter had reported his inability to serve the writ of habeas corpus, that unless Gov. Taylor recedes from his position the sheriff would be instructed to order a writ of habeas corpus, and would be given sufficient armed force to ensure this result.

White-Hall may possibly attend; he has accepted honorary membership and congratulates the Anglo-Saxon Union upon its great work. Amongst those of England and Canada who have recently accepted honorary membership are: Lord Charles Bessborough, Sir Alfred Austin, the Hon. Hugh John Macdonald, Premier of Manitoba; the Hon. Chancery M. Dewey, who coincides with a pleasant and timely compliment.
